The route to Westminster Abbey was by the Mall, Admiralty Arch, Trafalgar Square, Whitehall, Parliament Street, East side of Parliament Square, St. Margaret's Street, and Broad Sanctuary to the West entrance of Westminster Abbey.

The Peers, Dowager Peeresses and Peeresses, in their Robes of Estate, and others invited by His Majesty's Command to be present at the Solemnity of the Coronation, were conducted to the places assigned to them in Westminster Abbey before 8.30 o'clock, at which time the doors of the Abbey were closed.

The Lords Spiritual were seated on the North side of the Area, or Sacrarium, the Lords Temporal in the South Transept, and the Dowager Peeresses and Peeresses in the North Transept.

The Great Officers of State and the Lords appointed to carry Their Majesties' Regalia, in their Robes of Estate, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, the Bishops who supported Their Majesties, and those who carried the Bible, the Chalice, and the Paten, vested in Copes, and the other persons appointed to take part in the Procession, assembled in the Vestibule without the West door.

The Dean and Prebendaries of Westminster, the Representatives of the Church of Scotland and of the Free Churches, the Domestic Chaplains and the Chaplains, stood in the Nave, in readiness to join the proceeding, immediately before the Officers of Arms, on the arrival of Their Majesties.

DISPOSITION OF THE PROCESSION.

The Chaplains and the Domestic Chaplains passed to the seats provided for them.

The Representatives of the Free Churches and of the Church of Scotland passed to the seats provided for them on the North side of the Theatre.

The Prebendaries passed to their places on the South side of the Altar.

The Dean of Westminster proceeded to his place on the South side of the Altar.

Portcullis and Bluemantle Pursuivants and the Pursuivants of Scotland stood near the North-West Pillar.

The Officers of the Orders of Knighthood passed to the seats provided for them.

The Heralds of Scotland stood near the South-West Pillar throughout the Ceremony.

The Standards were handed to the Barons of the Cinque Ports at the entrance to the Choir. The Bearers of the Standards continued in the Procession to the Theatre, and then passed to their seats, as Peers, or to the seats provided for them.

The Treasurer of the Household passed to his place on the South-east side of the Area.

The Comptroller and the Vice-Chamberlain of the Household passed to their seats.

The Keeper of the Jewel House stood behind the King's Chair of State.

Rouge Dragon and Rouge Croix Pursuivants stood near the South-west Pillar.

The Knights of the Garter appointed to carry the Canopy passed to the seats provided for them.

The Lord Chamberlain of the Household stood behind the King's Chair of State.

The Lord Steward of the Household passed to his seat as a Peer.

The Lord President of the Council stood near the North-east Pillar.

The Prime Ministers passed to the seats provided for them in the Choir.

The Archbishop of York passed to his seat on the North side of the Altar.

The Lord High Chancellor stood near the South-east Pillar.

The Archbishop of Canterbury proceeded to the Altar.

Windsor Herald, York Herald, and Maltravers Herald Extraordinary stood near the North-west Pillar.

THE QUEEN, with her Supporters and Attendants, preceded by Her Majesty's Lord Chamberlain and the Lords bearing her Regalia, passed on the North side of her Throne to her Chair of State on the South side of the Area, making her humble adoration, and stood by her chair until the arrival of His Majesty.

The Mistress of the Robes and the Ladies bearing Her Majesty's Train stood behind the Queen's chair, and supported Her Majesty's Train during the Ceremony as occasion required.

The Queen's Lord Chamberlain and the Lords who bore Her Majesty's Regalia stood near Her Majesty, the Lord Chamberlain on the right hand. The Bishops, her Supporters, stood on either side of Her Majesty.

The Serjeants at Arms passed to their places near the Theatre.

The Gentleman at Arms who guarded Her Majesty remained at the foot of the steps ascending to the Theatre.

The Ladies of the Bedchamber and the Women of the Bedchamber passed to the seats provided for them.

The Treasurer and the Private Secretary to the Queen passed to their seats.

Lancaster Herald, Somerset Herald, Chester Herald, and Richmond Herald stood near the South-west Pillar.

Lyon King of Arms, Ulster King of Arms, the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, and the Lord Mayor of London stood near the South-east Pillar throughout the Ceremony.

Clarenceux King of Arms and Norroy King of Arms stood near the North-east Pillar.

