participate in such benefit, and may from time to time by Order in Council revoke or vary any such Order:

And whereas His late Majesty King George the Fifth, in pursuance of the said Act, was pleased on the twenty-eighth day of November nineteen hundred and twenty-three, by Order in Council (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") to order that certain classes of persons specified in the principal Order should, subject to the conditions and restrictions therein specified, be eligible to participate in such benefit:

And whereas it is expedient to extend further the classes of persons eligible to participate in such benefit and to render ineligible for such participation persons in the permanent civil service of the Government of Iraq:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In addition to the persons heretofore eligible to participate in such benefit the following persons shall be so eligible, subject to the conditions and restrictions in the principal Order specified, that is to say:—

(a) persons in the permanent civil service of the Government of Burma; and

(b) Candidates for short service commissions in the Royal Air Force undergoing a course of elementary training at Civil Training Schools;

2. Persons in the permanent civil service of the Government of Iraq shall cease to be so eligible.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932 (7 Edw. 7, c. 29, 4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 18, 9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 80, 18 & 19 Geo. 5, c. 3, and 22 & 23 Geo. 5, c. 32), it is provided that the said Section shall apply only to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts it is provided that the provisions of that Section shall apply only in the case of those foreign states with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares them to be applicable:

And whereas at The Hague on the 6th November, 1925, His late Majesty King George V and the heads of certain foreign states having deemed it expedient to make certain modifications in and additions to the International Convention of the 20th March, 1883, for the creation of an International Union for the Protection of Industrial Property, as revised at Brussels on the 14th December, 1900, and at Washington on the 2nd June, 1911, agreed upon

a Convention (Treaty Series No. 16 (1928)) comprising the said International Convention as revised at Brussels and at Washington with the said modifications and additions, the ratification of which Convention was duly effected by Great Britain and certain other foreign states:

And whereas Denmark has acceded to the said Convention:

And whereas by reason of the accession to the said Convention of Denmark the laws thereof confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Denmark or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in the said Section 48:

And whereas the said Convention is an arrangement of the nature contemplated by the said Section 91:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 20th November, 1894 (S.R. & O. Rev. 1904, IX., Patents, &c., p. 13), Her late Majesty Queen Victoria was pleased to declare that certain provisions of the Patents, Designs and Trade Marks Act, 1883 (46 & 47 Vict. c. 57), as amended by the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks (Amendment) Act, 1885, (48 & 49 Vict. c. 63), the Patents Act, 1886 (49 & 50 Vict. c. 37), and the Patents, Designs, and Trade Marks Act, 1888 (51 & 52 Vict. c. 50), should apply to Denmark, including the Faroe Islands, and it is expedient, on the making of this Order, that the said Order dated the 20th November, 1894, should be revoked:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows:—

1. The laws of Denmark confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Denmark or the territorial waters thereof, corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932.

2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall be applicable to Denmark.

3. The Order in Council dated the 20th November, 1894, is hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as The Industrial Property Convention (Denmark) Order, 1937.

1. The Focal Areas Order is hereby revoked as from the commencement of this Order;

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Spanish Frontiers Observation) (Focal Areas) (Revocation) Order, 1937;

(2) This Order shall extend to all those parts of His Majesty's dominions and other countries to which the Merchant Shipping (Carriage of Munitions to Spain) Act, 1936, extends;

(3) This Order shall come into operation on the 22nd day of October, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven;

(4) The Interpretation Act, 1889, as amended by any subsequent enactment, shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

And whereas by subsection (3) of the said section any such Order in Council may be revoked, altered or added to by a subsequent Order:

And whereas by virtue of the powers conferred by the said Act, provision was made by the Teachers Registration Council Order, 1926, for the constitution of the Registration Council:

And whereas it is desirable to alter the said Order in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the Authority committed to Him by the said Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Teachers Registration Council Order, 1926, is hereby altered by substituting the following Article for Article 9 thereof:—

9. The fees charged to persons in respect of registration shall be at a uniform rate for all types of teachers; but such reduced fees as the Council may determine may be charged to teachers who are accepted for registration within a limited period or periods after their entry into the teaching profession. The fees may be altered from time to time as the Council may direct.

