The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

## REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF BOYS AND GIRLS TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

I. AGE.—The limits of age are 16 and 17. For any examination the governing date on which candidates must be of the prescribed age is the 1st March of the year in which the examination is held. A candidate who attained the age of 16 on the governing date would be admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on that date would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(i) Persons who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

(ii) Persons employed on the first day of the examination as Established Writing Assistants or Established Clerical Assistants, Grade I, in the Civil Service generally or as Established Clerical Assistants in Offices of His Majesty's Inspectors of Taxes under the Inland Revenue Department may be admitted to the examination, provided they had not attained or will not attain the age of 19 by the 1st March of the year in which the examination is held.

(iii) Persons appointed as Established Typists or Established Clerk-Typists in the Civil Service on the result of an Open Competition who were under 17 years of age on the governing date for age for such Competition may be admitted to the examination, provided that they have continued to be employed in the Civil Service up to the first day of the examination as Established Typists, Established Clerk-Typists, Established Shorthand Typists or Established Clerk-Shorthand Typists, and that they had not attained or will not attain the age of 19 by the 1st March of the year in which the examination is held.

2. NATIONALITY.—Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

5. All candidates take subjects 1 and 2; they may also offer any three of the subjects 3 to 7.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. The examination may be held undivided or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those whose performance on the first part is best a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination. If the examination is held in two parts, the second part may be held in fewer centres than the first.

7. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

8. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the examination.

9. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 10s. will be required from every applicant for permission to attend an Examination; this fee is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of £1 10s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £2, will be required from every candidate attending such Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations, commencing on the 25th January, 1938. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the examination may be held:—Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Blackburn, Bristol, Cardiff, Chester, Darlington, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Londonderry, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Newport (Mon.), Norwich, Nottingham, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Preston, Sheffield, Stoke-on-Trent, Swansea and Workington.

The final list of centres will be decided when the number of candidates desiring examination at each centre is known.

No person will be admitted to examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 21st October, 1937, an application in the candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

## COUNTY OF DURHAM JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT 1930: SECTION 3.

1st September, 1937.

92,214.

Whereas by the County of Durham Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1930 (in this order referred to as "the order of 1930") the Minister of Health made provision for the combination of the county of Durham and the county boroughs of Darlington Gateshead South Shields Sunderland and West Hartlepool for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a joint committee named the County of Durham Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas the constituent authorities of the Joint Committee have made application to the Minister of Health for the amendment of the order of 1930:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act 1930 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby makes the following order.

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the County of Durham Joint Vagrancy Committee (Amendment) Order 1937.

(2) The order of 1930 and this order shall be construed as one and may be cited together as the County of Durham Joint Vagrancy Committee Orders 1930 and 1937.

2. From and after the 1st day of October 1937 the order of 1930 shall be read and have effect—

(a) as if in lieu of article 9 thereof there were substituted the following article that is say:—

"9.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recommendations in regard to the following matters:—

(a) the number and situation of the casual wards which should be provided by any council;

(b) the number of casuials for whom accommodation should be provided at any existing casual ward and at any casual ward proposed to be established in the combined areas;

(c) the closing of any casual ward in the combined areas.

(2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps whether by public notice or otherwise as shall be necessary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping-out in the combined areas.

(3) The Joint Committee shall have power to repay to any council the whole or part of any expenditure incurred by the council in—

(a) the provision of accommodation for casuials in accordance with any requirements of the Minister (including any necessary acquisition of sites);

(b) the equipment maintenance and management of casual wards;

(c) the reception and relief of casuials;

(d) the transfer to an appropriate institution of any casual;

(e) the maintenance and care in such an institution of any casual so transferred;

(f) the burial of any casual;

(g) the maintenance care and education of any casual being a child in respect of whom the council have exercised the powers vested in them under section 52 of the Poor Law Act 1930;

(h) the removal of any casual to his place of settlement;

(i) the provision and supply of mid-day meals for casuials;

(j) the provision of surgical appliances to casuials:

Provided that any repayment of expenditure falling within any of the classes enumerated in the sub-paragraphs of this paragraph shall be in accordance with a system of charges which shall have been determined by the Joint Committee with the approval of a majority of the councils and any such system of charges shall be binding on each of the councils and may from time to time be varied by the Joint Committee with the approval of a majority of the councils.

(4) The Joint Committee shall also have power with the approval of the Minister to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuials.

(5) Subject to the statutory provisions orders and regulations for the time being in operation, the Joint Committee may make rules in regard to the administration of casual wards within the combined areas and in particular in regard to the following matters namely:—

(i) times and methods of admission;

(ii) searching;

(iii) bathing night clothing and bedding;

(iv) smoking;

(v) treatment of sick aged and infirm casuials;

(vi) treatment of female and child casuials;

(vii) dietary;

(viii) discharge and detention; and

(ix) tasks;

and any rules so made shall be binding on each of the councils:

Provided that before making any such rules the Joint Committee shall notify the councils concerned of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every such council to make representation to the Joint Committee regarding the proposals.

(6) Nothing in this order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuials except so far as any such powers duties or obligations are being exercised undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this order."; and

(b) as if in paragraph (5) of article II thereof the words from "or shall affect the powers" to the end of the paragraph were omitted therefrom.

To provide for and require the delivery up of the certificates of Totnes shares and the issue instead thereof of certificates of Torquay stock; to make provision as to the consequences of failure to deliver up such certificates of Totnes shares; to authorise and require trustees, executors and other persons to accept, hold and deal with Torquay stock as they might have held and dealt with Totnes shares; and to provide that references in deeds, wills and other instruments to Totnes shares shall be construed as references to Torquay stock.

4. To make provision with respect to the monies due or accruing due to the Totnes Company and the recovery thereof by the Company and to make all usual or convenient provisions incidental to the aforesaid sale and transfer and for enabling it to be carried into effect.

5. To provide that one of the directors of the Totnes Company shall become a director of the Company; to make provision with respect to his retirement by rotation, and to vary the number of directors of the Company.

To make new or further provisions with reference to the Company's affairs, including provisions as to the prescription of a new scale of voting rights, voting rights in respect of preference shares or stock, notices of meetings, number and qualification of directors, appointment, removal, retirement, remuneration and powers of a managing director, directors holding office under or contracting with the Company, notice of candidature as or of opposition to re-election of a director, appointment of officers of the Company as directors, and the provision maintenance and equipment of recreation grounds for the use and benefit of employees.

15. To confer upon the Company all or any powers commonly conferred on gas undertakers and not hereinbefore referred to and to enact all such provisions as may be deemed expedient for effecting the purposes of the intended Order.

16. To sanction and confirm any agreement between the Company and the Totnes Company with respect to the subject matters of this Notice.
