“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 13th day of August, 1920, provision is made, *inter alia*, for Surgeon Lieutenant Commanders of Your Majesty's Fleet to pass a qualifying examination as a condition for promotion to the rank of Surgeon Commander :

“And whereas Officers who fail to pass the examination at a second trial are compulsorily retired with such gratuity as we may see fit, within the limit prescribed by the aforesaid Order in Council :

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 26th day of February, 1934, we are empowered to waive the qualifying examination as a condition for promotion to Surgeon Com-

mander in certain circumstances, and we are of opinion that some further relaxation should now be made in the rules laid down by Order in Council dated the 13th day of August, 1920 :

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the following revised regulations for promotion to the rank of Surgeon Commander :—

“(a) The rule laid down by Order in Council of the 13th August, 1920, requiring Surgeon Lieutenant Commanders who fail to pass the examination for promotion to the rank of Surgeon Commander, to take a second trial, to be abolished, together with the consequential penalty of compulsory retirement for failure to pass at this second attempt.

“(b) Surgeon Lieutenant Commanders who fail to pass the examination for promotion to the rank of Surgeon Commander nevertheless to be so promoted, at our discretion, provided they are otherwise qualified for promotion.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 18th day of July, 1838, and published in the London Gazette on the 11th day of September, 1838, a Consolidated Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Andrew situate in the Liberty of Kingswood, in the Parish of Ewell, in the said County of Surrey and at that time in the Diocese of Winchester, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Kingswood':

"And whereas the said Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Kingswood, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Kingswood, should be altered by the annexation thereto of an isolated portion of the Parish of Banstead, in the said County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford, in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark, and of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Guildford (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Kingswood, shall be altered so that all that isolated portion of the said Parish of Banstead, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such Parish and from the said Diocese of Guildford and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Kingswood, and of the said Diocese of Southwark, and shall be included in the Archdeaconry and Rural Deanery within which the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Kingswood, is comprised.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Kingswood, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Southwark being:—

"All that isolated portion of the Parish of Banstead, in the said County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the south by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Kingswood, upon the west by the Parish of Walton on the Hill, and upon the north and upon the east by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mary, Burgh Heath, both in the said County of Surrey and in the said Diocese of Guildford."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrars of the said Diocese of Southwark and of the said Diocese of Guildford respectively.

"And whereas the said Warden and Scholars are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Portsmouth, now vested in them as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Portsmouth for the time being:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Warden and Scholars (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Portsmouth now vested in them the said Warden and Scholars as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And whereas no part of the said investments and property is specifically allotted to the provision or maintenance of an episcopal residence for the Diocese of Derby:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said investments and property should be transferred to us and that in exchange for such transfer we should pay out of the Common Fund created by the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, a fixed annual income for the said Bishopric as a re-endowment thereof:

"And whereas the Right Honourable Neville Chamberlain, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend Alfred Edward John, Bishop of Derby, have respectively signified their consents to the exercise in relation to the said Bishopric of Derby of the power conferred upon us by Section 2 of the said Measure:

"And whereas the Derby Diocesan Board of Finance, the Cathedral Commissioners for England and the Cathedral Council of the Cathedral Church of All Saints, Derby, have—respectively signified their approval of the submission of the said scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London

Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the investments and property described in the said Schedule shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, freed and discharged from all or any trusts previously affecting the same to be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund and that in exchange for such transfer we be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund a fixed annual sum of £3,000 to the said Alfred Edward John, Bishop of Derby, and to his successors in the same Bishopric, as a re-endowment of the said Bishopric, subject however to the provisions mentioned in Clause 8 of the Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 7th day of May, 1928, relating to the constitution of the said Bishopric such annual sum to be paid by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year, the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the day of such publication as aforesaid and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of such publication to the said quarterly day of payment: Provided always that as from the date of such publication as aforesaid, all trusts and provisions for the foundation of a Dean and Chapter previously attaching to the investments and property described in the said Schedule shall cease and determine not only as regards the said investments and property but also as regards the said annual sum of £3,000 and all or any the property or income which may hereafter become part of the endowment or income of the said Bishopric of Derby.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Carlisle which is known as Rose Castle:

