## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AND DOUBLE-DIPPING AREAS.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

Inverness.—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the Islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto and the Island of Barra and the adjacent islets attached to the holdings of Barra), in the County of Inverness.

Montgomeryshire.—An Area comprising:—

So much of the county of Montgomery as lies within the following boundary, namely:---

Commencing at a point where the Llanfyllin-Llangadfan road via Pont Llogel meets the Llangadfan-Mallwyd road near Bron-Afon; thence in a westerly direction along the Llangadfan-Mallwyd road to the Merioneth-Montgomery county boundary near Nant-y-Dugoed; thence in a generally northerly direction along the county boundary until it meets the road from Bwlch-y-Groes via Wauny Gadfa and Y Gadfa to Pont Eunant; thence in an easterly direction along that road to Pont Eunant; thence along the road bordering the southern bank of Lake Vyrnwy as far as the point where the River Vyrnwy leaves the lake; thence following the River Vyrnwy in a southerly direction to Pont Llogel; thence in a south-westerly direction along the road to Llangadfan via Hafod to the point of commencement.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II and "Double Dipping Areas" for the purposes of Part III of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

Cardiganshire.—An Area comprising:—

So much of the county of Cardigan as lies within the following boundary, namely:-

Commencing at Llanilar Railway Station, proceding along the road in a southerly direction via Llanilar, Llanfihangel, Lledrod, Bronant, and Llanbadarn Odwyn, as far as Pont Llanio Railway Station; thence in an easterly and south-easterly direction along the road leading from Pont Llanio Railway Station to Llanddewi Brefi; thence in a south-easterly direction along the road leading from Llanddewi Brefi, via Bryncaregog Farm to a point where the said road crosses the Posgetwr Fawr River: thence in a south-easterly direction along the said river until it meets the Cardigan-Carmarthen County boundary; thence along the County boundary in a south-easterly and north-easterly direction to a point where it meets the Cardigan-Brecon County boundary; thence in a northerly direction along that boundary, and the Cardigan-Radnor County boundary to a point where the last mentioned boundary meets the southern boundary of the Parish of Yspytty-Ystwyth; thence in a north-westerly direction along the southern boundary of the parish of Yspytty-Ystwyth to a point where it meets the River Ystwyth; thence along the river in a westerly and north-westerly direction to the point where the river meets the road from Llanilar via Tyn-berllan to Yspytty-Ystwyth; thence along that road to the railway line running from Llanilar to Trawscoed; thence along the said railway line to the point of commencement.

Ross and Cromarty.—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

The movement of sheep out of the following area is regulated by the North Uist (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934.

An area in the county of Inverness comprising the parish of North Uist and all the Islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the Parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto.