The High Constable of Scotland passed to his seat as a Peer.

The Lord High Steward of Ireland passed to his seat as a Peer.

The Lord Great Chamberlain, the Lord High Constable, and the Earl Marshal, with the Archbishop of Canterbury (after his devotions at the Altar), and Garter King of Arms, took their places near the South-east Pillar.

The Bishops bearing the Bible, the Chalice, and the Paten passed to their places on the North side of the Altar.

THE KING, with his Supporters and Attendants, preceded by the Lords bearing His Majesty's Regalia, passed on the South side of his Throne to his Chair of State on the South side of the Area, making his humble adoration, and their Majesties, after their private devotions (kneeling at their faldstools), took their respective seats. The Bishops, his Supporters, stood on either side of His Majesty: the Lords bearing the four Swords stood on His Majesty's right hand, the Sword of State being nearest to the Royal Person; the Lords bearing the rest of His Majesty's Regalia stood about the King's Chair; His Majesty's Train bearers and the Groom of the Robes stood behind His Majesty.

The Gentlemen at Arms who guarded His Majesty remained at the foot of the steps ascending to the Theatre.

The Master of the Horse and the Captain General of the King's Bodyguard for Scotland passed to their seats as Peers.

The Gold Stick in Waiting and the Vice-Admiral of the United Kingdom passed to their seats.

The Lord in Waiting passed to his seat as a Peer.

The Captain of the Honourable Corps of Gentlemen at Arms and the Captain of the Yeomen of the Guard passed to their seats as Peers.

The Keeper of His Majesty's Privy Purse and the Private Secretary to the King passed to their seats.

The Comptroller, Lord Chamberlain's office, the Crown Equerry, the Groom in Waiting, the Equerries to the King, the Silver Stick in Waiting, and the Field Officer in Brigade Waiting passed to their seats.

The Officers of the Yeomen of the Guard and the Exons stood within, and near the entrance to, the Choir, and the Yeomen of the Guard stood in the Nave outside the entrance to the Choir.

The Pages of those Peers who bore Their Majesties' Regalia, or had other duties to perform, went to the places appointed for them, and, before the Crowning of the King, delivered the Coronets which they carried to the respective Peers, returning at once to their places.

The Mistress of the Robes received her coronet from her Page before the Crowning of the Queen.

The Pages of other Peers, upon ascending the Theatre, delivered the coronets which they carried to the respective Peers and went to the seats provided for them, where they remained until the Procession was re-formed on the conclusion of the Service.

THE SERVICE.

THE RECOGNITION.

Upon the conclusion of the Anthem the King, conducted by Garter King of Arms, left his Chair of State and stood by King Edward's Chair on the North-west side of the Area. The Archbishop of Canterbury advanced from his station at the South-East Pillar, and, together with the Lord High Chancellor, the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Lord High Constable, and the Earl Marshal, preceded by Garter King of Arms, turned to the East side of the Theatre, where the Archbishop made the Presentation thus: "SIRS, I here present unto you King GEORGE, your undoubted King: wherefore all you who are come this day to do your homage and service, are you willing to do the same?" and repeated the same at the South, West, and North sides of the Theatre; during which time His Majesty turned towards the People on the side at which the Recognition was made; the People replying to each demand with loud and repeated acclamations of "GOD SAVE KING GEORGE"; the trumpets sounding at the last Recognition.

His Majesty then resumed his seat.

The Bishops bearing the Bible, the Chalice, and the Paten placed them on the Altar and went back to their seats.

The Archbishop of Canterbury then proceeded to the Altar.

The Lord High Chancellor, the Lord High Constable and the Earl Marshal went to the places appointed for them on the North-East side of the Theatre, where they remained until the Inthronization. The Lord Great Chamberlain went to the left side of His Majesty's Chair.

Their Majesties' Regalia, except the Swords, were delivered by the Lords bearing the same to the Archbishop, and by him to the Dean of Westminster, to be laid on the Altar; the Lords who had borne the same, and the Queen's Lord Chamberlain, then went to the places appointed for them on the South-East side of the Area and remained there until the Inthronization. The Lords bearing the Swords (except the Sword of State) continued to stand by the Kings' Chair of State until the Inthronization.

THE OATH.