“ Whereas the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

“ And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £400 (being a sum which does not exceed two years income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Carlisle:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Acts any sum

not exceeding £400 and that as a security for the same and interest thereon the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to his said See to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, by deed for a term of twelve years or until the said sum of £400 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest in the manner following, that is to say, during and in respect of the first period of 12 months of the said term computed from the day of the date of the mortgage no part of the said principal sum shall be repayable but the said Bishop or his successors shall yearly at the end of the second period of 12 months so computed and at the end of every such like period of 12 months thereafter, pay to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, our successors or assigns one-tenth part of the said principal sum of £400 until the whole thereof shall be repaid and shall also at the end of the first and each succeeding period of 12 months, computed as aforesaid, pay interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum on the said principal sum or on so much thereof as shall from time to time remain unpaid. And that if and when it shall happen that either the principal or the interest directed to be paid as hereinbefore mentioned shall be in arrear and unpaid for the space of 40 days after the same shall have become due it shall and may be lawful for us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, our successors and assigns to recover the same and the costs and charges attending the recovery thereof by distress and sale in the like manner as rents may be recovered by landlords or lessors from their tenants by the laws in force at the time of such distress and sale. And that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £400 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have

been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and the New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, both in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 30th day of May, 1924, and published in the London Gazette on the 3rd day of the following month, certain portions of the New Parish of the Martyrs, Leicester, and of the Parish of Braunstone, both in the said County of Leicester and at that time in the Diocese of Peterborough but now in the said Diocese of Leicester, were constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and the said District was named 'The District of the Holy Apostles, Leicester':

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of Your Majesty in Council bearing date the 29th day of July, 1937, and published in the London Gazette on the 6th day of the following month, a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Peter, Braunstone, situate in the Parish of Glenfield, in the said County of Leicester and in the said Diocese of Leicester, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Braunstone':

"And whereas the said District of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and the said District Chapelry of Saint Peter, Braunstone, have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above

mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

" And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Cyril Charles Bowman, Bishop of Leicester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and of the Extra Parochial Place known as Braunstone Frith, in the said County of Leicester and Diocese of Leicester, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and Extra Parochial Place respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone; and (secondly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, which are described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" The First Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, in the County of Leicester and in the Diocese of Leicester, comprising:—

" I. All those contiguous portions of the New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and of the Extra Parochial Place known as Braunstone Frith, both in the said County and Diocese, which taken together are bounded upon the south-west by the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the north-east, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, of the Parish of Glenfield, in

the said County and Diocese, and of the said Extra Parochial Place known as Braunstone Frith, all meet in the middle of the Leicester and Burton Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Extra Parochial Place known as Braunstone Frith from the New Parish of Saint Anne, Leicester, in the said County and Diocese, and extending thence south-eastward along such boundary for a distance of $7\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Anne, Leicester, from the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and extending thence north-eastward along the last mentioned boundary (thereby following the northern side of Hinckley Road) for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of Braunstone Park, and extending thence southward to and along such wall or fence for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone.

" II. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, which is bounded upon the west by the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, from the said new Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, crosses the middle of Peverel Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Peverel Road for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Wyville Road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Wyville Road for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone.

" THE SECOND SCHEDULE.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, comprising:—

" I. All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, crosses the middle of Peverel Road, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Peverel Road for a distance of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Braunstone Avenue, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Braunstone Avenue for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, from the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester.

" II. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, which is bounded upon the east by the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-west and upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester, from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, crosses the middle of Wyville Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Wyville Road for a distance of 11 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Braunstone Lane West, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Braunstone Lane West for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Braunstone, from the said New Parish of the Holy Apostles, Leicester."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Leicester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of October, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sheffield, Saint George, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union

of the said two Benefices of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and Sheffield, Saint George, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Sheffield and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Sheffield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Sheffield embodies certain modifications thereof:

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and Sheffield, Saint George, are now full the Reverend Joseph Thomas Hoskins being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and the Reverend Bertram Fountain Hinde being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, and of the said Bertram Fountain Hinde (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George with Saint Stephen ', and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Sheffield, Saint George, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Sheffield, Saint George, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith: and if the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, and the then Incumbent of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the

said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, shall have been instituted to Sheffield, Saint George, subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Stephen, Netherthorpe, shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

" 5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the said Measures.

" 6. That upon the union taking effect provision shall be made by the Incumbent of the United Benefice for obtaining the services of not less than two Curates and the endowments of the United Benefice other than the Ground Rents at present forming part of the endowments of the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, shall be charged with a sum of £30 per annum as a fund to meet the expenses of providing for the services of the second of such Curates which said fund of £30 per annum shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice but shall be applicable only to the purposes aforesaid, provided that it shall be lawful for the Bishop of the Diocese if he thinks proper at any time and from time to time to direct that the said charge of £30 per annum shall be paid by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Diocesan Board of Finance of the Diocese as trustees to apply the same for the purpose of paying the stipend of such second Curate.

" 7. That with the consent of the Very Reverend Alfred Charles Eustace Jarvis, now Vicar of the Benefice of Sheffield (Saint Peter and Saint Paul), and as such Vicar the Patron of the Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Philip, and with the consent of the Reverend George Needham, now Incumbent of the said Benefice

of Sheffield, Saint Philip (which consents are testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) upon the union taking effect all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, which lies to the west of the middles of Saint Philip's Road and Upper Saint Philip's Road and to the north and north-east of the middle of Hammond Street shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Philip.