2. This Order may be cited as the Teachers Registration Council Amending Order, 1937.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 22nd day of July, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Ripon:

“ Whereas the Right Reverend Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

“ And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £200 (being a sum which, together with the outstanding balance of the sums already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Ripon:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne, and that the said Governors be empowered to lend under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £200 and that as a security for the same the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to the said Governors by deed for a term of twelve years or until the said sum of £200 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage, no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second

period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to the said Governors their successors or assigns one tenth part of the said principal sum of £200 until the whole thereof shall be repaid, and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for the said Governors their successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Geoffrey, Bishop of Ripon, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the said sum of £200 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the said Governors and their successors shall not be bound or required to see to the application thereof, and that upon the receipt of the said sum so to be borrowed as aforesaid the whole or any part or parts thereof shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint

Cuthbert, Rye Park, situate within the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry District) of Hoddesdon, in the County of Hertford and in the Diocese of Saint Albans:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of Hoddesdon and of the Parish of Great Amwell, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such New Parish and Parish:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of Hoddesdon and of the said Parish of Great Amwell should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Cuthbert, Rye Park, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, as such Bishop, with the consents of the Right Reverend Bishop John Taylor Smith, K.C.B., C.V.O., of Frithwood Avenue, Northwood, in the County of Middlesex, the Reverend Herbert Dudley Lampen, of Toppesfield Rectory, Great Yeldham, in the County of Essex, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford, Henry Thomas Alexander Dashwood, of Number 1, The Sanctuary, in the City of Westminster, Esquire, the Reverend Vernon Faithfull Storr, of Number 20, Dean's Yard, in the said City of Westminster, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon Residentiary of the Collegiate Church of Saint Peter at Westminster, and Guy Jefferys Hornsby Wright, D.S.O., of Emmanuel College, Cambridge, a Lieutenant-Colonel (retired) in Your Majesty's Army, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Hoddesdon, and with the consent of Jessie Harriet Harvey, Wife of the Reverend William John Harvey, of The Rectory, Great Amwell aforesaid, Clerk in Holy Orders, as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Great Amwell (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Hoddesdon and of the said Parish of Great Amwell which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Cuthbert, Rye Park, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Rye Park.'

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Cuthbert, Rye Park, comprising:—

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry District) of Hoddesdon and of the Parish of Great Amwell both in the County of Hertford and in

the Diocese of Saint Albans, which taken together are bounded upon the north-east by the Parish of Stanstead Abbots, upon the east by the Parish of Roydon, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the west, and upon the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Roydon from the said New Parish of Hoddesdon at a point in the middle of the River Lea Navigation opposite to the south-eastern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 289 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Hoddesdon Urban published in the year 1920 on the scale of 25 inches to one mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation from the close numbered 290 upon the said maps, and extending thence first north-westward to such fence and then first north-westward and then in various directions along the fences and ditch which divide the said close numbered 289 from the closes numbered 290, 185 and 188 upon the said maps for a distance in all of 29½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 289 from the said close numbered 188 reaches the eastern side of Essex Road, and extending thence first westward to and then first northward and then north-westward along the middle of Essex Road for a distance of 51 chains or thereabouts to the point opposite to the place where the boundary of the Rye Park Ward of the Urban District of Hoddesdon diverges northward from following the northern side of Essex Road, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then first north-eastward and then in various directions along the said Ward Boundary (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Hoddesdon from the said Parish of Great Amwell) for a distance of 73 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the footpath which leads along the southern side of Tunfield Nursery into Western Terrace, and extending thence eastward to and along the middle of such footpath for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath leading past the eastern side of the said Nursery, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate in Western Terrace and Nursery Road, and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence and the wall or fence in continuation thereof for a distance in all of 14½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the western side of Stanstead Road, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of Stanstead Road for a distance of 4½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to the house and premises known as Cranbourne, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 11½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the Hertford Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway across such roadway and extending thence northward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the premises

attached to the said house known as Cranbourne and extending thence eastward to and along the said wall or fence and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the River Lea Navigation upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Great Amwell from the said Parish of Stanstead Abbots."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Parishes of Norwich, Saint George Tombland, and Norwich, Saint Simon and Saint Jude, being the Parishes of the United Benefice of Norwich, Saint George Tombland with Saint Simon and Saint Jude, situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council made on the 30th day of April, 1894, the Benefices of Norwich, Saint George Tombland, and Norwich, Saint Simon and Saint Jude were united into one Benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes, but the Parishes of the said Benefices remained and still remain distinct:

"And whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Parishes of Norwich, Saint George Tombland, and Norwich, Saint Simon and Saint Jude, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich, and therein recommended the union of the said two Parishes and the terms for effecting such union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Parishes based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said United Benefice of Norwich, Saint George Tombland with Saint Simon and Saint Jude is now full the Reverend Geoffrey Gunnell Newman being the present Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and the said Geoffrey Gunnell Newman (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Parish of Norwich, Saint George Tombland and the said Parish of Norwich, Saint Simon and Saint Jude, shall be permanently united together and form one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Norwich, Saint George Tombland, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Norwich, Saint George Tombland, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Norwich, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Parish but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Norwich, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

"5.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Norwich, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales shall be appropriated to and form part of the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Norwich established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

"(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Norwich, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint George Tombland, Norwich, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Norwich and the

bells organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Norwich, or such of them as the Bishop of Norwich shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Norwich for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Norwich which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Norwich.

“ Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Norwich, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal of the said Church of Saint Simon and Saint Jude, Norwich, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

“ And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measure:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Hinderclay and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Wattisfield, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Hinderclay and Wattisfield duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, having prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich embodies certain modifications thereof:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Hinderclay is now full the Reverend Alexander Reginald Shaw being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Wattisfield is at present vacant:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and of the said Alexander Reginald Shaw (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Hinderclay and the said Benefice of Wattisfield shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Hinderclay with Wattisfield’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Alexander Reginald Shaw if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Hinderclay shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Hinderclay shall become

and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Wattisfield and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that out of the net proceeds of such sale such a sum as the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall approve shall be appropriated towards the cost of repairs and improvements to the Parish Church of Wattisfield and the residue of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining occasional clerical assistance and a portion of the endowments of the United Benefice namely an annual payment of £75 arising in respect of part of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne's Bounty to the said Benefices of Hinderclay and Wattisfield pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be appropriated as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for such occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid, which said fund shall be paid by Queen Anne's Bounty to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the expense of occasional clerical assistance as aforesaid.

That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Wattisfield having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Hinderclay having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the

unions (1) of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, with a part of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, and (2) of the said Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas, with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Sheffield and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Sheffield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all of the said three Benefices of Sheffield, Saint Matthew; Eldon, Saint Jude; and Gillcar, Saint Silas, are now full the Reverend Ernest Charles Morgan being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, the Reverend George Wakefield Turner being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, and the Reverend James Haythornthwaite being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, Ernest Charles Morgan and James Haythornthwaite (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, and a part of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, namely all that part of the last named Benefice which lies to the north-east of the middle of Fitzwilliam Street shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew).

"2. That the said Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas, and the remaining part of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas' (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas).

"3. That with the consents of the said Ernest Charles Morgan and James Haythornthwaite (testified as aforesaid) if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, shall be vacant then the said unions shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, shall be full, then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude.

"4. That the Church of the Parish of Saint Matthew, Sheffield, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Sheffield, Saint Matthew and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the united Parish.

"5. That the Church of the Parish of Saint Silas, Gillcar, shall be the Parish Church of the

United Parish of Gillcar, Saint Silas, and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Gillcar, Saint Silas, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the united Parish.

"6. That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the said Parish of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"7. That upon the unions taking effect (a) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, and (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas, and (c) so soon as conveniently may be after the said unions have taken effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as a fund for and towards the cost of the provision of a Parsonage House for the proposed District hereinafter mentioned.

"8.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect the Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any grounds annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Sheffield under the said Measures of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) a sum equal to one-fifth of the said net proceeds shall be appropriated to the said Expenses Fund; (2) a sufficient sum shall be appropriated for the payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations; and (3) the residue of such net proceeds shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to

be selected by the Bishop of Sheffield as the District for which such Church shall be built; and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection of such Church shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Sheffield.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Matthew, Sheffield, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Sheffield and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, or such of them as the Bishop of Sheffield shall select, shall be removed to the said Church of Saint Matthew, Sheffield, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Sheffield for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Sheffield which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Sheffield equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the Expenses Fund.

9. That (a) the patronage of the United Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Matthew, (b) the patronage of the United Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas, shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Gillcar, Saint Silas, and (c) the patronage of the proposed new District hereinbefore mentioned shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude.

10. That with the consent of the Right Honourable Stanley Baldwin, now First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, Your Heirs and Successors, as Patron of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude (which consent is testified by his signing this Scheme), upon the unions taking effect a part of the endowments or property of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be united, namely, the whole of the endowments and property (other than the Parsonage House) of the said Benefice of Eldon, Saint Jude, shall be held and accumulated for and towards the augmentation of the proposed new District hereinbefore referred to.

“ Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Jude, Eldon, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

“ And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Sheffield has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been proceeded with to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Church of Saint Simon shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners towards the cost of the provision of a Church Room within the area of the Parish of the said United Benefice of Liverpool, Saint Silas, and any balance remaining after the provision of such Church Room shall be added to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Liverpool established pursuant to the said Measures.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Simon shall in accordance with the provisions of

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Ripon embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefices of Leeds (Saint Peter) and Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, are now full the Reverend Canon William Thompson Elliott being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leeds (Saint Peter) and the Reverend John Buchanan being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, and the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) is at present vacant:

"And whereas steps are being taken under the provisions of the Parsonages Measure, 1930, for the sale of the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill):

"And whereas the patronage of the said Benefices of Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill), and Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, belongs to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Leeds (Saint Peter):

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Geoffrey Charles Lester, Bishop of Ripon, and of the said William Thompson Elliott (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Leeds (Saint Peter), the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill), and the said Benefice of Leeds,

Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Saint Peter at Leeds' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

"2. That if on the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, shall be vacant, the said union shall forthwith take effect, but if upon that day the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, shall be full, then the union shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, and in that case upon the said day and pending the union of all three of the said Benefices as aforesaid the said Benefice of Leeds (Saint Peter) and the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) shall be united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes: and in any case the said William Thompson Elliott if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leeds (Saint Peter) shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon either of the unions recommended and proposed by Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme taking effect the Church of the Parish of Leeds (Saint Peter) shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Leeds (Saint Peter) shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"4. That upon any union including the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) taking effect as aforesaid the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Mary (Quarry Hill), Leeds, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the union of all three of the said Benefices taking effect the register books of baptisms marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Churches of Saint Thomas, Leeds, and Saint Luke, Leeds, respectively shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current in the said Churches of Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"6. That upon either of the unions recommended and proposed by Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Leeds (Saint Peter) shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be after the union recommended and proposed by Clause 1 of this Scheme has taken effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem

expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the said Measures.

" 7. That upon the union of the said Benefices of Leeds (Saint Peter) and Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) taking effect as aforesaid then pending the union of all three of the said Benefices of Leeds (Saint Peter), Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) and Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of three Curates (one to serve the Church of Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) Leeds) and a part of the endowment of the United Benefice namely an annual sum of £808 shall be applicable as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curates which said fund of £808 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said annual sum of £808 shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipends of the said three Curates.

" 8. That upon either of the unions recommended and proposed by Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme taking effect the income arising from the net proceeds of the sale of the Parsonage House of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) shall be received and be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice as an addition to the funds referred to in Clauses 7 and 9 of this Scheme and be subject to the conditions which by those Clauses are made applicable to such funds.

" 9. That upon the union of all three of the said Benefices of Leeds (Saint Peter), Leeds, Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) and Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of five Curates (one to serve the said Church of Saint Mary (Quarry Hill) Leeds) and a part of the endowments of the United Benefice namely an annual sum of £1,150 shall be applicable as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of such Curates which said fund of £1,150 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said annual sum of £1,150 shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of the said five Curates.

" 10. That with the consent (testified as aforesaid) of the said William Thompson Elliott, being the Patron in right of his said Benefice of Leeds (Saint Peter) of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke, upon the union recommended and proposed by Clause 1 of this Scheme taking effect a part of the endowments or property of the Benefices proposed to be constituted an United Benefice namely an annual sum of £130 being

part of a larger annual sum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint Thomas and Saint Luke shall be severed or diverted therefrom and shall be held and accumulated by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the augmentation of the proposed District of Farm Hill, Leeds, in the said Diocese of Ripon.

" 11.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union recommended and proposed by Clause 1 of this Scheme has taken effect the Church of Saint Luke shall be taken down and the Church of Saint Thomas (if not previously taken down pursuant to the authority of a Faculty or otherwise) shall also be taken down and the materials of the Church of Saint Luke or of both Churches, as the case may be, and the sites of both Churches, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Ripon under the said Measures of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Ripon.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Churches of Saint Thomas and Saint Luke shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Peter, Leeds, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Ripon and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Churches of Saint Thomas and Saint Luke or such of them as the Bishop of Ripon shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Ripon for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Ripon which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Ripon.

" 12. That after either of the said unions recommended and proposed by this Scheme has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Leeds (Saint Peter).

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Churches of Saint Thomas and Saint Luke shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Churches of Saint Thomas and Saint Luke and of the sites thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ripon has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

" Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Hailsham, of the Parish of Willingdon, of the Parish of Westham, of the Parish of Jevington, of the Parish of Wilmington, and of the Parish of Folkington, all in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

" And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Hailsham, of the said Parish of Willingdon, of the said Parish of Westham, of the said Parish of Jevington, of the said Parish of Wilmington and of the said Parish of Folkington should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint John, Polegate, situate as aforesaid:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation) with the consent of the Church Association Trust, Incorporated, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Hailsham (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Representation), with the consent of the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Chichester, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Willingdon (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Capitular Seal to this Representation) with the consent of the Most Honourable Edward William Spencer, Marquess of Hartington, as the Patron as well of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Westham as of the Rectory of the said Parish of Jevington and of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Wilmington, and with the consent of Roland Vaughan Gwynne D.S.O. of Folkington Manor, Polegate aforesaid, a Lieutenant-Colonel in Your Majesty's Army, as the Patron of the Rectory of the said Parish of Folkington (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Hailsham, of the said Parish of Willingdon, of the said Parish of

Westham, of the said Parish of Jevington, of the said Parish of Wilmington, and of the said Parish of Folkington which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint John, Polegate, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Polegate.'

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

" The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint John, Polegate, comprising:—