The Archbishop of Canterbury then, standing before the King, ministered the questions contained in the Order of Service. These questions having been answered by His Majesty, the King rose from his Chair, and, supported as before and attended by his Trainbearers and the Lord Great Chamberlain, the Sword of State alone being borne before His Majesty, went to the Altar, where, taking off his Cap of State, kneeling upon the cushion placed on the steps, and laying his right hand on the Holy Gospel in the Great Bible (which had been carried in the Procession), tendered to His Majesty by the Archbishop, he took the *Coronation Oath*, kissed the Book, and to a transcript of the Oath set his Royal Sign Manual, the Lord Chamberlain of the Household holding a Silver Standish for that purpose, delivered to him by the Keeper of the Jewel House.

The King then returned to his Chair, supported and attended as before, and the Archbishop of Canterbury, advancing towards the King, ministered to His Majesty the prescribed *Declaration*, which the King repeated and signed, the Lord Chamberlain of the Household holding the Silver Standish as before.

THE COMMUNION SERVICE.

The Archbishop of Canterbury began the Communion Service, the Bishop of London reading the Epistle, and the Archbishop of York the Gospel. During the Service the King was uncovered.

On the conclusion of the Creed, Their Majesties kneeling at their Faldstools, the Hymn "Veni, Creator Spiritus" was sung by the Choir, the Archbishop beginning the first line.

THE ANOINTING.

Upon the conclusion of the Hymn, the Archbishop said the Prayer preparatory to the Anointing, "O, Lord, Holy Father, who by anointing with oil didst of old make and consecrate kings, priests, and prophets," &c. This prayer being ended, the King resumed his Cap of State. The Choir sang the Anthem, "Zadok the priest and Nathan the prophet" &c.

During the Anthem the King rose, and was disrobed of his Crimson Robe by the Lord Great Chamberlain, who delivered it to the Groom of the Robes, and His Majesty taking off his Cap of State, the Lord Great Chamberlain delivered the same to the Lord Chamberlain of the Household. The Robe and Cap were immediately carried into St. Edward's Chapel by the Groom of the Robes.

The King then went before the Altar, supported, and attended by the Lord Great Chamberlain, as before (the Sword of State borne before His Majesty) and was seated in King Edward's Chair, placed, with a Faldstool before it, in front of the Altar. Four Knights of the Garter, the Marquess of Londonderry, the Duke of Abercorn, the Earl of Lytton and the Earl Stanhope (summoned by Garter), held over the King's head a rich Canopy of Cloth of Gold, delivered to them by Somerset Herald, Richmond Herald, Rouge Dragon Pursuivant, and Rouge Croix Pursuivant, who received the same from the Lord Chamberlain of the Household and the Groom of the Robes. The Dean of Westminster took from the Altar the Ampulla containing the holy Oil, and poured some into the Anointing Spoon, wherewith the Archbishop anointed His Majesty in the form of a cross on the palms of both hands saying, "Be thy Hands anointed," &c., on the breast saying, "Be thy Breast anointed," &c., and on the crown of the head saying "Be thy Head anointed," &c.

The Dean of Westminster thereupon replaced the Ampulla and Spoon on the Altar.

The Archbishop, standing in front of the Altar, pronounced the Blessing after the Anointing, the King kneeling at his Faldstool; His Majesty then resumed his seat in King Edward's Chair. The Knights of the Garter gave back the Canopy to the Heralds and Pursuivants aforementioned and went back to their seats.

THE COLOBIUM SINDONIS AND SUPERTUNICA.

The King arising, the Dean of Westminster received from the Groom of the Robes the Colobium Sindonis and the Supertunica, or Close Pall of Cloth of Gold, together with a Girdle of the same, and invested His Majesty therewith. The King then resumed his seat.

THE GOLDEN SPURS.

The Dean of Westminster brought the Spurs from the Altar and delivered them to the Lord Great Chamberlain, who, kneeling down, touched His Majesty's heels therewith and gave them back to the Dean, by whom they were laid upon the Altar.

THE SWORD.

The Lord carrying the Sword of State delivered it to the Lord Chamberlain of the Household, and, in lieu thereof, received from him another Sword in a Scabbard, handed to the Lord Chamberlain by the Keeper of the Jewel House. The Sword of State was deposited by the Keeper of the Jewel House in the Traverse in St. Edward's Chapel. The Sword in the Scabbard was delivered by the bearer thereof to the Archbishop, who laid it on the Altar, saying the Prayer, "Hear our prayers, O Lord, we beseech thee, and so direct and support thy servant, King George," &c.

