WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of July, 1937 (C.W. 7139/37), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section VI of Schedule V to Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, provision is made, *inter alia*, for payment of Machinery Allowance to Engineer Officers in charge of the machinery of Your Majesty's Ships in commission:

"And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of August, 1926, we were empowered, at our discretion, to issue payment of Machinery Allowance to the Engineer Officers borne for charge of Machinery of the Reserve of Minesweepers at Malta, although these vessels were not in commission:

"And whereas there is now a Reserve of Minesweepers at Singapore, constituted on similar lines to the Reserve of Minesweepers at Malta, in respect of which we consider that

Machinery Allowance should also be paid to the Engineer Officers borne for charge of machinery:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise us, at our discretion, to issue as from the 4th April, 1937, payment of Machinery Allowance to the Engineer Officers borne for charge of machinery of the Reserve of Minesweepers at Singapore.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 2nd January 1918 (S.R. & O. 1918, No. 28) (hereafter in this Order referred to as "the Principal Order") it was ordered that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, should apply to the group of British Possessions and Protected States therein mentioned, that is to say, British India, Ceylon, Hong Kong, the Straits Settlements, the Federated Malay States, Johore, Kedah and Perlis, Kelantan, Trengganu, Brunei, North Borneo, and Sarawak:

And whereas on the 1st April, 1937, Burma ceased to be part of India, and it is expedient to declare that Part II of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, shall apply to British Burma:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the Powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Acts 1881 and 1915 and otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The Principal Order shall, with effect from the 1st April, 1937, be read and construed as if British Burma were included in the group of British Possessions and Protected States mentioned in Article (1) of the said Order:

(2) The Governor-General of India, and the Governors of Burma, Ceylon, Hong Kong, and the Straits Settlements shall cause this Order to be proclaimed in the Territories and Colonies under their respective Governments:

(3) The Governor, as defined in the Straits Settlements and Protected States Fugitive Offenders Orders in Council, 1916, 1917 and 1937 shall cause this Order to be proclaimed in the Protected State in which he exercises the functions of Governor for the purposes of the Fugitive Offenders Acts, 1881 and 1915.

And the Most Honourable the Marquess of Zetland and the Right Honourable William Ormsby-Gore, two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 32 of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, it is amongst other things enacted that if the Legislature of a British Possession pass any Act or Ordinance:—(1) For defining the offences committed in that Possession to which this Act or any part thereof is to apply; or (2) for determining the court, judge, magistrate, officer, or person by whom and the manner in which any jurisdiction or power under this Act is to be exercised; or (3) for payment of the costs incurred in returning a fugitive or a prisoner, or in sending him back if not prosecuted or if acquitted, or otherwise in the execution of this Act; or (4) in any manner for the carrying of this Act or any part thereof into effect in that Possession; it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council to direct, if it seems to His Majesty in Council necessary or proper for carrying into effect the objects of this Act, that such Act or Ordinance, or any part thereof, shall with or without modification or alteration be recognised and given effect to throughout His Majesty's dominions and on the high seas as if it were part of this Act:

And whereas the Governor-General of India in Council passed an Act entitled the Indian Extradition Act, 1903, and His Majesty in Council was pleased to declare on the 7th March, 1904, S.R. & O. 1904, No. 318, that Chapter IV of that Act shall have effect as if it were part of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881:

And whereas on the 1st April, 1937, Burma ceased to be part of India, and it is provided by the Government of Burma (Adaptation of

Laws) Order, 1937, that on the separation of Burma and India the Indian Extradition Act, 1903, shall, subject to the adaptations and modifications in the said Order specified, and until repealed or amended by the Legislature or other competent authority, continue to have effect in British Burma under the title "The Burma Extradition Act":

And whereas it is expedient to direct that Chapter IV of the Burma Extradition Act shall have effect as if it were part of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881, and in exercise of the powers in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, direct that Chapter IV of the Burma Extradition Act, shall be recognised and given effect to throughout His Majesty's dominions and on the high seas as if it were part of the Fugitive Offenders Act, 1881.

