WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 15th day of December, 1937 (C.W. 11257/37), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force, to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Section 3 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that Officers of the Reserve shall be entitled to receive such pay and allowances as we, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, may from time to time appoint:

"And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a Force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that any Volunteer enrolling under this Act, when serving for training afloat or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas by Section X to Schedule V of Order in Council bearing date 22nd January, 1920, provision was made, *inter alia*, for the institution of a permanent Branch of Dental Surgeons, Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve of the ranks of Surgeon Lieutenant (D), and Surgeon Lieutenant Commander (D), with rates of pay as laid down for the Dental Branch, Royal Navy:

"And whereas we desire to institute the rank of Surgeon Commander (D), Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the institution of the rank of Surgeon Commander (D), Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, as set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

## " SCHEDULE.

"(a) Promotion to Surgeon Commander (D) to be by selection and after 12 years total service in the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

"(b) Full Pay to be at rates laid down from time to time for Surgeon Commander (D), Royal Navy, mobilised service only to count for increase in pay in rank.

"(c) *Retirement.*

"(1) Surgeon Commanders (D), Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve to be retired compulsorily on reaching the age of 55.

"(2) Step in rank to be granted to

"(a) Those Surgeon Lieutenant Commanders (D) who are not promoted to the rank of Surgeon Commander (D), Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, and who retire on reaching the age of 45, provided they

are recommended as a result of continuous satisfactory reports and held the rank of Surgeon Lieutenant Commander (D), on the Active or Retired Lists on 7th October, 1931.

"(b) Those Surgeon Lieutenant Commanders (D) now on the Retired List who held that rank on 7th October, 1931, and are recommended, with effect from the date of institution of the rank of Surgeon Commander (D), Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council of the 21st December, 1920, the 8th December, 1924, and the 16th December, 1925, payment of an allowance of 6d. a day is authorised to the rating required to act as Captain's Writer in certain destroyers, in the larger submarines and in the vessel in which the Commander of the Portland Anti-Submarine Flotilla is carried:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that this allowance should also be payable to the rating employed as Writer to the Commander (D) at the Nore and at Devonport:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to authorise payment at our discretion of an allowance of 6d. a day to the rating employed as Writer to the Commander (D) at the Nore and at Devonport.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of powers vested in Him by virtue of the Air Navigation Acts, 1920 and 1936, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1927, and the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1929, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1932, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1935, the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1936, and the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1937, amending the first mentioned Order, which Order as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order":

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended in the manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on Him by the Air Navigation Acts, 1920 and 1936, and the Colonial Air Navigation (Application of Acts) Order, 1937, and otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Article 10 of the principal Order shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—

(a) In paragraph (2) thereof the following sub-paragraph shall be substituted for sub-paragraph (b):—

"(b) fly over or in the immediate vicinity of any place where a large concourse of the public is assembled in the open air in connection with any event of public interest except with the consent in writing of the Governor and of the organizers if any of the event: provided that this prohibition shall not apply to an aircraft which is being used for police purposes or to an aircraft passing from place to place in the ordinary course of navigation and flying at a reasonable height; or"

(b) In paragraph (8) thereof after the words "In every flying machine" there shall be inserted the words "registered in the Colony and".

2. Article 11 of the principal Order shall be amended as follows, that is to say:—

The words "to be a cause of danger to any person or property on land or water or in the air" shall be substituted for the words "to be a cause of danger to persons in the aircraft or to persons or property on the ground".

3. In paragraph (1) of Article 21 of the principal Order the following two sub-paragraphs shall be substituted for sub-paragraphs (a), (b), and (c):—

“(a) which, being in the neighbourhood of an aerodrome, is liable by reason of its glare to endanger aircraft arriving at or departing from the aerodrome; or

(b) which, by reason of its liability to be mistaken for a light proceeding from an aerial lighthouse or for a light or part of a system of lights prescribed for display at or near an aerodrome or for marking an obstruction to air navigation, is liable to endanger aircraft;”

4. In the third sub-paragraph of paragraph (2) of Article 31 of the principal Order after the word “reward” there shall be inserted the words “do not include references to any person when being carried within the Colony in an aircraft owned by a member of any of His Majesty’s Forces or Civil Service where no payment is made to the owner in respect of such carriage otherwise than by way of an allowance payable under Regulations applicable to him as such member; but”.

5.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) (No. 2) Order, 1937.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1938.

