the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Certain subjects are omitted from the scheme for the Foreign Office and Diplomatic Service because they may not be taken by candidates for that Service.

    7. Candidates must take up subject 9 European History, Period 3, subject 68 French Language, subject 71 German Language, and must reach a high standard of qualification in subject 68. They must also take either subject 27 General Economics or subject 3 Elementary Economics, but they may not take both.
    8. In Section B a candidate who wishes to offer subjects the aggregate value of which exceeds I, 300 marks (or I, 350 marks if Russian Language be selected) must name a subject to be valued on a reduced maximum in order to bring the aggregate to 1,300 (or $x, 350$ ). This option cannot be exercised by a candidate who can make the reduction by omitting one or more of the subjects he proposes to offer.