WHEREAS by Section 18 of the Extradition Act, 1870, it is amongst other things, enacted that, if by any law made after the passing of the said Act by the Legislature of any British Possession, provision is made for carrying into effect within such Possession the surrender of fugitive criminals who are in, or suspected of being in, such British Possession, His Majesty may, by the Order in Council applying the said Act in the case of any Foreign State, or by any subsequent Order, direct that such law or any part thereof shall have effect in such British Possession, with or without modifications and alterations, as if it were part of the Act:

And whereas by an Act passed by the Governor-General of India in Council entitled the Indian Extradition Act, 1903, provisions were made for carrying into effect within British India the surrender of fugitive criminals who are therein or suspected of being therein, and His Majesty in Council was accordingly pleased to declare on the 7th March, 1904 (S.R. & O. 1904, No. 317), that Chapter II of the Indian Extradition Act shall have effect as if it were a part of the Extradition Act, 1870:

And whereas on the 1st April, 1937, Burma ceased to be part of India, and it is provided by the Government of Burma (Adaptation of Laws) Order, 1937, that on the separation of Burma and India the Indian Extradition Act, 1903, shall, subject to the adaptations and modifications in the said Order specified, and until repealed or amended by the Legislature or other competent authority, continue to have effect in British Burma under the title "The Burma Extradition Act" and provisions are made for carrying into effect within British Burma the surrender of fugitive criminals who are therein or suspected of being therein:

And whereas it is expedient to direct that Chapter II of the Burma Extradition Act shall have effect as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the Extradition Act, 1870, and in exercise of the powers in that behalf in the said Act contained, doth by this present Order, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, direct that Chapter II of the Burma Extradition Act shall have effect in British Burma as if it were part of the Extradition Act, 1870.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1935 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52; 36 & 37 Vict. c. 60; 58 & 59 Vict. c. 33; 6 Edw. 7. c. 15; 22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39; 25 & 26 Geo. 5. c. 25) it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 3rd day of December, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals which Treaty was amended by a Declaration signed on the 26th day of June, 1901:

And whereas the said Treaty and Declaration were duly ratified (See S.R. & O. 1874 and 1902, No. 707):

And whereas a further Treaty was signed on the 18th day of September, 1936, between His former Majesty King Edward VIII and His Serene Highness the Regent of the Kingdom of Hungary, which Treaty is in the terms following:—

TREATY BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY IN RESPECT OF THE UNITED KINGDOM AND HIS SERENE HIGHNESS THE REGENT OF HUNGARY, SUPPLEMENTARY TO THE TREATY OF DECEMBER 3, 1873, REGARDING EXTRADITION.

*Budapest, September 18, 1936.*

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India and His Serene Highness the Regent of the Kingdom of Hungary, desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Treaty to this end and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries:

His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India:

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

Sir Geoffrey George Knox, K.C.M.G., His Majesty's Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Budapest;

His Serene Highness the Regent of the Kingdom of Hungary:

M. Kálmán Kánya de Kánya, Royal Hungarian Minister for Foreign Affairs,

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows:—

#### ARTICLE 1.

Article 2 of the Extradition Treaty signed at Vienna on the 3rd December, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause:—

“ Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any act, not being one in respect of which there is an obligation to grant extradition under the preceding provisions of this Article, but which is a crime or offence which is punishable, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, by not less than two years' imprisonment, and for which, according to the said laws, the grant may be made.”

#### ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Hungary on the one hand and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

#### ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King may accede to the present Treaty in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Budapest. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Hungary on the one hand, and, on the other, the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

#### ARTICLE 4.

The present Treaty shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

#### ARTICLE 5.

The present Treaty shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Treaty and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in the English and Hungarian languages at Budapest the 18th day of September, 1936.

And whereas His Majesty has ratified the said Treaty in respect of, and the said Treaty thereby extends to, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, and British Colonies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 13th day of October, 1937, the said Acts shall apply in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, and British Colonies in the case of Hungary under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, as modified by the Declaration of the 26th June, 1901, and by the Treaty of the 18th September, 1936.

