WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 19th day of November, 1937 (N. 7224/37), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under Orders in Council of 9th October, 1919, 11th October, 1921, 30th July, 1923, 15th June, 1928 and 23rd July, 1931, a higher fire control allowance of 3d. a day is payable to a limited number of ratings of the Regulating, Writer, Supply, Officers' Steward, Officers' Cook and Cook Branches and Band ranks, R.M. who are engaged on the more important duties in the fire control system in certain classes of Your Majesty's ships:

"And whereas in view of the developments and complexity of the fire control system it is desired to extend payment of the allowance, under the conditions hitherto in force, to all classes of ships, the number of allowances in each vessel to be regulated by Service requirements at our discretion:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the extension of payment accordingly

sion of payment accordingly.
"The Lords Commissioners of Your
Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Order "), extending certain of the provisions of the Air Navigation Act, 1920, amended as aforesaid, and certain of the provisions of the Air Navigation Act, 1936, adapted and modified as therein provided, to the colonies, protectorates and mandated territories therein mentioned:

And whereas it is expedient to extend the said provisions of the said Acts to the Colony and Protectorate of Aden, and to Basutoland, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, and Swaziland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

r. This Order may be cited as "The Colonial Air Navigation (Application of Acts) (Amendment) Order, 1937", and the principal Order and this Order may be cited together as "The Colonial Air Navigation (Application of Acts)

Orders, 1937".

2. The Second Schedule to the principal Order shall be amended by the insertion at the commencement thereof of the words "Aden (Colony and Protectorate) ", after the word "Barbados" of the words "Basutoland" and "Bechuanaland Protectorate", and after the words "Straits Settlements" of the word "Swaziland".

WHEREAS by Section 29 of the Copyright Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5. c. 46) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the Act (except such parts, if any thereof as may be specified in the Order) shall apply to certain classes of foreign works:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the State of Sarawak has made or has undertaken to make such provision as it appears to His Majesty expedient to require for the pro-tection of works entitled to copyright under

the provisions of Part I of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct and doth hereby direct as follows:

1. The Act shall apply-

(a) to works first published in Sarawak, in like manner as if they were first published within the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which the Act extends;

(b) to literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works, or any class thereof, the authors whereof were at the time of the

making of the work subjects of His Highness the Rajah of Sarawak, in like manner as if the authors were British subjects;

(c) in respect of residence in Sarawak, in like manner as if such residence were resiparts of His Majesty's the dence in dominions to which the Act extends.

2. Where any musical work to which the Act is applied by this Order has been published before the date of this Order but no contrivance by means of which the work may be mechanically performed has before the said date been lawfully made or placed on sale within the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which this Order applies, copyright in such work shall include all rights conferred by the Act with respect to the making of records, perforated rolls and other contrivances by means of which

the work may be mechanically performed.

3. In the application of Sections I (2) (d) and 19 of the Act, to any work to which the Act is applied by this Order, the date of this Order shall be substituted for "the commencement of this Act" and for "the passing of this Act" in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8)

wherever those expressions occur.

- 4. Where any person has, before the date of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful, or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order, have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting and valuable at the said date unless the person who, by virtue of this Order, becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as failing agreement may be determined by arbitration.
- 5. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 6. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Sarawak) Order, 1937.

WHEREAS by Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932 (7 Edw. 7, c. 29) 4 & 5 Geo. 5, c. 18; 9 & 10 Geo. 5, c. 80; 18 & 19 Geo. 5, c. 3; and 22 & 23 Geo. 5, c. 32) it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council apply the said Section to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom in like manner as to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state and that the said Section shall apply only to vessels,

aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which His Majesty, by Order in Council, declares that the laws thereof confer corresponding rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into the foreign state or the territorial waters thereof:

And whereas by Section 91 of the said Acts, it is provided, inter alia, that where it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of any part of His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom has made satisfactory provision for the protection of inventions, designs or trade marks, patented or registered in this country, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to apply the provisions of the said Section to that part of His Majesty's dominions, with such variations or additions, if any, as may be stated in the Order:

And whereas by Section 93 of the said Acts it is provided, *inter alia*, that in the said Acts the expression "His Majesty's dominions outside the United Kingdom" includes any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations is being

exercised by His Majesty:
And whereas the laws of Tanganyika Territory confer rights with respect to the use of inventions in vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of the United Kingdom when coming into Tanganyika Territory or the territorial waters thereof corresponding to those mentioned in Section 48 of the said Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932:

And whereas it is made to appear to His Majesty that the legislature of Tanganyika Territory has made satisfactory provision for the protection of trade marks registered in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him in manner hereinbefore recited and of all other powers in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1. The provisions of Section 48 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, shall apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of Tanganyika Territory in like manner as they would apply to vessels, aircraft and land vehicles of a foreign state with respect to which an Order in Council had been made under subsection (2) of that Section.
- 2. The provisions of Section 91 of the Patents and Designs Acts, 1907 to 1932, so far as relates to trade marks, shall apply to Tanganyika Territory.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Patents and Trade Marks (Tanganyika Territory) Order, 1937.