" 8. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately the Patron of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Netherthorpe, Saint Stephen, having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make certain alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Sheffield has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the

purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

WHEREAS by the Burial Act, 1855, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 8th February, 1855, directing the discontinuance of burials in certain places within the City of Canterbury, from the time specified in such Order:

And whereas the said Order in Council of the 8th February, 1855, was varied by Orders in Council of the 26th February, 1897, the 16th February, 1903, the 28th March, 1903, the 25th June, 1903, the 13th April, 1915, the 6th February, 1925, and the 13th June, 1930, so far as it affected burials in Canterbury Cathedral:

And whereas it seems fit to His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that the said Orders in Council be further varied:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that, notwithstanding anything in the said Orders in Council of the 8th February, 1855, 26th February, 1897, 16th February, 1903, 28th March, 1903, 25th June, 1903, 13th April, 1915, 6th February, 1925, and 13th June, 1930, in the Cloisters of the said Cathedral, the burial may be allowed of the body of the late Reverend Canon Hugh Richard Lawrie Sheppard, subject to the condition that the coffin will be wholly and permanently embedded in and covered with a layer, or layers, of good cement concrete not less in any part than six inches in thickness.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 4th day of January next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within the Parishes affected by such Representation one month before the said 4th day of January.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Percy Mark, Lord Bishop of Blackburn, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:—

"I, the Right Reverend Percy Mark by Divine Permission Lord Bishop of Blackburn, do hereby represent to Your Grace in pursuance of a certain Act of Parliament made and passed in the Session of Parliament held in the first and second years of the Reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled 'An Act to abridge the holding of Benefices in Plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the Clergy' and of a certain other Act of Parliament made and passed in the Session of Parliament held in the second and third years of the Reign of Her said late Majesty intituled 'An Act to make better provision for the assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches and Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne and for other purposes'.

"That belonging to the Vicarage and Parish Church of Saint Mary, Penwortham in the County of Lancaster and my Diocese of Blackburn is the District of Longton, which is distant from the Parish Church of Saint Mary Penwortham aforesaid four miles or thereabouts, the boundaries of which are well known and defined, but for better identification thereof are more particularly delineated on the plan attached hereto, the boundaries of the Parish of Saint Mary, Penwortham where they touch the District of Longton being indicated

by a red verge line and the boundaries of the District of Longton being indicated by a yellow verge line thereon.

"That the said District of Longton contains a population of two thousand nine hundred and six (2,906) persons and that the said Parish of Saint Mary, Penwortham contains a population of five thousand and twenty-six (5,026) persons, excluding the said District of Longton.

"That within the said District of Longton is the Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton, which existed in the year 1517 and was erected into a Perpetual Curacy through the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in 1719 under the provisions of the Act of the first year of the Reign of George the First chapter ten but still belongs to and forms part of the Ecclesiastical Parish of Saint Mary, Penwortham aforesaid.

"That the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Penwortham aforesaid affords accommodation for six hundred and fifty persons and that the Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton affords accommodation for five hundred and eight persons.

"That the said Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton is conveniently placed in or near the centre of the separate parish or benefice which is hereinafter proposed.

"That the present Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton was built and consecrated, together with additional land as and for an additional churchyard or burial ground on the sixteenth day of December, 1887, and was substituted on the twenty-third day of February, 1888, for the then Chapel as a Chapel of Ease of what was then regarded as the Parochial Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Longton.

"That the inhabitants of the District of Longton are now liable for all rates, charges and impositions made for or in respect of the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Penwortham, and are entitled with the rest of the inhabitants of the Parish of Saint Mary Penwortham to accommodation in the Parish Church.

"That the Patronage of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Saint Mary, Penwortham aforesaid and of the said Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton, belongs to Robert Gwilym Rawstorne of St. Petroc, Cowleigh Bank, Malvern, in the County of Worcester, Esquire, his heirs and assigns and that the Reverend Oliver Burton is now Vicar of the Vicarage and Parish Church of Saint Mary, Penwortham, and the Reverend Richard John Garton is now Perpetual Curate of the Perpetual Curacy or Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton, all of whom have respectively given their consents in writing to this Representation and Scheme.

"That the annual value of the Vicarage or Benefice of Saint Mary, Penwortham, is five hundred and twenty-five pounds (£525) or thereabouts and the annual value or endowments belonging to the said Chapel or Perpetual Curacy of Saint Andrew, Longton, is four hundred and seventy-eight pounds (£478) or thereabouts.

"That it appears to me that the said District of Longton may under the said Act of Parliament be advantageously separated from the

said Parish of Saint Mary, Penwortham, and be constituted a separate Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the first-named Act of Parliament, I, the said Lord Bishop, have drawn up a Scheme in writing appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alterations above proposed may be best effected, and how the changes consequent on such alterations in regard to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect of the Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties concerned."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"SCHEME for carrying the foregoing Representation into effect.

