The following Statute made by the Governing Body of New College, Oxford, on the 6th day of October, 1937, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

The following Address was presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the new buildings of the Royal Veterinary College on the 9th instant:—

COURT AND COUNCIL OF THE ROYAL VETERINARY COLLEGE.

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY:

May it please Your Majesty,

The Court and Council of the Royal Veterinary College gratefully acknowledge the signal honour conferred on everyone connected with the College, and indeed on the Veterinary Profession as a whole, by Your Majesty in graciously consenting to open these new buildings and by Her Majesty the Queen in being present with Your Majesty.

These buildings replace old buildings erected in 1791 during the reign of King George III. In all probability, His Majesty took a personal interest in the efforts of the then Duke of Northumberland and other gentlemen to raise the funds necessary to create the first Veterinary College in Great Britain, for, a few years before that time, as Elector of Hanover, he himself founded the Hanover Veterinary School.

The College is fortunate in the possession of portraits of King George III and Queen Charlotte and will be even more fortunate when it possesses the portrait for which Your Majesty has so kindly undertaken to sit, and which is to be painted by Mr. Philip de Laszlo,

The Common Seal of the Warden and Scholars of St. Mary College of Winchester in Oxford, commonly called New College in Oxford, was hereunto affixed in the presence of

and most generously presented by him to the College in memory of Your Majesty's presence here to-day.

The College has had the honour of continuous Royal Patronage since 1830, and received its first Royal Charter in 1875; this was regranted in a revised form in 1936. H.R.H. the Duke of Connaught was its President from 1904 to 1932, when H.R.H. the Duke of Gloucester honoured us by succeeding him. Some fourteen years ago, the old buildings had become so out of date, so inadequate, and so dilapidated, that it was resolved to demolish them completely and to rebuild on the same site, with additional adjoining land—the whole purchased from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners. The wisdom of the Governors' decision was confirmed by a Departmental Committee.

The Governors have had a very hard task in trying to collect the necessary funds, but with the assistance of a grant of £150,000 from the Government and with the help of many generous subscribers a sum of £285,000 has become available. A further sum of £40,000 is still needed to build the large animal Hospital and operating theatre, so completing the building scheme, and to provide the full scientific equipment of the College.

We are confident that the opening of these new buildings will open wide also the doors of a new era in the history of the Veterinary Profession in this country.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following gracious Answer:—

I thank you sincerely for your Address. The Queen and I are very glad to be here to-day as we are deeply interested in the prosperity of the livestock industry in this country. Indeed the well-being of the whole community depends largely on the health of our domestic animals being cared for by a highly-trained veterinary profession. The value of the annual output of food from animal sources amounts to over 170 million pounds, but there is a very considerable wastage through disease.

This serious economic loss to the country can be greatly reduced, thanks to the rapid advance of science in recent years; even so, further research is continually needed to extend the methods of cure and—what is still more important—the prevention of disease.

My Government is taking steps to form a national veterinary service, through which to conduct a vigorous attack on animal diseases on a national scale; but successful research, wise administration and efficient practice all depend on the sound education of the individual.

It is, therefore, very gratifying that, with financial assistance from both public and private sources, the former Board of Governors of the Royal Veterinary College should have been able to reconstruct it on modern lines. I trust that the funds necessary for the completion of the Hospital will be forthcoming shortly.

In declaring the new buildings of the College open, I should like to congratulate Major Maule, the architect, on the splendid result he has achieved, and to express the hope that the important work which lies before the new Court, Council, and Staff may be successfully accomplished.

An explosion caused by the mining occurred underneath the Stoker Petty Officers' and Torpedomen's Mess Decks. To reach the ratings on these mess decks, this party had to jump down 8 feet, the ladder being blown away, into 3 feet of oil fuel and on to a deck which might not have been intact. During this period they remained in imminent risk of falling through the shattered deck into the water and oil fuel. Moreover, they were under the impression that the ship was about to founder. Their exertions to save life consisted in dragging living and dead men from under wreckage and out of the oil fuel and passing them up on deck. This operation lasted from 5 to 10 minutes. The rescued were in very severe danger from having swallowed oil fuel and had they been left would undoubtedly have died. Others were severely burnt and immersion of their wounds in oil fuel, if prolonged, would undoubtedly have caused death.

This man closed the fore magazine and shell room hatches, breaking in with a hacksaw the wire covers which were locked on as the keys could not be found at once. The display of initiative which he showed in assisting the wounded and doing various duties without orders was most noticeable.

Sidney Bevington, Acting Leading Seaman, O.N. D/J. 103378.

When the explosion occurred there was a general exodus from the Seamen's Mess deck up the ammunition hatch and into the galley flat. Keeping two ratings with him, Bevington closed all the scuttles and deadlights before leaving the mess deck. His conduct afterwards was also most worthy of notice.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF INSPECTORS (MALE) UNDER THE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS, 1894-1935.

N.B.—These Regulations are liable to alteration at any time.

1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Ministry. When a vacancy occurs, the Ministry will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

2. A candidate must have attained the age of 23 and must not have attained the age of 32 on the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable

unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

A person upon whose professional training public money has been spent with a view to his entering the Colonial Veterinary Service will not be eligible for consideration whilst under Agreement with the Colonial Office unless he obtains the permission of the authorities of that Department to apply for appointment.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

5. A candidate must have graduated as a Member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons and have had at least one year's practical experience in some recognised branch of the veterinary profession after such graduation.

6. The completed application forms will be scrutinized by the Ministry and selected candidates will be interviewed by a Board consisting of representatives of the Ministry and of the Civil Service Commissioners. The Board will recommend to the Ministry for appointment to the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, provided they find so many suitable.

Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's previous work.

7. The necessary number of candidates will be appointed, subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners that they are eligible for appointment in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and their appointments will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed a period of two years' probation to the satisfaction of the Ministry.

8. Candidates selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £8.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:

Order No. 5541.

(Dated 8th November, 1937.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1937 (No. 39).

SUBJECT.

(i) Declares each of the two Areas described in the First Schedule to be a separate Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925.

(ii) Revokes Orders Nos. 5524, 5530, 5531, 5534, 5535, 5537 and 5539, as from the date of this Order.

(iii) Modifies the provisions of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 by allowing, subject to licence, the movement of animals from either of the Infected Areas described in the First Schedule to this Order direct to a slaughterhouse in the other Infected Area, provided that such slaughterhouse is situated not less than 2 miles from any Infected Place.
