The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Jesus College, Oxford, on the 13th day of November, 1937, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

Amending Statutes for Jesus College, Oxford, made on November 13th, 1937, under the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, at a General Meeting of the Governing Body specially summoned for the purpose and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of those present and voting.

### STATUTE III. THE PRINCIPAL.

#### STATUTE III.

Cl. 4 (b) line 2.—For "attend to" read "superintend".

Cl. 4 (c).—Omit.

Cl. 6.—Omit present Clause and read:—

As from January 1st, 1937 the Principal shall receive annually the sum of £1,400 which shall include the emoluments of any College office held by him, and of this sum £250 shall be an allowance for the purpose of meeting the expenses of entertainment and other expenses of whatever nature incurred by him by reason of his office and in maintaining the position of Principal.

Cl. 8.—For "£1,600" read "£1,700".

Cl. 10.—Omit the present Clause and read:—  
*Retirement at statutory age:—*

Unless the Governing Body shall have re-elected the Principal to the Principalship in the manner prescribed in this Clause, he shall retire from the Principalship upon attaining the age of seventy years provided that if he attain the age of seventy years on any day falling on or between the first day of Michaelmas Full Term and the last day of Trinity Full Term in any one academic year, he shall instead retire on the thirty-first day of July next ensuing.

*Re-election:—*

The Governing Body may, if it thinks fit, re-elect the retiring Principal for such period not exceeding five years as the Governing Body may determine; at the end of such period the Governing Body may, if it thinks fit, re-elect him in the same manner to the Principalship for one further period; provided that he shall in no case retain the Principalship for more than five years from the date on which without re-election he would have retired from the Principalship under the provisions of this Clause.

The Principal shall only be re-elected to the Principalship under the provisions of this Clause by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the members of the Governing Body present and voting by ballot at a meeting at which the Principal shall not be present. Such meeting shall be specially summoned for the purpose with not less than fourteen days' notice by the Vice-Principal (or in his absence by the senior member of the Governing Body in residence) on the requisition of
