Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

Order No. 5558.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1937 (No. 53).

SUBJECT.

Contracts, as from 30th November, 1937, the Huntingdon Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area to the Area as described in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Huntingdon.

The petty sessional division of Norman Cross.

The parishes of Upwood and The Raveleys (*except the former parish of Little Raveley*), Alconbury Weston, Buckworth, Upton and Coppingford, Hamerton, Steeple Gidding, Little Gidding, Great Gidding, and Winwick; and so much of the parish of Ramsey as lies to the west of the following boundary namely:—commencing at Bury Church, thence following the road in a generally northerly direction to Ramsey Station, thence following the High Lode Drain and the River Nene to Bodsey Bridge, thence along the road from Bodsey Bridge to Ponders Bridge.

In the county of the Isle of Ely.

The parish of Stanground North; and so much of the parish of Whittlesey as lies to the west and south of the following boundary namely:—commencing at the point where the road running from St. Marys to Whittlesey crosses the Whittlesey-Ramsey parish boundary, thence along the road to the London and North Eastern Railway line running from March to Peterborough; thence along the railway line in a westerly direction to the Whittlesey parish boundary.

In the county of Lincoln (Parts of Kesteven).

The parishes of Deeping St. James, Market Deeping, West Deeping, Tallington, Uffington, Barholm and Stowe, Langtoft, Baston, and Greatford.

In the county of Northampton.

The parishes of Easton on the Hill, Collyweston, Duddington, King's Cliffe, Nassington, Yarwell, Apethorpe, Woodnewton, Fotheringhay, Cotterstock, Tansor, Warmington, Lutton, Polebrook, Ashton, Hemington, Luddington, and Barnwell (*except the former parish of Barnwell All Saints*); and so much of the parishes of Southwick, Glapthorn, and Oundle as lies to the east of the road running from Woodnewton via Southwick Grange, Southwick Church, Glapthorn, Oundle Workhouse and Oundle Church to Thorpe Waterville.

The county of the Soke of Peterborough, including the city of Peterborough.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1937 (No. 54).

SUBJECT.

(i) Declares the Area described in the Schedule to be a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925, in place of the Areas described in the First Schedule to Order No. 5553 and in the Schedule to Order No. 5557, which shall cease to be separate Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Areas.

(ii) Revokes Orders Nos. 5553 and 5557.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Kent.

The borough of Royal Tunbridge Wells.

The parishes of Edenbridge, Hever, Cowden, Chiddingstone, Penshurst, Leigh, Bidborough, Southborough, Speldhurst, Sevenoaks Weald, Hawkhurst, so much of the parishes of Hildenborough and Tonbridge as lies to the west of the Southern Railway line running from Sevenoaks to Royal Tunbridge Wells, so much of the parishes of Chevening, Sundridge Brasted and Westerham as lies to the south of the road running from Riverhead via Bessels Green, Sundridge, Brasted and Westerham to Limpsfield, and so much of the parishes of Goudhurst and Cranbrook (including the railway line) as lies to the west and south of the Southern Railway line running from Paddock Wood Station to Hawkhurst Station.

In the county of Surrey.

The borough of Reigate.

The petty sessional division of Godstone (*except the parishes of Chelsham and Warlingham*).

The parishes of Burstow, Horley, Charlwood, including its detached part, Newdigate, Leigh, Capel, Ockley, and so much of the parish of Betchworth as lies to the south of the road running from Buckland via Cottage Farm to Box Hill Farm.

In the county of East Sussex.

The county boroughs of Brighton and Eastbourne.

The boroughs of Bexhill, Hove, and Lewes.

The petty sessional divisions of East Grinstead, Haywards Heath, Uckfield, Hove including its detached part, Lewes, Hailsham, Frant, Burwash and Battle (*except the parishes of Westfield and Ore*).

In the county of West Sussex.

The parishes of Old Shoreham, Shoreham-by-Sea, Kingston-by-Sea, Southwick, Rusper, Crawley, and so much of the parish of Lower Beeding as lies to the north of, and including, the road running from Slaugham via Ashfold Crossways, Hammer Pond and the Goldings to Mannings Heath.
