Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,* the development of land in the areas during the preparation of the scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order and in addition the Town Council of the Borough of Finchley are empowered to permit other development in the areas during this period, with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation. A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid Map.

The Town Council of the Borough of Finchley intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and