This Order may be cited as the Hungary (Extradition) Order in Council, 1937.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of June, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd

and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113; the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said United Benefice') of Chipstable with Raddington, in the County of Somerset and in the Diocese of Bath and Wells:

"Whereas under the terms of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 13th day of July, 1928, and published in the London Gazette on the same day, for effecting the union of the Benefice of Chipstable and the Benefice of Raddington, a part or share of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Chipstable with Raddington (that is to say the first and third turns in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the said United Benefice after the union) was assigned to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Chipstable:

"And whereas the union of the said Benefices of Chipstable and Raddington took effect on the 20th day of April, 1929:

"And whereas the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Chipstable with Raddington is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Edward Cornewall Nicholetts, of Wonham, Lansdown Road, Bath, in the said County of Somerset, Esquire, as the present Trustee of a Settlement dated the 10th day of September, 1857, and the said Edward Cornewall Nicholetts is therefore the person entitled to present to the said United Benefice on the nomination of the Reverend John Nicholetts, of Vicar's Close, Chichester, in the County of Sussex, Clerk in Holy Orders, the person now beneficially entitled to the said part or share of the said Advowson, in case the said United Benefice were now vacant and the next turn of presentation fell to the owner of the said part or share of the said Advowson:

"And whereas the said Edward Cornewall Nicholetts at the request of the said John Nicholetts is desirous that the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Chipstable with Raddington now vested as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Bath and Wells for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend St. John Basil Wynne, now Bishop of Bath and Wells, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of Patronage which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter

recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the right of Patronage so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Chipstable and Raddington:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Edward Cornewall Nicholetts and John Nicholetts (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Chipstable with Raddington shall be transferred to the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said St. John Basil Wynne, Bishop of Bath and Wells, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bath and Wells.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme (1) for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard), the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Hoxton, Saint Peter; and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Old Street, Saint Mark, and (2) for altering the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, and the Parish of the Benefice of Shoreditch, Saint Michael, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon (1) the union of the said Benefices of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard), Hoxton, Saint Peter, and Old Street, Saint Mark, and (2) the alteration of the boundaries of the said Parishes of Old Street, Saint Mark, and Shoreditch, Saint Michael, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the said union and alteration of boundaries and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alteration of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of London embodies certain modifications thereof:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard) is vested in the Archdeacon for the time being of the Archdeaconry of London, and the said Archdeacon is also the Patron in right of his Archdeaconry of the Benefice of Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist, in the said County and Diocese:

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, is vested in the Master and Four Wardens of the Art or Mystery of Haberdashers in the City of London (hereinafter referred to as ‘ the Haberdashers’ Company ’):

“ And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, is vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of London:

“ And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that for the purpose of more conveniently carrying into execution the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, in regard to the union of Benefices herein recommended and proposed, an exchange should be made of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint

Peter, for a part or share of and in the Patronage of the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist, to the intent that the Patronage of the United Benefice herein recommended and proposed to be constituted shall belong wholly to the Archdeacon for the time being of the said Archdeaconry of London:

“ And whereas to the same intent the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, for himself and his successors Bishops of London, is consenting to the surrender in favour of the Archdeacon for the time being of the said Archdeaconry of London of the share in the Patronage of the United Benefice which would otherwise be assignable to him and his successors in respect of his Patronage of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark:

“ And whereas the said Haberdashers’ Company and the Venerable Ernest Newton Sharpe, now Archdeacon of the said Archdeaconry of London, are consenting to the proposals herein contained in regard to the exchange of Patronage hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the total endowments of the Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice which would remain after making such provision as is hereinafter recommended and proposed for the payment of a Curate to assist the Incumbent of such United Benefice would be more than is required to form a competent provision for the United Benefice and that it is desirable that a part of such endowments should be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed for the augmentation of certain Benefices not having competent provisions thereto, namely, the Benefices of City Road, Saint Matthew; Gladstone Park, Saint Francis; Haggerston, Saint Columba; Hoxton, Holy Trinity; Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist; Isleworth, Saint Francis; North Acton, Saint Gabriel; and Tokyngton, Saint Michael, all in the said Diocese of London:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, is at present vacant, but the said Benefices of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard) and Old Street, Saint Mark, and the said Benefice of Shoreditch, Saint Michael, are all now full, the Reverend Henry Cecil being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard), the Reverend George Blissett Poole being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, and the Reverend Herbert William Heasman being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shoreditch, Saint Michael:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, Henry Cecil, Herbert William Heasman and Ernest Newton Sharpe (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) and with the consent also of the said Haberdashers’ Company (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common Seal to be affixed to this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard), the said Benefice of Hoxton,

