AIR NAVIGATION ACTS, 1920 AND 1936.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of 40 days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act, the Draft of an Order in Council entitled "The Aircraft (Wreck and Salvage) Order, 1938."

And notice is hereby further given that, in accordance with the provisions of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, copies of the proposed Draft Order in Council can be obtained by any public Body within 40 days from the date of this Notice, at the Privy Council Office, Whitehall.

Westminster, 9th December, 1937.

This day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons, by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to the Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read;* and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, and several other Lords therein named, do declare and notify the Royal Assent

to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to:—

- Expiring Laws Continuance Act, 1937.
- Supreme Court of Judicature (Amendment) Act, 1937.
- National Health Insurance (Juvenile Contributors and Young Persons) Act, 1937.
- Merchant Shipping (Superannuation Contributions) Act, 1937.
- Rutherglen Burgh Order Confirmation Act, 1937.
- Hamilton Burgh Order Confirmation Act, 1937.
- Clydebank Burgh Order Confirmation Act, 1937.
