Parish of Albury from the said Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth), at the point where the Chilworth Mill Race leaves the stream known as the Tilling Bourne, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the Chilworth Mill Race for a distance of 35 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Lockner Lane across such Mill Race, and extending thence westward along the middle of Lockner Lane for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the bridle road leading past the southern side of Chilworth Manor and extending thence first westward and then southwestward along the middle of the said bridle road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Halfpenny Lane and Blacksmith Lane, and extending thence first southwestward and then south-eastward along the middle of Blacksmith Lane for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the Chilworth Mill Race, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said Mill Race for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Tilling Bourne, and extending thence first south-westward and then in various directions along the middle of the Tilling Bourne [thereby following for a short distance the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Martha (otherwise Chilworth) from the said Parish of Shalford] for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of the London and Reading Line of the Southern Railway and extending thence first southward to and then westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across East Shalford Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of East Shalford Lane for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of Wonersh Common, and extending thence first eastward to and then first eastward and then in various directions along the boundary which divides the said Parish of Shalford from the said Parish of Wonersh for a distance in all of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point where such boundary reaches the fence forming the western boundary of Brooks Wood, and extending thence first south-westward and then south-eastward along such fence for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the northern side of the road leading past the southern side of Brooks Wood, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then northeastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 61 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 14 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the civil Parish of Wonersh published in the year 1934 on the scale of 25 inches to one mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Repre-sentation from the close numbered 10 upon the same maps, and extending thence first southeastward to such fence and then south-eastward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 14 and the close numbered 14a upon the said maps from the said close numbered 10 and the closes numbered 13 and 12 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 17 chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern corner of the said close numbered 14a, and extending

thence first southward to and then southwestward along the middle of the bridle road leading to Wonersh Common for a distance of 8 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the fence which divides the close numbered 28a upon the said maps from the close numbered 23a upon the same maps, and extending thence first southward to and then first south-eastward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 28a and the closes numbered 27, 47 and 184 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 23a and the closes numbered 23, 48, 50a and 183 upon the same maps for a distance of 281 chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern corner of the said close numbered 184, and extending thence south-westward in a straight line across the said close numbered 183 for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the road leading from Wonersh to Blackheath opposite to the middle of the main entrance to the house and premises known as Barnett Hill near its junction with the roadway and footpath leading past Lynes Farm and Derry's Wood, and extending thence first eastward to and then first south-eastward and then in various directions along such roadway and footpath for a distance of 47 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Littleford Lane and extending thence first south-eastward and then southward along the middle of Littleford Lane for a distance of 52 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Green Lane upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Wonersh from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Shamley Green."

And whereas the said Representation has

been approved by His Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Guildford.