The Archbishop then took the Sword from off the Altar, and, assisted by the Archbishop of York, the Bishops of London and Winchester and other Bishops, delivered it into the King's right hand, saying, "Receive this kingly Sword," &c.

The King standing up, the Sword was girt about him by the Lord Great Chamberlain; and then, the King sitting down, the Archbishop said, "With this Sword do justice," &c.

THE OFFERING OF THE SWORD.

The King rose up and, ungirding his Sword, went to the Altar, where His Majesty offered the same, and returned to, and sat down in, King Edward's Chair. The Sword was then redeemed for One Hundred Shillings by the Lord who first received it, who, on receiving it again from the Dean of Westminster, carried it during the remainder of the Solemnity, having first drawn it out of the Scabbard which he delivered to the Groom of the Robes. The Bishops who assisted during the Offering went back to their places.

THE INVESTING WITH THE ARMILL AND ROYAL ROBE.

The Groom of the Robes then delivered the Armill and the Royal Robe or Pall of Cloth of Gold to the Dean of Westminster, who, the King having arisen, invested His Majesty therewith, the Lord Great Chamberlain fastening the Clasps.

THE ORB.

The King thereupon sat down, and the Archbishop, having received the Orb from the Dean of Westminster, delivered it into the King's right hand, saying: "Receive this Imperial Robe, and Orb;" &c. His Majesty returned the Orb to the Dean, who laid it on the Altar.

THE RING.

The Keeper of the Jewel House delivered the King's Ring to the Archbishop, who put it on the fourth finger of the King's right hand, saying: "Receive this Ring," &c.

THE SCEPTRES.

The Dean of Westminster brought from the Altar the Sceptre with the Cross and the Sceptre with the Dove, and delivered them to the Archbishop.

The Glove presented by the Lord of the Manor of Worksop (Earl of Lincoln acting as Deputy) was put on, and the Archbishop delivered the Sceptre with the Cross into His Majesty's right hand, saying: "Receive the Royal Sceptre," &c.; and the Sceptre with the Dove into his left hand, saying: "Receive the Rod of equity and mercy;" &c. The Lord of the Manor of Worksop supported His Majesty's right arm as occasion required.

THE CROWNING.

The Archbishop, standing before the Altar, took St. Edward's Crown into his hands, and laying it down again said, "O God, the crown of the faithful;" &c.

Then the Archbishop, with the Archbishop of York and other Bishops, came from the Altar; and the Archbishop, having received the Crown from the Dean of Westminster, reverently placed it on His Majesty's head. Thereupon the people, with loud and repeated shouts, cried: "God save the King"; the Princes and Peers putting on their coronets, and the Kings of Arms their crowns; the trumpets sounding, the drums beating, and, at a signal given, the great guns of the Tower and the guns in the Park being shot off.

The acclamation having ceased, the Archbishop pronounced the Prayer: "God crown you with a crown of glory," &c., and the Choir sang "Be strong and play the man;" &c.

The Lord Chamberlain of the Household then received the Glove from the King's right hand, and delivered it to the Groom of the Robes, who deposited it in the Traverse in St. Edward's Chapel.

THE HOLY BIBLE.

The Dean of Westminster, taking the Holy Bible from the Altar, delivered it to the Archbishop, who, attended and assisted by the Archbishop of York and the Bishops, presented it to the King, first saying: "Our gracious King;" &c.

The King gave back the Bible to the Archbishop, who gave it to the Dean of Westminster, to be by him replaced on the Altar, the Archbishop of York and the Bishops going back to their seats.

During the presentation of the Holy Bible the King handed the Sceptre with the Cross to the Lord of the Manor of Worksop to hold.

THE BENEDICTION.

The Archbishop then pronounced the Benediction, and turning to the people said: "And the same Lord God Almighty grant," &c. The Archbishop of York, the Bishops, and the rest of the Peers, followed every part of the Benediction with a loud and hearty *Amen*.

THE INTHRONIZATION.

