## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 22nd October, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 25th October, 1937, to Saturday, the 30th October, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

## MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

## REFERENCE TO THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of sub-section (4) of Section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order in Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following descriptions of imported goods:—

Basketware of the following descriptions made wholly or mainly of cane, wicker, bamboo, rush, straw, raffia or seagrass, or of fabrics woven from paper, jute or hemp yarn:—

(1) Baskets (other than fruit bushels, cucumber and game flats and similar baskets ordinarily used for the transport of food).

(2) Furniture and frames therefor.

Attention is called to the fact that while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

## PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Paper Bag Trade Board (Great Britain) hereby give notice that they propose

to vary minimum rates of wages at present set out in their Notice P.(17), dated 28th February, 1930, so as to provide for the current rates of wages being paid for a week of 45 hours instead of 48 hours.

of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or any telegraph or telephone wires, cables, posts or supports.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order may be cited as the Council of the City of Leicester Roads (Restriction) Order, 1937.

### LONDON OVERGROUND WIRES, &C., ACT, 1933.

BY-LAWS made by the London County Council in pursuance of Section 5 of the Act.

NOTE.—*These by-laws do not extend or apply to—*

(i) *Certain wires in private use on private property.*

(ii) *Certain wires for railway purposes or in connection with any tramway, light railway or trolley vehicle undertaking, or the undertakings of the Port of London Authority, Grand Union Canal Company and Lee Conservancy Board or an electricity undertaking under a Special Act or Order or Licence under the Electricity (Supply) Acts, 1882 to 1928.*

(iii) *Certain wires used for the purpose of illuminated signs.*

(iv) *(except by way of protection) Telegraph lines belonging to or used by the Postmaster-General and supports thereof and attachments thereto.*

*For further information on these points, reference should be made to Sections 14, 15, 17, 19, 20 and 21 of the Act.*

#### Definitions.

1. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires,—

“Wire” has the same meaning as in the London Overground Wires, &c., Act, 1933, except that it does not include any support or attachment.

“Cable” means any covered or insulated wire, and, where more wires than one are enclosed in the same covering or insulation, includes all such wires and covering.

“Local authority” means the local authority of the district in which a wire is situated.

#### Notice of existing wires.

2. The owner of a wire existing at the date upon which these by-laws come into operation shall, within six months after that date, deliver to the clerk of the local authority full particulars in writing of the material and gauge of such wire and the nature and position of the several supports and the length of span between the several supports of such wire, and shall at the same time deliver to the clerk of the local authority a plan on a scale of not less than 25 inches to the mile showing the route of such wire and the position of its supports.

#### Notice of new wires.

3. The person giving notice under Section 4 of the London Overground Wires, &c., Act, 1933, of the erection or placing of a wire shall include in such notice particulars of the material and gauge of such wire and the nature and position of the several supports and the length of span between the several supports of such wire, and shall at the same time deliver to the clerk of the local authority a plan on a scale of not less than 25 inches to the mile showing the route of such wire and the position of its supports, provided that, where applicable, he may, in lieu of delivering such plan, record such route and position on the plan (if any) deposited by him in pursuance of the foregoing by-law No. 2.

#### General requirements.

4. The owner of a wire shall not erect, place or retain such wire except in accordance with the following conditions and requirements:—

(a) The wire shall not at any point be at a less height above the ground than 20 feet, except where it lies directly on the face or surface of a building and is suitably and securely fixed thereto.

(b) Where the wire crosses a street and the height of the buildings permits, the wire shall be fixed to such buildings in such a manner that its height at any point above the street level shall not be less than 35 feet, and, where the height of the buildings is such as to make this impossible, the wire shall be fixed directly or indirectly by means

of a pole or otherwise to stable points of the buildings in such a manner that in no case shall the height of such wire at any point above street level be less than 25 feet.

(c) Every wire shall be supported adequately and securely and at intervals of not more than 115 yards.

(d) Every support for a wire shall be of durable material and properly stayed against forces due to wind pressure, change of direction of the wires and unequal length of span; and all suspending wires shall be securely attached to the supports.

(e) The factor of safety for all stresses arising from the weight of wires and suspending wires shall be at least 4 at a temperature of 22 degrees Fahrenheit. The factor of safety for all structures carrying or supporting wires shall be at least 10, taking the maximum possible wind pressure against a support acting in a horizontal direction at 30 lbs. per square foot. No addition need be made for a possible accumulation of snow.

(f) No cable shall exceed one pound per lineal foot in weight, and every cable shall be carried by independent suspending wires and attached to the same by efficient slings.

(g) Every iron or steel wire and every iron or steel support or attachment shall be efficiently protected from oxidation.

(h) All poles erected on buildings as supports for wires, unless fixed through the roof, shall be carried on shoes or saddles properly protected from oxidation and shall be efficiently stayed so that, in the event of a pole breaking, it shall be impossible for it to fall into any street.

(i) Every wire attached to a chimney, wall or other part of a building shall be efficiently supported by suitable and efficient angle plates of iron or bronze or other device.

#### *Marking of supports.*

5. The owner of a wire shall mark the supports of such wire in such a manner as will readily indicate the owner of such wire.

#### *Maintenance.*

6. Every wire and its support and attachment shall be duly and efficiently supervised and maintained in good order and in accordance with these by-laws by the owner of such wire, provided that, where a support is used for wires of more than one owner, the owner of the support shall so supervise and maintain the support and the attachment of the wires thereto.

7. The owner of any wire shall take all necessary steps to prevent such wire and its support and attachment from becoming a danger to the public.

#### *Disused wires.*

8. The owner of any wire, support or attachment which has ceased to be in use shall forthwith remove such wire, support or attach-

ment, unless he intends within a reasonable time to take it into use again and gives notice of such intention to the local authority.

#### *Penalties.*

9. Any owner or other person failing to comply with any of these by-laws or delivering any particulars required to be delivered under or in pursuance of these by-laws which to his knowledge are incorrect shall be guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds and to a further penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each day during which such offence is continued after conviction thereof.

#### *Repeal.*

10. From and after the date of the coming into operation of these by-laws, all by-laws made by the Council under the London Overhead Wires Act, 1891, and continued in force by Section 33 of the London Overground Wires, &c., Act, 1933, shall be repealed. Provided that, with respect to any wire existing at the date upon which these by-laws come into operation and erected and maintained in accordance with the by-laws previously in force under the London Overhead Wires Act, 1891, this repeal shall not operate so as to require the removal of such wire, and such wire shall, unless it is dangerous or an obstruction to traffic, be deemed to be in accordance with these by-laws for the purposes of Section 9 of the London Overground Wires, &c., Act, 1933.

#### *Exemptions.*

11. Nothing in these by-laws shall extend or apply to any wire upon which exemption from these by-laws is conferred by Sections 14, 15, 17, 19, 20 and 21 of the London Overground Wires, &c., Act, 1933.
