UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE ACT, 1934.

Notice is hereby given under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Unemployment Assistance Board after the expiry of at least forty days from this date in pursuance of the power conferred upon it by Section 52 (1) of the Unemployment Assistance Act, 1934, to make Rules with regard to the making, with the consent of the Treasury, of reciprocal arrangements with the authority administering the scheme of Unemployment Assistance set up in Northern Ireland (1) for dealing with the cases of persons transferring between Great Britain and Northern Ireland, and (2) for determining the conditions under which such persons may be paid allowances.