The King ascended the Theatre, accompanied by the two Bishops his Supporters, the Great Officers of State, the Lords carrying the Swords, and the Lords who had borne Their Majesties' Regalia, and was Inthroned by the Archbishops, Bishops, and the other Peers, who then stood about the steps of the Throne. His Majesty's Train bearers stood behind the Throne. The Archbishop, standing before the King, pronounced the Exhortation, "Stand firm, and hold fast," &c.

THE HOMAGE.

The Exhortation being ended, His Majesty delivered the Sceptre with the Cross to the Lord who had first borne it, to hold the same on his right hand, and the Sceptre with the Dove to the Lord who had first borne it, to hold the same on his left during the Homage.

The Archbishop knelt before the King and pronounced the words of Fealty for himself and the other Lords Spiritual, who knelt in their places and said their words of Fealty after him. The Archbishop then kissed His Majesty's left cheek.

Then the Duke of Gloucester, ascending the steps of the Throne and taking off his coronet, knelt before the King, placed his hands between the King's hands, and pronounced the words of Homage; His Royal Highness then touched the Crown upon His Majesty's head, kissed His Majesty's left cheek, and retired. After him the Duke of Kent, also kneeling before the King, in like manner performed his Homage. The other Peers of the Realm then did their Homage. The Senior of each Degree ascended the steps of the Throne, put off his coronet, knelt before the King, placed his hands within the King's hands, and pronounced the words of Homage for himself and the other Peers of the same Degree, who, taking off their coronets and kneeling in their places, said the words of Homage after him. The Senior Peer of each Degree then touched His Majesty's Crown and kissed His Majesty's left cheek. The Peers bearing the Swords, when performing their Homage, delivered them to Peers near them to hold during the Ceremony.

At the conclusion of the Homage, the King received the two Sceptres from the bearers thereof. The Bishops that supported the King in the Procession also eased him by supporting his Crown as there was occasion.

While the Homage was being done the Choir sang the following Anthems—

- " O Come ye servants of the Lord," &c.
- " Hear my prayer, O Lord," &c.
- " O clap your hands together, all ye people," &c.
- " All the ends of the world shall remember themselves," &c.
- " O praise God in His holiness," &c.
- " Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace," &c.

At the conclusion of the Homage, the drums beat, the trumpets sounded and all the people shouted, crying out:—

God save King George,
 Long live King George,
 May the King live for ever.

The Archbishop of Canterbury then went to the Altar.

ANOINTING, CROWNING, AND INTHRONING THE QUEEN.

The Queen, who had been seated in her Chair on the South side of the Area during the Coronation and Inthronization of His Majesty, arose and went to the steps of the Altar as soon as the Homage was ended, supported as before and attended by the Mistress of the Robes and Train Bearers, and there knelt whilst the Archbishop said the Prayer, " Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness;" &c. Her Majesty then rose and went to the Faldstool (placed before the Altar, between the steps and King Edward's Chair) at which she was to be Anointed and Crowned.

The Queen there knelt down, and four Peeresses, appointed for that service, the Duchess of Norfolk, the Duchess of Rutland, the Duchess of Buccleuch and the Duchess of Roxburghe (summoned by Garter), held a rich Canopy of Cloth of Gold over Her Majesty delivered to them by Windsor Herald, York Herald, Portcullis Pursuivant, and Bluemantle Pursuivant. The Archbishop poured the holy Oil (which he received from the Dean of Westminster) upon her head, saying, " In the Name of the Father," &c.

Then the Archbishop received from the Keeper of the Jewel House the Queen's Ring, and put the same on the fourth finger of Her Majesty's right hand, saying, " Receive this Ring," &c.

The Archbishop then took the Crown from the Altar and reverently set it on the Queen's head, saying, " Receive the Crown of glory," &c.

Her Majesty having been crowned, the Princesses and Peeresses put on their coronets, which they continued to wear until they left the Abbey. The Archbishop received from the Dean of Westminster the Sceptre with the Cross and the Ivory Rod with the Dove, and placed the Sceptre with the Cross in Her Majesty's right hand and the Ivory Rod with the Dove in her left, saying the Prayer, " O Lord, the giver of all perfection;" &c.

The Queen then rose, and, supported and attended as before, ascended the Theatre (reverently bowing to His Majesty as she passed the Throne), and was conducted to her own Throne on the left of that of the King.

THE COMMUNION.