Saint Peter, and the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Shoreditch, Saint Leonard' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

" 2. That if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark shall be vacant, then the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, shall be full then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, and, pending such vacation, the said Benefice of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard) and the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, shall upon the day aforesaid be united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided, and in any case the said Henry Cecil, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard) shall become and be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That if within the period of one year immediately following the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said George Blissett Poole shall by institution to another Benefice vacate the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, in order that the union provided for in Clause 1 of this Scheme may thereupon take effect, there shall be paid to him by the Incumbent of the United Benefice out of the revenues thereof so long as he, the said George Blissett Poole, shall continue to hold such other Benefice, an annual sum of £250 if in our opinion the annual income of such other Benefice amounts to not more than £300 but if in our opinion the annual income of such other Benefice exceeds £300 then the annual sum to be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice as aforesaid shall be the amount necessary to raise the annual income of such other Benefice to £550 and for the recovery of the said annual sum the said George Blissett Poole shall have the same remedies and powers as if the same were a pension awarded to him under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871 and 1887, out of the revenues of the United Benefice.

" 4. That the Church of the Parish of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard) shall be the Parish Church of any United Parish comprising the said Parish of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard) constituted pursuant to this Scheme and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard) shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for any such United Parish.

" 5. That (a) upon the union recommended by Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, shall be transferred to the Parish Church

of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially, and (b) upon any union comprising the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, taking effect pursuant to any of the provisions of this Scheme the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Peter, Hoxton, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 6. That upon any union recommended by this Scheme taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard) shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for a nominal sum and transferred to the Trustees of the London Diocesan Fund Registered as a Clergy House for the United Benefice.

" 7. That upon any union recommended by this Scheme comprising the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, taking effect a Curate shall be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and particularly to serve the Church of Saint Peter, Hoxton, and that the stipend to be assigned to such Curate out of the revenues of the United Benefice shall be of such amount not exceeding £250 per annum as the Bishop may from time to time determine, this recommendation and proposal being made to the intent that the Bishop shall have the power of requiring the appointment of a Curate in accordance with and subject to the conditions and provisions of Sub-section (b) of Section 18 of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 8. That upon any union recommended by this Scheme taking effect the two grants of £120 per annum each at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, out of our Common Fund to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shoreditch (Saint Leonard), conditionally upon the employment of a first and second Curate respectively shall become payable to the Incumbent of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment within the Parish of the United Benefice of an Assistant Curate other than the Curate to be appointed in pursuance of Clause 7 of this Scheme.

" 9.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme has taken effect the Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the



Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London under the said Measures of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say, (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations, (2) a sum equal in amount to one fifth of the said net proceeds shall be allocated to the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and (3) a sum to be agreed upon by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and the Bishop of London shall then be set aside and applied for and towards the restoration and repair of each of the Churches of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch; Saint Peter, Hoxton; Saint Michael, Shoreditch; and Saint John the Baptist, Hoxton; and any other Churches within the Rural Deaneries in the Archdeaconry of London other than the Rural Deaneries of East City and West City and the residue of such net proceeds shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct, be transferred to the Church of Saint Leonard, Shoreditch, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of London, and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, or to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, being dispensed with by reason of the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or in any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part of it out of the said Expenses Fund.

