TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 3rd September, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 6th September, 1937, to Saturday, the 11th September, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

NOTTINGHAMSHIRE AND DERBYSHIRE TRACTION COMPANY.

BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

TROLLEY VEHICLE SYSTEM.

Made on the tenth day of August, 1937, by the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Traction Company under the powers conferred on them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Traction Acts and Orders, 1903 to 1936, with respect to the trolley vehicles worked by them.

1. In these Bye-laws unless the context otherwise requires the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them, that is to say:—

"Company" means the Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Traction Company.

"Trolley vehicle system" means the system of trolley vehicles worked by the Company.

"Carriage" means any trolley vehicle owned or operated by the Company for the conveyance of passengers.

"Interior of a carriage" shall not include the upper deck of a double-decked carriage.

"Passenger" means any person being conveyed or attempting to be conveyed by a carriage.

"Conductor" includes any officer or servant of the Company having the charge of or helping in the charge of a carriage.

"Driver" means any officer or servant of the Company driving or helping to drive a carriage.

"Authorised person" means any officer or servant of the Company (including the conductor) on duty upon or in connection with the carriage.

2. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make Bye-laws.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these Bye-laws as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. When a carriage is carrying passengers or waiting to pick up passengers a passenger shall not—

(i) use obscene or offensive language or conduct himself in a riotous or disorderly manner;

(ii) enter or alight from the carriage otherwise than by the doors or openings provided for the purpose; nor attempt to enter or alight from a carriage when it is in motion;

(iii) when entering or attempting to enter the carriage wilfully and unreasonably impede passengers seeking to enter the carriage or to alight therefrom;

(iv) enter or remain in or on the carriage when requested not to do so by an authorised person on the ground that the carriage is carrying its full complement of passengers.

(v) travel in or on the upper deck of the carriage unless he occupies a seat provided for that purpose, or in or on any part of the carriage not provided for the conveyance of passengers;

(vi) wilfully do or cause to be done with respect to any part of the carriage or its equipment anything which is calculated to obstruct or interfere with the working of the carriage or to cause injury or discomfort to any person;

(vii) when the carriage is in motion distract the driver's attention without reasonable cause or speak to him unless it is necessary to do so in order to give directions as to the stopping of the carriage;

(viii) give any signal which might be interpreted by the driver as a signal from the conductor to start the carriage;

(ix) spit upon or from or wilfully damage, soil or defile any part of the carriage; any person contravening this Bye-law shall be liable to pay for the damage done in addition to any penalty incurred under these Bye-laws.

(x) when in or on the carriage distribute printed or similar matter of any description or distribute any article for the purpose of advertising;

(xi) wilfully remove, displace, deface or alter any number plate, notice board, fare table, route indicator or destination board or any printed or other notice or advertisement in or on the carriage;

(xii) when in or on the carriage to the annoyance of other persons use or operate any noisy instrument or make or combine with any other person or persons to make any excessive noise by singing, shouting or otherwise;

(xiii) when in or on the carriage throw any money to be scrambled for by any person on the road or footway; or throw out of the carriage any bottle, liquid or litter or any article or thing likely to annoy persons or to cause danger or injury to any person or property;

(xiv) throw any article from the carriage or attach to or trail from the carriage any streamer, balloon, flag or other article in such manner as to overhang the road;

(xv) wilfully obstruct or impede any authorised person;

(xvi) smoke or carry a lighted pipe, cigar or cigarette in or on any part of the carriage in or on which a notice is exhibited that smoking is prohibited;

(xvii) when in or on the carriage beg, sell or offer for sale any article, or thing;

(xviii) if his condition is such as to be offensive to passengers, or the condition of his dress or clothing is such that it may reasonably be expected to soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the clothing of other passengers, enter or remain in or on the carriage after an authorised person shall have requested him either not to enter or to leave the carriage and in such latter case shall have tendered to him the amount of any fare previously paid; provided that on carriages specially run for artisans, mechanics or daily labourers no passenger shall be prevented from entering or remaining in or on the carriage under the provisions

of this Bye-law, on the ground of the condition of his dress or clothing, if such condition is solely due to the nature of his employment;

(xix) enter or travel in or on a carriage with loaded firearms, or any dangerous or offensive article, or except with the consent of an authorised person, bring into or on to the carriage any bulky or cumbersome article or place any such article elsewhere in or on the carriage than as directed by an authorised person;

(xx) bring any animal into or on to the carriage without the consent of an authorised person or retain any animal in or on the carriage after being requested by an authorised person to remove it or place any animal elsewhere in or on the carriage than as directed by an authorised person.

5. Every passenger shall—

(i) unless he is the holder of a ticket in respect of that journey, immediately upon demand, declare the journey he intends to take or has taken and pay the conductor the fare for the whole of such journey and accept the ticket provided therefor;

(ii) if requested by the conductor, leave the carriage on completion of the journey the fare for which he has paid;

(iii) show his ticket, if any, to any authorised person when required to do so by any authorised person, or, if he fails so to show his ticket, pay the fare for the journey taken or to be taken by him;

(iv) if required to do so surrender his ticket to any authorised person at the end of the journey covered by that ticket;

(v) if required to do so surrender any period or season ticket held by him at the expiry of the period for which it was issued to him;

(vi) if required to do so surrender any ticket held by him either on completion of the journey or journeys covered by that ticket or in exchange for a new ticket covering the journey or journeys he is still entitled to take.

6. No passenger shall use or attempt to use any ticket which has been—

(i) altered or defaced; or

(ii) issued to another person, if such ticket bears thereon an indication that it is not transferable.

(iii) issued as a "Return Ticket," for making two journeys in the same direction between the two fare stages for which it was issued.

(iv) issued for any special purpose, or day, for any other purpose or during any other day than that for which such ticket was issued.

(v) issued on another carriage or which has been used on a previous journey, unless the ticket was issued as a "Return Ticket."

7. No passenger shall use or attempt to use any ticket except in accordance with the conditions governing the issue of such ticket by the Company and set out on the fare table displayed in the carriage.

8. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the statutory provisions relating to the Company shall not use or

attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, or mechanics, or daily labourers.

9. No person shall commit any nuisance in, on, or against any carriage or premises used in connection with the trolley vehicle system.

10. An authorised person shall, to the best of his ability, take steps whenever necessary to enforce these Bye-laws and to prevent the breach thereof.

11. Any passenger contravening these Bye-laws shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings and may be removed from the carriage by the driver or conductor, or on the request of the driver or conductor by any police constable.

12. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage and premises in use a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

13. These Bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of November, 1937.
