*Work No. 1 (A).—*A floating landing stage about fifty feet in length and about twenty-five feet in breadth to be placed in the Harbour of Hamoaze adjoining the said parish at a distance of 45 yards or thereabouts northward of the centre line of the Tamar Canal and 127 yards or thereabouts northward of the floating landing stage firstly described in section 5 (Description of works authorised) of the Devonport Landing Stages Order 1881 and to be held in position by moorings of piles;

To authorise the abandonment and removal by the Corporation of the floating landing stage known as the Pottery Quay Landing Stage together with the bridge or gangway, works and conveniences connected therewith in the parish of Devonport being works 1 (A) and 1 (B) authorised by section 4 and described by section 5 of the Devonport Landing Stages Order 1881 and referred to in section 123 (2) (a) of the Plymouth Corporation Act 1915, and to empower the Corporation notwithstanding such abandonment and removal to use for the purposes of the intended works any of the works so proposed to be abandoned and removed.

8. To empower the Corporation for any of the purposes of the Order to break up, cross, alter, divert, stop up, raise, lower, remove and interfere with either temporarily or permanently any streets, roads, passages, highways, bridges, railways, gas and water mains, sewers, drains, watercourses, telegraphic or telephonic and other electric wires, conductors, and posts, and to make junctions and communications with existing streets in the City.

9. To alter, vary or repeal any rights and privileges which would be inconsistent with the objects of the Order, and to confer other rights and privileges and so far as may be necessary for the purposes of the Order to repeal alter or amend any Act or Order relating to the Corporation.

10. To extend and apply to the proposed works with or without amendment all or some of the powers and provisions of the Plymouth Corporation Act 1915 and the Plymouth Piers Order 1927.

11. To empower the Corporation to borrow money for and in connection with the construction of the said works and for all or any of the purposes of the pier undertaking of the

Corporation and the intended Order and to charge the money so borrowed and the interest thereon upon the tolls rates and revenues under the Acts and Orders relating to that undertaking and upon the revenue of the pier undertaking of the Corporation and upon the general rate fund of the City; to enable the Corporation to apply any of their corporate funds to any of the purposes of the Order; to enact all necessary and proper or convenient provisions with regard to the borrowing, re-borrowing and repayment of money; and to provide for the repayment to the Corporation by the County Council of the Administrative County of Cornwall (hereinafter called "the County Council") of interest and sinking fund payments on moneys so borrowed.

12. To authorise the County Council to execute on behalf of the Corporation the works proposed to be authorised by the Order and to provide for the payment by the county council of some or all of the costs and expenses of or connected with the promotion of the Order and the construction of the works proposed to be authorised thereby; to confirm any agreement which may be entered into between the Corporation and the County Council with reference to the matters aforesaid and to confer on the Corporation and the County Council all necessary and proper powers for the purpose of enabling them to carry out the terms of any such agreement.

13. To incorporate with the Order the Lands Clauses Acts (except so much thereof as relates to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement and to the entry upon lands by the Promoters of the undertaking) and some or all of the provisions of the Harbours Docks and Piers Clauses Act 1847, the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861, the General Pier and Harbour Act 1861 Amendment Act, the Local Government Act 1933, the Public Health Acts and any amendments or modifications of the said Acts and to amend so far as may be necessary or desirable all or any of the provisions of the Acts relating to the pier undertaking of the Corporation and any other Act or Order which might in any way affect or interfere with the carrying into effect of the provisions of the Order.