WHEREAS the Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Lord Bishop of Chester, has, under Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, made

- a Representation to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, Lord Archbishop of York, in the following terms:—
- "I, Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of Chester, beg leave to represent to your Grace in pursuance of the 26th Section of the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria Chapter 106.
- "That the portion of the Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey in the Diocese of Chester which is coloured brown on the accompanying plan and which contains a population of approximately two thousand persons is distant from the Parish Church of Ashton-upon-Mersey and is in closer proximity to the Parish Church of the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey in the said Diocese of Chester and the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said portion coloured brown will be more conveniently and effectually provided for by the Incumbent of the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey aforesaid
- "That the portion of the said Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey which is coloured blue on the said plan and which contains a population of approximately one thousand nine hundred persons is distant from the Parish Church of Ashton-upon-Mersey and is in closer proximity to the Church of the New Parish of St. Alban Broadheath in the said Diocese of Chester and the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said portion coloured blue will be more conveniently and effectually provided for by the Incumbent of the said New Parish of Saint Alban Broadheath.
- That the portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey which was formerly in the New Parish of Saint John Baguley (the last mentioned Parish now being in the Diocese of Manchester) and which was transferred to the said New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey under the provisions of the Wythenshawe Parishes (Transfer) Measure 1933 and is coloured green on the accompanying plan and which portion contains a population of approximately three thousand eight hundred persons is distant from the Parish Church of the New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey aforesaid and is in closer proximity to the Parish Church of the New Parish of St. Paul Sale in the said Diocese of Chester and the spiritual care of the inhabitants of the said portion coloured green will be more conveniently and effectually provided for by the Incumbent of the said New Parish of St. Paul Sale.
- "That the Patronage of the Rectory and Parish Church of Ashton-upon-Mersey aforesaid belongs to Lawrence Chetwynd Atkinson in full right and that the Reverend Percy Holland Lester Clerk M.A. B.D. is now Rector of the said Rectory and Parish Church.
- "That the Patronage of the Vicarage and New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashtonupon-Mersey belongs to Arthur Withnall Prince Leslie Steains Thomas Hopwood Harry Richardson and Edward Lawrence Riley as Trustees and that the Reverend William Dysart Acheson Smyth Clerk M.A. is now Vicar of the said Vicarage and New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey.

"That the Patronage of the Vicarage and New Parish of St. Alban Broadheath is vested in us in right of our See and that the Reverend Frederick Charles Bozman Clerk M.A. is now Vicar of the said Vicarage and New Parish of St. Alban Broadheath.

"That the Patronage of the Vicarage and New Parish of St. Paul Sale is vested in Edwin Forsyth Stockton Thomas Richardson Cyril Eyres Ainley Harry Collings and Geoffrey Gelling Bird as Trustees and that the Reverend Joseph Chapman Clerk M.A. is now Vicar of the said Vicarage and New Parish of St. Paul Sale all of whom together with us have respectively given their consents in writing to this Representation and Scheme.

"That it appears to us that those portions of the said Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey coloured respectively brown and blue on the said plan may under the said Act of Parliament be advantageously separated from the said Parish and united respectively with the said New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey and the said New Parish of St. Alban Broadheath and that that portion of the said New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey coloured green on the said plan may be advantageously separated from the said New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey and be united with the said New Parish of St. Paul Sale.

"And that pursuant to the directions of the said Acts we have drawn up in writing a scheme appended to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to us that the alterations above proposed may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction Glebe Lands Tithes Rent Charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues Rates and Payments and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews may be made with justice to all parties concerned."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"Scheme for carrying the foregoing Representation into effect.
"I propose to your Grace the following

"I propose to your Grace the following Scheme that is to say:

"I. That the portion of the Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey which is coloured brown on the accompanying plan shall be annexed to and united with the New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said portion in the Parish Church of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical Dues Offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said portion coloured brown shall belong to the Incumbent of the New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey.

"That no other change shall be made in respect to glebe lands Tithe Redemption Annuities Compositions in lieu of Tithes Emoluments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes affected by this alteration nor in respect to Patronage.

"That the Inhabitants of the said portion of the Parish of Ashton--upon-Mersey coloured brown shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey in common with the Parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Ashtonupon-Mersey.

"II.—That the portion of the Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey which is coloured blue on the said plan shall be annexed to and united with the New Parish of Saint Alban Broadheath for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said portion coloured blue in the Church of the said New Parish of St. Alban Broadheath and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical Dues Offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said portion coloured blue shall belong to the Incumbent of the said New Parish of Saint Alban Broadheath.

"That no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe Lands Tithe Redemption Annuities Compositions in lieu of Tithes Emoluments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes affected by this alteration nor in respect to Patronage.

"That the Inhabitants of the said portion of the Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey coloured blue shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said New Parish of St. Alban Broadheath in common with the Parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of Ashton-upon-Mersey.

"III.—That the portion of the New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey which was formerly in the New Parish of Saint John Baguley (such last mentioned Parish being now in the Diocese of Manchester) and which was transferred to the said New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey under the provisions of the Wythenshawe Parishes (Transfer) Measure 1933 and is coloured green on the said plan shall be annexed to and be united with the New Parish of St. Paul Sale for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That all Ecclesiastical Offices shall be performed for the Inhabitants of the said portion coloured green in the Church of the said New Parish of St. Paul Sale and that the fees for all such offices and all other such Ecclesiastical Dues Offerings and Emoluments usually payable to the Incumbent of a Benefice as shall arise or become payable within or in respect of the said portion coloured green shall belong to the Incumbent of the said New Parish of St. Paul Sale.

"That no other change shall be made in regard to Glebe Lands or Tithe Redemption Annuities Compositions in lieu of Tithes Emoluments or other annual payments of or belonging to the Benefices of the Parishes affected by this alteration nor in respect to Patronage.

"That the Inhabitants of the said portion of the New Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashtonupon-Mersey coloured green shall be entitled to accommodation in the Church of the said New Parish of St. Paul Sale in common with the Parishioners of that Parish and shall not henceforth be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of the Parish of St. Mary Magdalene Ashton-upon-Mersey.

(3) Cattle may be moved to a licensed market as defined under Article 4 hereof for certification purposes under the Livestock Industry Act, 1937, provided that a licence authorising such movement is first obtained

from the Local Authority."
