His Majesty's Birthday will be celebrated in London and at all stations, both at home and abroad, on the 9th June, 1938. The day appointed for this celebration in the case of the Customs and Excise Department and in the case of the officers and servants of the Dock Companies in England and Northern Ireland will be announced later. It is proposed to hold the official celebration annually on a Thursday early in June. The exact date will be announced from year to year.

PROHIBITION under Section 5 of The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1888, of the use in Beer of certain substances.

Whereas it appears to the satisfaction of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury that glycyrrhizic acid, ammonium glycyrrhizate and all other salts of glycyrrhizic acid, and preparations or mixtures containing any of the above mentioned substances, are capable of being used in the manufacture or preparation for sale of Beer and that the use of any of the said substances is calculated to affect prejudicially the interests of the Revenue.

Now the said Lords Commissioners, under the power conferred upon Them by Section 5 of The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1888, do hereby prohibit the use of any of the said substances in the manufacture or preparation for sale of Beer.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Leonard William Bangley in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 21st January, 1936, Bangley, an employee in one of the Kimingini Company's Gold Mines at Kakamega, Kenya, was firing the last of a round of nine holes when one hole exploded prematurely. Bangley was blown some little distance away, and his native assistant was struck by a rock and fell into the gutter with his face in the water, so that he was in danger of drowning. Bangley, although aware that the remaining fuses would shortly explode, returned in the darkness to search for the native. He eventually found him, and managed to carry him without assistance to a place of safety. The remaining charges then exploded. He carried the injured man for some distance before meeting some native labourers who then conveyed the injured man to the cage, and from there to the surface. The native subsequently died from the injuries he had received.

Bangley undoubtedly displayed great gallantry in his attempt to save the injured man.
