## ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1934 (SECTION 1).

*Speed Limits in the London Traffic Area.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport under and by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (b) of sub-section (4) of Section 1 of the Road Traffic Act, 1934, intends to make the London Traffic (Built-up Areas) (No. ) Order, 1937, the effect of which will be that the speed limit under that Section will apply throughout every length of road specified in the Schedule hereto.
