IMPORT DUTIES ACT, 1932, AND FINANCE ACT, 1933.

Whereas it is provided by sub-section (I) of Section 9 of the Import Duties Act, 1932 (22 Geo. 5, ch. 8), that, with a view to obtaining information as to the condition and progress of trades and industries engaged in the manufacture in the United Kingdom of goods of a class or description which, if they were imported into the United Kingdom, would be chargeable with a duty of Customs under Part I of that Act, the Board of Trade may, before the commencement of the year nineteen hundred and thirty-three and any subsequent year, publish in the Gazette notice that they will require returns in relation to that year in accordance with the provisions of the said section:

And whereas it is provided by sub-section (7) of Section 9 and by sub-section (2) of Section 20 of the Finance Act, 1933, that Section 9 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, shall have effect as if references to a duty of Customs chargeable under Part I of that Act included references to a duty of Customs chargeable under Section 9 of the Finance Act, 1933, a duty of Customs chargeable under Section 3 of the Finance Act, 1925, and a duty of Customs chargeable under the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in exercise of the powers conferred on them by Section 9 of the Import Duties Act, 1932, as extended by Sections 9 and 20 of the Finance Act, 1933, hereby give notice that they will require returns in relation to the year 1938 to be delivered to them in accordance with the provisions of the first above-mentioned Section in respect of the manufacture in the United Kingdom of goods of any class or description which, if they were imported into the United Kingdom, would be chargeable with a duty of Customs under any of the enactments following, namely:—

The Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921; The Finance Act, 1925, Section 3; The Import Duties Act, 1932—Part I;

The Finance Act, 1933, Section 9.
