MIDDLESEX COUNTY COUNCIL
(SEWERAGE).

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made to Parliament in the present session by the County Council of the Administrative County of Middlesex for an Act under the above name or short title, the title of which is "A Bill to make further provision for the disposal of sewage in the county of Middlesex and parts of adjoining counties; to confer further powers upon the Middlesex County Council and local authorities in the said counties; and for other purposes."
