The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that an Open Competitive Examination for situations as Officer of Customs and Excise (Male) under the Board of Customs and Excise will be held, commencing on the 11th January, 1938, under the Regulations dated the 12th September, 1930, and published in the London Gazette of the same date; the first part of the Examination will be held in Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Plymouth and Portsmouth.

Not fewer than 50 Candidates will be appointed on the result of this Examination, if so many should be found to be duly qualified.

No person will be admitted to Examination from whom the Secretary of the Civil Service Commission has not received, on or before the 11th November, 1937, an application, in the Candidate's own handwriting, on a prescribed form, which may be obtained from the Secretary at once.

MINISTRY OF TRANSPORT.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport under and by virtue of sub-section (4) of Section 10 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930 (herein referred to as "the Act"), has made the Motor Vehicles (Variation of Speed Limit) Regulations, 1937, varying the provisions of the First Schedule to the Act in respect of the use of track laying vehicles on roads and revoking the Motor Vehicles (Variation of Speed Limit) Regulations, 1935.