" 10. That with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, being the Patron as aforesaid, of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, upon the union contemplated by Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect a part of the total endow-

ments of the Benefices therein recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, the whole of the endowments now belonging to the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, shall be severed or diverted therefrom and subject to the provisions hereinafter contained shall be appropriated for the augmentation of the said Benefices of Gladstone Park, Saint Francis; Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist; City Road, Saint Matthew; Haggerston, Saint Columba; Hoxton, Holy Trinity; Isleworth, Saint Francis; North Acton, Saint Gabriel; and Tokyngton, Saint Michael, as hereinafter recommended and proposed that is to say:—

(a) As to an annual sum of £82 (being part of an annual sum of £400 at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark) for the augmentation of the said Benefice of Gladstone Park, Saint Francis;

(b) As to an annual sum of £120 (being a further part of the said annual sum of £400) for a Curate Grant for the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist, to the intent that such annual sum of £120 shall be consolidated with the Curate Grant of the like amount now payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist, and shall be subject to the regulations and conditions from time to time in force affecting such grants;

(c) As to the remainder (that is to say £198 per annum) of the said annual sum of £400 at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, and as to certain sums of Stock (that is to say £3,220 18s. 9d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock, and £79 1s. 3d. £3 per cent. per annum Funding Stock) at present held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty on behalf of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, for the augmentation of the said Benefices of City Road, Saint Matthew; Haggerston, Saint Columba; Hoxton, Holy Trinity; Isleworth, Saint Francis; North Acton, Saint Gabriel; and Tokyngton, Saint Michael; as set forth in the Schedule hereto annexed: Provided always that in the event of a compensatory pension being payable out of the revenues of the United Benefice to the said George Blissett Poole under the provisions of Clause 3 of this Scheme a part equivalent in amount to such compensatory pension of the said annual sum of £400 shall during the continuance of the same compensatory pension be payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the United Benefice and the several payments set forth in paragraph (a) of this clause and in the third column of the said schedule to be made by us out of the said annual sum of £400 shall during the continuance of the said compensatory pension be proportionately reduced; and

(d) All other the endowments of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, shall be transferred and annexed to the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist.

" 11. That upon any union recommended by this Scheme comprising the said Benefice

of Hoxton, Saint Peter, taking effect, the Grant of £60 per annum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, conditionally upon the employment of an assistant Curate for the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, shall be transferred to the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist, as an addition to the Grant of £120 per annum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, conditionally upon the employment of a second assistant Curate for that Benefice.

" 12. That with the consent of the Reverend Herbert William Heasman, being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Shoreditch, Saint Michael (testified as aforesaid) upon the union referred to in Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Old Street, Saint Mark, which lies to the south of the middle of Old Street, shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Shoreditch, Saint Michael.

" 13. That upon the day preceding the date of any union including the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, recommended and proposed by this Scheme taking effect the Patronage of the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint Peter, which is now vested in the said Haberdashers' Company as aforesaid shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the duly Gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme be transferred from the said Haberdashers' Company and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Ernest Newton Sharpe, now Archdeacon of London, as aforesaid and his successors in the same Archdeaconry, and that in exchange for such transfer a share in the patronage (now belonging wholly to the Archdeacon of London for the time being as aforesaid) of the said Benefice of Hoxton, Saint John the Baptist, namely the then next turn of presentation or nomination thereto and every alternate turn of presentation or nomination thereafter, shall in the like manner and by the same authority and as from the said day be transferred from the said Archdeacon of London and his successors and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Haberdashers' Company.

" 14. That upon the union contemplated by Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Archdeacon of London for the time being.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Mark, Old Street, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

That the said Benefice of Stanbridge and the said Benefice of Tilsworth shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Stanbridge with Tilsworth' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if

the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice: and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall, with the approval of the Bishop, consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Stanbridge shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Tilsworth having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Stanbridge having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of St. Albans.

Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Shelfanger now vested in him, the said Albert Blakelock as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other Measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.”

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council :

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And whereas the said Benefice of Northampton, All Saints, is now full the Reverend Canon John Trevor Lewis being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Northampton, Saint Katharine, is at present vacant:

And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Northampton, Saint Katharine, now belongs to the Trustees of the Hyndman Bounty Trust:

And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Northampton, All Saints, now belongs to the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors Bishops of Peterborough, to whom belongs also the Patronage of the Benefice of Paglesham, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

And whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 1st day of June, 1926, and published in the London Gazette on the 8th day of the same month provision was made for the union of the said Benefice of Paglesham with the Benefice of Canewdon in the said County of Essex and in the said Diocese of Chelmsford under the style of 'The United Benefice of Canewdon with Paglesham' and it was ordered and directed that upon such union taking effect the Patronage of the United Benefice should belong to the respective Patrons of the said Benefices of Paglesham and Canewdon in alternate turns:

