

and compensation referred to in paragraph 1 hereof and for the general purposes of their gas undertaking and for the payment of the costs and expenses of and connected with the Order and to enact other financial provisions.

7. To enable the Council to exercise all such powers as may be necessary or convenient for the purposes of the Order and to confer upon them all such other powers as are now usually conferred upon local authorities in connection with the supply of gas.

8. To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with the objects of the intended Order and to confer other rights and privileges.

9. To incorporate and apply with or without modification any provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1871 and the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934 and to repeal alter or amend or re-enact and extend to the Order with or without modification all or some of the provisions of the Spalding Gas Act and Orders 1853 to 1932 and any other Act or Order affecting the Council or their gas undertaking.

Any local or other public authority company or person desirous of bringing before the Board of Trade any objections to the Draft Order may do so by registered letter, addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 5th day of November 1937.

Any such objection must state (a) the specific grounds of objection; and (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for. A copy of the objection must be forwarded to the undersigned Clerk and Solicitor to the Council or Parliamentary Agents at the same time as it is sent to the Board of Trade.

A copy of the Draft Order and Ordnance Maps showing the situation of the existing works of the Council and the Company and the boundaries of the existing limits of the Council and the areas proposed to be included therein and the lands proposed to be used (a) for the manufacture and (b) for the storage of gas have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Lincoln (Parts of Holland) at his office at Boston and at the Council Offices, Spalding and printed copies of the Draft Order may be obtained at the price of one shilling per copy at the offices of the undersigned Clerk and Solicitor to the Council and Parliamentary Agents.

of the Leeds City Council dated the 28th day of July, 1937, deciding to prepare the above Planning Scheme with reference to an area situate wholly within the City of Leeds. (2) The map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the City Engineer's Office, Civic Hall, Portland Crescent, Leeds, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on Saturdays, and 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on all other weekdays. (3) Any person who is, or claims to be, the owner of any property in the area, and any Association representing owners of property within the City of Leeds, and any Local Association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Leeds City Council to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the Scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933(*) the development of land in the area during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Leeds City Council are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the Scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The Leeds City Council intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Clerk to the Council.