"I propose to Your Grace the following Scheme, that is to say:—

"1. That the District of Longton shall be separated from the Parish of Saint Mary, Penwortham, to which it now belongs and be constituted a separate Parish, Perpetual Curacy and Benefice for all ecclesiastical purposes, and be styled and called 'The Perpetual Curacy or Vicarage of Saint Andrew, Longton,' and the said Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton shall be the Parish Church thereof.

"2. That the inhabitants of the said District of Longton shall from and after such time as the same shall become a separate Parish, Perpetual Curacy and Benefice contribute (subject to the provisions of the Church Rates Abolition Act 1868) to all rates, charges and assessments to be made for or in respect of the maintenance and repair of the said Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton, aforesaid, and shall (subject to the provisions of the same Act) be exempt from all rates, charges and assessments to be made for or in respect of the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Penwortham aforesaid, and also from the Offices of Churchwardens in the same Parish.

"3. That the Perpetual Curate or Incumbent for the time being of Saint Andrew, Longton, aforesaid when and as soon as the same shall become a separate Parish, Perpetual Curacy and Benefice, and when he shall have been duly admitted thereto, shall thenceforth have the exclusive cure or charge of souls of the inhabitants residing within the said separate Parish or District.

"4. That the house, offices and gardens situate and being within the District of Longton and occupied by the Perpetual Curate thereof with the appurtenances, and also the endowments, tithes, rent charges, oblations and other profits belonging, arising and accruing in respect of the said Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton, and which said rent charges and other profits are of the estimated annual value of four hundred and seventy-eight pounds (£478) or thereabouts shall belong and be attached to the said new separate Parish, Perpetual Curacy and Benefice of Saint Andrew, Longton, for ever, and be held, received and enjoyed by the Incumbent thereof for the time being; according and subject hereto there shall

be no change consequent on the above alterations in respect of endowments, glebe lands, rents, tithes, rent changes, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments either in respect to the Benefice of Saint Mary, Penwortham, or to the said Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton.

" 5. That the inhabitants of the said District of Saint Andrew, Longton, shall not from the time of the same becoming a separate Parish and Benefice be entitled to any accommodation within the Parish Church of Saint Mary, Penwortham, or in the Churchyard attached thereto, but shall be entitled to accommodation within the Church and Churchyard of Saint Andrew, Longton, and that all ecclesiastical jurisdiction and surplice fees for or in respect of the inhabitants of the said new Parish, Perpetual Curacy and Benefice of Saint Andrew, Longton, heretofore belonging to the Vicar of Saint Mary, Penwortham, aforesaid shall henceforth belong to the Perpetual Curate or Incumbent of Saint Andrew, Longton, aforesaid for the time being.

" 6. That from and after the constitution of the said separate Parish and Benefice as aforesaid, two Churchwardens shall be annually chosen in the customary manner and at the time when Churchwardens are usually appointed, and every person so chosen shall be duly admitted, and shall do all things appertaining to the office of Churchwarden as to ecclesiastical matters within the said separate Benefice.

" 7. That from and after the constitution of the said separate Parish or Benefice of Saint Andrew, Longton, Baptisms, Churchings, Banns, Marriages and all other offices contained in the Book of Common Prayer shall and may be performed, published and solemnised within the said Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton, aforesaid.

" 8. That the Patronage or right of Nomination of a Perpetual Curate or Incumbent of the said separate Parish and Perpetual Curacy of Saint Andrew, Longton, shall on the same becoming a separate Parish and Benefice belong to the said Robert Gwilym Rawstorne of St. Petroc, Cowleigh Bank, Malvern, in the County of Worcester, Esquire, his heirs and assigns for ever.

" And I hereby submit the foregoing Representation and Scheme to Your Grace, and, in case you shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied therewith I request that Your Grace will be pleased to certify the same with the consents of the Patrons of the Benefice of Saint Mary, Penwortham, and of the said Chapelry or Chapel of Ease of Saint Andrew, Longton, and with the consent of the Vicar of Saint Mary, Penwortham (such consents being annexed hereto) pursuant to the Acts of Parliament of the first and second Victoria, Chapter 106, and the second and third Victoria, Chapter 4.

" Given under my hand this 22nd day of September, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.

Now We the President and Fellows of the said College in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of Section 7 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 do by this present instrument under our Seal alter and amend Clause 2 of Statute XX of the said College by deleting the word " All " and substituting therefor " £1,550 of the " and by adding at the end of the Clause the following sentence:—

" £300 payable in addition annually from October, 1937, towards the stipend of the Laudian Professor shall not be deducted from the contribution payable by the College for University purposes, but this sum shall be reckoned as a deduction in computing net revenue under any such Statute made for the University as is referred to in Clause 1 hereof ".