And whereas the union of the said Benefices of Paglesham and Canewdon has not yet become effective:

And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to be desirable for the purpose of more conveniently carrying into execution the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, in regard to the union of Benefices herein recommended and proposed that an exchange should be made of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Northampton, Saint Katharine, for the Patronage of the said Benefice of Paglesham to the intent that the Patronage of the United Benefice herein recommended and proposed to be constituted shall belong wholly to the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors:

Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, and the said John Trevor Lewis (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) and with the consents also of the Trustees of the Hyndman Bounty Trust, namely Sir John Lulham Pound, Bart., of Fairlight, Shepherds Hill, Highgate, N.6; the Right Reverend Edward Sydney Woods, Bishop Suffragan of Croydon; the Reverend John Clifford Banham, of Christ Church Vicarage, Woking; Montague George Dashwood, Esq., J.P., of The Pré, Verulam Road, Saint Albans; and the Reverend George Frederick Saywell, of Holy Trinity Rectory, 6 Albany Terrace, N.W.1 (testified by their

respectively signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the said Benefice of Northampton, All Saints, and the said Benefice of Northampton, Saint Katharine, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Northampton, All Saints with Saint Katharine' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said John Trevor Lewis if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Northampton, All Saints, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Northampton, All Saints, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

4. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of a Curate and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely the whole of the endowments excepting glebe of the said Benefice of Northampton, Saint Katharine, shall be charged with a sum of £250 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curate which said fund of £250 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purpose aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £250 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as Trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of the said Curate.

5. That on the day preceding the date of the union taking effect the Patronage of the said Benefice of Northampton, Saint Katharine, which is now vested in the Trustees of the Hyndman Bounty Trust, as aforesaid, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than the duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme be transferred from the said Trustees of the Hyndman Bounty Trust and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors Bishops of Peterborough, and that in exchange for the same the Patronage of the said Benefice of Paglesham shall in like manner and by the same authority and upon and as from the same day be transferred from the said Claude, Bishop of Peterborough, and his successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in the said Trustees of the Hyndman Bounty Trust, subject to the like uses limitations trusts powers and provisions in every respect as those to which the patronage of the said Benefice of Northampton, St. Katharine now vested in the said Trustees is subject.

6. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the said Claude, Bishop of

Peterborough, and his successors Bishops of Peterborough.

Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Peterborough has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of Peterborough and Chelmsford.

Court, Fleet Street, in the City of London, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Northumberland Heath, Erith (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Bexley Heath, of the said Parish of Crayford, and of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Northumberland Heath, Erith, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Martin, Barnehurst, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Barnehurst.’

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Martin, Barnehurst, comprising:—

named in the Order as if that Court were a Colonial Court of Admiralty, and to provide for carrying into effect such application":

And whereas Palestine is a place out of His Majesty's dominions in which His Majesty has power and jurisdiction:

And whereas a Court called the Supreme Court has been constituted in Palestine and duly and lawfully established for the exercise of His Majesty's jurisdiction in that territory:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Supreme Court should possess Admiralty jurisdiction and that the above recited Act should be applied to the said Court as if that Court were a Colonial Court of Admiralty:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, and by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Palestine Admiralty Jurisdiction Order, 1937.

2.—(1) The Supreme Court of Palestine shall be a Court of Admiralty and shall exercise Admiralty jurisdiction in all matters arising upon the high seas or elsewhere or upon any lake, river, or other navigable inland waters or otherwise relating to ships or shipping.

(2) The following enactments of the Colonial Courts of Admiralty Act, 1890, that is to say, Section 2, sub-sections (2) to (4), Sections 5 and 6 and Section 16, sub-section (3), shall apply to the Supreme Court of Palestine as if in the said sections the said Court were mentioned in lieu of a Colonial Court of Admiralty and Palestine were referred to in lieu of a British possession.

3. This Order shall be published in the official Gazette of Palestine, and the date of such publication shall be deemed to be the date of the commencement of this Order.

And the Right Honourable William George Arthur Ormsby-Gore, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
