PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of December, 1937 (N. 7344/37), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Order in Council of 19th May, 1931, sanctioned the amalgamation of the Officers' and Ship's Cook branches of the Royal Navy by the creation of a new Continuous Service Naval Cook branch:

"And whereas the aforesaid Order in Council also provided for the continuance, as requisite, of the existing Non-Continuous Service system for Officers' Cooks:

"And whereas the entry of Continuous Service Cooks in Your Majesty's Fleet is at present insufficient to meet requirements and we consider it expedient to introduce a system of Non-Continuous Service for Ship's Cook ratings similar to that already in force for Officers' Cooks:

"And whereas, in consequence of the alteration in titles of Stewards and Officers' Cooks under Order in Council of 7th February, 1933, it is necessary to make provision with retrospective effect for the counting of man's service in the Non-Continuous Service ratings of Assistant Steward, Officers' Cook 4th class and Assistant Cook (O) towards triennial increments of pay in the respective ratings of Steward, Officers' Cook 3rd class and Cook (O):

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction (a) the entry of Cook ratings for Non-Continuous Service with rates of pay as shown in the attached Schedule and (b) the conditions mentioned in the preceding paragraph for the grant of incremental pay to Non-Continuous Service Stewards and Officers' Cooks.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section six of the Hours of Employment (Conventions) Act, 1936 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted that the Act shall come into force on such day as His Majesty in Council may appoint, and that different days may be appointed for different purposes and different provisions of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Act, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Section three of the Act shall come into force for all purposes on the first day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight, and the remainder of the Act, except sections one and two, subsection (1) of section four and Part I of the Schedule, shall come into force on that day for the purposes of the said section three.

2. The whole of the Act, in so far as it is not already in force, shall come into force for all purposes on the twenty-fifth day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty-eight.

3. This Order may be cited as the Hours of Employment (Conventions) Act (Commencement) Order, 1937.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 25th day of November, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Aymestrey and the Benefice of Leinthall Earles, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Hereford and in the Diocese of Hereford:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Aymestrey

and Leinthall Earles duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Hereford and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Hereford signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Aymestrey is now full the Reverend Gerald Robert Maurice Ellwood being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Leinthall Earles is at present vacant:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Leinthall Earles now belongs to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Aymestrey:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Lisle, Bishop of Hereford, and of the said Gerald Robert Maurice Ellwood (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Aymestrey and the said Benefice of Leinthall Earles shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Aymestrey with Leinthall Earles'.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Aymestrey shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Aymestrey shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Gerald Robert Maurice Ellwood if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Aymestrey shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Aymestrey shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"5. That after the said union has taken effect the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Aymestrey.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Hereford has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Hereford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Supplementary Scheme bearing date the 25th day of November, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Supplementary Scheme under the 11th Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, for making certain alterations in the provisions of the Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 19th day of May, 1931, and published in the London Gazette on the 20th day of the same month (hereinafter called the original Order) for effecting the union of the Benefice of Shoreditch, Saint Michael, and the Benefice of Curtain Road, Saint James, both in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:

"Whereas by the original Order it was provided (*inter alia*) (a) that upon the union taking effect the Incumbent of the United Benefice should be entitled to retain out of the properties revenues and income belonging to the constituent Benefices an annual sum of £600; (b) that two Curates should be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice, one Curate particularly to serve the Mission Church of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch, and to have a stipend of not less than £300 per annum of which the Incumbent of the United Benefice should be liable to provide out of the income

of the United Benefice a sum of £274 in every year; and (c) that out of the net proceeds of the sale of certain properties a capital sum sufficient to raise to £874 per annum the income from the endowments of the United Benefice should be set aside and held and invested by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as an addition to such endowments:

"And whereas by reason of the closing of the said Mission Church of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch, it has been represented to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners and it appears to us desirable that, the stipend of not less than £300 per annum by the original Order assigned to one of the two Curates to be employed to assist the Incumbent of the United Benefice should be reduced to £250 per annum; that the liability of the Incumbent of the United Benefice under the original Order to provide a sum of £274 in every year towards such stipend should be reduced to a sum of £224; and that the capital sum to be set aside out of the net proceeds of the sale of the said properties for the augmentation of the United Benefice should be correspondingly reduced to a capital sum sufficient to raise to £824 per annum the income from the endowments of the United Benefice:

"And whereas by an Order of His former Majesty King Edward the Eighth in Council dated the 3rd day of July, 1936, and published in the London Gazette on the 14th day of the same month, certain alterations were made in the original Order with a view to providing a retiring pension for the Reverend Herbert James Salmon (being then the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Curtain Road, Saint James) but the financial provisions of the last-mentioned Order were of a temporary character to continue only for so long as such retiring pension should remain in force:

"And whereas the said union has taken effect and the Reverend Herbert William Heasman is now Incumbent of the United Benefice:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, and of the said Herbert William Heasman (testified by their signing this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the provisions of Clause 7 of the original Order be altered by the removal of the obligation that one of the Curates of the United Benefice should serve the Mission Church of Saint Agatha, Shoreditch; by the reduction to not less than £250 per annum of the stipend therein assigned to such Curate and, as from the cessation of the retiring pension to the said Herbert James Salmon as hereinbefore mentioned, by the reduction to £224 of the sum which the Incumbent should be required to provide in every year out of the income of the United Benefice towards the remuneration of the same Curate.

"2. That Clause 11 (b) (ii) of the original Order be altered to provide that as from the cessation of the said retiring pension to the said Herbert James Salmon the capital sum to be set aside and held and invested as an addition to the endowments of the United Benefice shall be a sum sufficient to raise to £824 per annum (instead of £874 per annum) the income from the endowments of the United Benefice.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals in relation to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of London has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 14th day of October, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint

Martin, Blackheath, situate within the Parish of Wonersh, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford:

" Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Wonersh, of the Parish of Shalford, and of the Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth), both in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several churches of such Parishes:

" And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Wonersh, of the said Parish of Shalford, and of the said Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth) should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all Ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Martin, Blackheath, situate as aforesaid:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John, Bishop of Guildford, as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Representation), with the consent of the Master and Council of Selwyn College, Cambridge, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Wonersh (in testimony whereof they have affixed their Common or Corporate Seal to this Representation), with the consent of the Right Honourable Douglas McGarel, Viscount Hailsham, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Shalford, and with the consent of the Most Noble Helen Magdalen, Duchess of Northumberland, as the Patron of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth) (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Wonersh, of the said Parish of Shalford, and of the said Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth) which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Martin, Blackheath, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Blackheath and Chilworth.'

" THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

" The Consolidated Chapelry of Blackheath and Chilworth, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Wonersh, of the Parish of Shalford and of the Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth), all in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Guildford, which taken together are bounded upon part of the south by the New Parish of Christ Church, Shamley Green, upon the east by the Parish of Albury, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west and upon the remaining part of the south, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said

Parish of Albury from the said Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth), at the point where the Chilworth Mill Race leaves the stream known as the Tilling Bourne, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the Chilworth Mill Race for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Lockner Lane across such Mill Race, and extending thence westward along the middle of Lockner Lane for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the bridge road leading past the southern side of Chilworth Manor and extending thence first westward and then south-westward along the middle of the said bridge road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Halfpenny Lane and Blacksmith Lane, and extending thence first south-westward and then south-eastward along the middle of Blacksmith Lane for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Chilworth Mill Race, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said Mill Race for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Tilling Bourne, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the middle of the Tilling Bourne [thereby following for a short distance the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth) from the said Parish of Shalford] for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of the London and Reading Line of the Southern Railway and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across East Shalford Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of East Shalford Lane for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Wonersh Common, and extending thence first eastward to and then first eastward and then in various directions along the boundary which divides the said Parish of Shalford from the said Parish of Wonersh for a distance in all of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary reaches the fence forming the western boundary of Brooks Wood, and extending thence first south-westward and then south-eastward along such fence for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of the road leading past the southern side of Brooks Wood, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 6½ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 14 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the civil Parish of Wonersh published in the year 1934 on the scale of 25 inches to one mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation from the close numbered 10 upon the same maps, and extending thence first south-eastward to such fence and then south-eastward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 14 and the close numbered 14a upon the said maps from the said close numbered 10 and the closes numbered 13 and 12 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 17 chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern corner of the said close numbered 14a, and extending