The Choir then sang the Offertory, " O hearken Thou unto the voice of my calling," &c.

At the commencement of the Offertory, the Bishops who had read the Epistle and the Gospel received from the Altar, by the hands of the Archbishop, the Paten and the Chalice, which they carried into St. Edward's Chapel and brought thence the Bread upon the Paten and the Wine in the Chalice. Their Majesties delivered their Sceptres to the Lords who had previously borne

them, and descended from their Thrones, supported and attended as before, the King's Sword being borne before them, and went to the steps of the Altar, where, taking off their Crowns, which they delivered to the Lord Great Chamberlain and the Lord Chamberlain of the Household, Their Majesties knelt down. Then the Bishops delivered the Paten and the Chalice into the King's hands; and His Majesty delivered them to the Archbishop, who reverently placed them upon the Altar, and, having said the Prayer, "Bless, O Lord, we beseech Thee," &c., covered them with a fair linen cloth.

The King, still kneeling, made his *Oblation*, offering a Pall or Altar Cloth (which the Groom of the Robes delivered to the Lord Great Chamberlain, and he, kneeling, to His Majesty) and an Ingot of Gold of a pound weight (which the Treasurer of the Household delivered to the Lord Great Chamberlain, and he to His Majesty); and the Archbishop received them from the King and placed them upon the Altar.

The Queen also made her *Oblation* of a Pall or Altar Cloth and a Mark weight of Gold, which Her Majesty received, and delivered to the Archbishop, in like manner as the King.

Their Majesties then returned to their Chairs of State on the South side of the Area, supported and attended as before, and knelt down at their Faldstools.

The Archbishop then proceeded with the Office of Holy Communion. When the Archbishop and the Dean of Westminster, with the Bishops Assistant, namely those who had read the Epistle and Gospel, had communicated, the King and Queen advanced to the Steps of the Altar and knelt down, and the Archbishop administered to Their Majesties the Bread, and the Dean of Westminster the Cup.

The King and Queen then received their Crowns from the Lord Great Chamberlain and the Lord Chamberlain of the Household, and, putting them on, repaired to their Thrones, supported and attended as before, and received again the Sceptres in their hands.

The Archbishop then went on to the Post-Communion, at the end of which the Choir sang "Glory be to God on High," &c., and the same being concluded, the Archbishop pronounced the Blessing.

The Choir then sang the "Te Deum."

THE RECESS.

In the meantime, His Majesty, supported and attended as before, preceded by the four Swords and accompanied by the Lords who had carried his Regalia, descended into the Area, and passed through the door on the South side of the Altar into St. Edward's Chapel; the Lords who had carried the Regalia receiving them from the Dean of Westminster as they passed by the Altar.

The Queen at the same time, descending from her Throne, supported and attended as before, went into the same Chapel at the door on the North side of the Altar.

Their Majesties being in the Chapel, the King, standing before the Altar, delivered the Sceptre with the Dove, which His Majesty held in his left hand, to the Archbishop, who laid it upon the Altar there.

The Lords who carried the Orb, the Golden Spurs and St. Edward's Staff delivered the same to the Dean of Westminster, to be by him deposited on the Altar in the Chapel.

His Majesty was disrobed of his Royal Robe of State and arrayed in his Robe of Purple Velvet by the Lord Great Chamberlain, and, wearing his Imperial Crown, then received in his left hand the Orb from the Archbishop.

While Their Majesties were in St. Edward's Chapel the Officers of Arms arranged the Procession for the return to the West Door of the Abbey.

The Procession was formed in the same order as on entering the Abbey, except that the Bishops who had carried the Bible, the Chalice, and the Paten, and the Dean and Prebendaries of Westminster, remained in the Sacrament, and the Representatives of the Church of Scotland and of the Free Churches, the Domestic Chaplains and the Chaplains, remained in their seats. The Four Swords were carried before the King, and were received near the West Door by the Keeper of the Jewel House. Peers and Peeresses wore their coronets and Kings of Arms their crowns.

Their Majesties, wearing Their Crowns, the King bearing in his right hand the Sceptre with the Cross, and in his left the Orb, and the Queen bearing in her right hand her Sceptre with the Cross, and in her left the Ivory Rod with the Dove, were conducted through the Choir to the West Door of the Abbey, and returned in State to the Royal Palace.
