CITY AND COUNTY OF BRISTOL.

ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 17th November, 1937, the Minister of Transport modified and confirmed the City and County of Bristol Roads (Restriction) Order, 1935, made by the Council of the City and County of Bristol under Section 46 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933. The Order as modified

and confirmed provides (a) that subject to certain exceptions no person shall drive or cause to be driven any heavy locomotive, light locomotive, motor tractor or heavy motor car (as respectively defined in Section 2 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, or in any Regulations made or to be made thereunder) on any of the roads specified in the First Schedule hereto and (b) no person shall drive or cause to be driven any vehicle on any road specified in the First Column of the Second Schedule hereto otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to such road in the Second Column of the said Second Schedule. Provided that when it is impracticable for any vehicle by reason of its size, construction or means of propulsion to turn in Broad Street, such vehicle may, on the direction or with the permission of a police officer in uniform, proceed through St. John's Arch in a north-westerly direction.

From north-west to south-east.

Cheese Lane from its junction with Old Bread Street to its junction with Avon Street.

From south-east to north-west.

From north-west to south-east.