thence first southward to and then south-westward along the middle of the bridge road leading to Wonersh Common for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 28a upon the said maps from the close numbered 23a upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward to and then first south-eastward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 28a and the closes numbered 27, 47 and 184 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 23a and the closes numbered 23, 48, 50a and 183 upon the same maps for a distance of 28½ chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern corner of the said close numbered 184, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line across the said close numbered 183 for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road leading from Wonersh to Blackheath opposite to the middle of the main entrance to the house and premises known as Barnett Hill near its junction with the roadway and footpath leading past Lynes Farm and Derry's Wood, and extending thence first eastward to and then first south-eastward and then in various directions along such roadway and footpath for a distance of 47 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Littleford Lane and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of Littleford Lane for a distance of 52 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Green Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wonersh from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Shamley Green."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Guildford.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94; of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94; and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 25th day of November, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late

Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 3rd day of August, 1897, and published in the London Gazette on the 6th day of the same month a District Chapelry was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint George, Stockport, situate in the Parish of Saint Thomas, Stockport, in the said County and Diocese, and the said District Chapelry was named 'The District Chapelry of Saint George, Stockport':

"And whereas the said District Chapelry of Saint George, Stockport, has under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become a New Parish of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, shall be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Geoffrey Francis, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport, shall be altered so that all that portion of the Parish of Cheadle, in the said County and Diocese, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be disannexed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint George, Stockport.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

STATUTE amending the Statutes of Lincoln College, Oxford, passed by an unanimous vote at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for the purpose on the 24th day of November, 1937:—

Section 2 of Statute XV (Disposal of Revenue) of the Statutes of the College shall be deleted and there shall be substituted therefor the following section:—

"2.—(1) Income to which this section applies may be applied in or towards the payment of any charges for University purposes imposed on the College by any Statute or Statutes made for the University from time to time under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, to the extent to which any such charges are so imposed in respect of such income.

(2) This section applies to income arising from any endowment, benefaction, or trust, and applicable to the maintenance of any fellowship, scholarship, or exhibition within the College, or to any other purpose for the benefit of the College or of the Head or any other member of the College, including any fund for the purchase of advowsons, in every case where the endowment, benefaction, or trust

(a) was created by an instrument which came into operation not less than 60 years before the 24th November, 1937, or

(b) is included among the endowments, benefactions, or trusts specified in the Schedule appended to this section, the trustees or governing bodies whereof have consented to the provisions of this section.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE EXECUTIVE GROUP OF SITUATIONS, THAT IS TO SAY, FOR THE GENERAL EXECUTIVE CLASS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE, FOR EXECUTIVE BRANCHES OF THE DEFENCE DEPARTMENTS, AND FOR THE SITUATIONS OF ASSISTANT AUDITOR IN THE EXCHEQUER AND AUDIT DEPARTMENT, ASSISTANT EXAMINER IN THE ESTATE DUTY OFFICE OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, ACTUARIAL ASSISTANT IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT ACTUARY, AUDIT ASSISTANT IN THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH, AND ASSISTANT INSPECTOR ON THE OUTDOOR STAFF OF THE INSURANCE DEPARTMENT OF THE MINISTRY OF HEALTH, THE WELSH BOARD OF HEALTH AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR SCOTLAND.