WHEREAS by the Geneva Convention Act, 1911, provision was made for the carrying into effect within His Majesty’s dominions of certain provisions of the Second Geneva Convention:

And whereas by the Geneva Convention Act, 1937, provision has been made to enable effect to be given to Article 28 of the International Convention for the amelioration of the condition of the wounded and sick in armies in the field done at Geneva on the twenty-seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and for purposes connected therewith:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made to enable effect to be given within certain territories in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty to the said provisions of the Second Geneva Convention and to Article 28 of the said International Convention of the twenty-seventh day of July, 1929, and for purposes connected therewith:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise

in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as “The Geneva Conventions, 1906 and 1929 (Mandated Territories), Order in Council, 1937”.

2.—(1) This Order shall apply to the Mandated Territories specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) In this Order—

“Mandated Territory” means any one of the Mandated Territories specified in the Schedule;

“Governor” means the person for the time being administering the Government of the Mandated Territory;

“Attorney-General” means the Principal Law Officer of the Mandated Territory;

“Gazette” means the official Government Gazette of the Mandated Territory.

3.—(1) It shall not be lawful for any person, without the authority of the Governor, to use for the purposes of his trade or business, or for any other purpose whatsoever, in the Mandated Territory—

(a) the heraldic emblem of the red cross on a white ground formed by reversing the Federal colours of Switzerland, or the words “Red Cross” or “Geneva Cross”; or

(b) any design being a colourable imitation of the said emblem or any words so nearly resembling the words “Red Cross” or “Geneva Cross” as to be capable of being understood as referring to the said emblem; or

(c) any design consisting of a white or silver cross on a red ground, none of the limbs of which extends to the margin of the ground, being the cross comprised in the Arms of the Swiss Confederation; or

(d) any design being a colourable imitation of the design mentioned in the last foregoing paragraph.

(2) If any person contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section, he shall, subject as hereafter provided, be guilty of an offence under this Order and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and to forfeit any goods upon or in connection with which the emblem design or words was or were used.

(3) Nothing in this section shall apply to a trade mark registered before the twenty-third day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, and consisting of or containing any such design as is mentioned in paragraph (c) or paragraph (d) of sub-section (1) of this section; and where a person is charged with using such a design for any purpose and it is proved that he used it otherwise than as or as part of a trade mark registered as aforesaid, it shall be a defence for him to prove—

(a) that he lawfully used that design for that purpose before the said twenty-third day of December; or

(b) In a case where he is charged with using the design upon goods, that the design had been applied to the goods before he acquired them by some other person who had manufactured or dealt with the goods in the course of trade, and that that other person lawfully used the design upon similar goods before the said twenty-third day of December.

(4) Where an offence under this Order committed by a body corporate is proved to have been committed with the consent or connivance of any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the body corporate, he, as well as the body corporate, shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

(5) Proceedings under this section shall not be instituted in the Mandated Territory without the consent of the Attorney-General.

4. This Order shall be published in the Gazette and shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor.

WHEREAS by the British Protectorates (Geneva Convention) Order in Council, 1917, provision was made for the carrying into effect within the British Protectorates specified in the Schedule to that Order of certain provisions of the Second Geneva Convention:

And whereas by the Geneva Convention Act, 1937, provision has been made to enable effect to be given to Article 28 of the International Convention for the amelioration of the condition of the wounded and sick in armies in the field done at Geneva on the twenty-seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and for purposes connected therewith:

And whereas by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction in the British Protectorates specified in the Schedule to this Order (hereinafter referred to as the "Scheduled Protectorates"):

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made to enable effect to be given within the Scheduled Protectorates to Article 28 of the said International Convention:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The British Protectorates (Geneva Convention) Order in Council, 1937," and this Order and the British Protectorates (Geneva Convention) Order in Council, 1917, may be cited together as "The British Protectorates (Geneva Conventions) Orders in Council, 1917 and 1937."

2.—(1) This Order shall apply to the Protectorates specified in the Schedule hereto.

(2) In this Order—

"Protectorate" means any Scheduled Protectorate;

"Governor" means the person for the time being administering the Government of the Protectorate, or in the case of Zanzibar the British Resident or the person lawfully discharging his functions;

"Attorney General" means the Principal Law Officer of the Protectorate, and, if there shall be no such Law Officer in or for any Scheduled Protectorate, then the Principal Executive Officer next to the Governor of such Protectorate;

"Gazette" means the official Government Gazette of the Protectorate.

3.—(1) It shall not be lawful for any person, without the authority of the Governor, to use for the purposes of his trade or business, or for any other purpose whatsoever, in the Protectorate—

(a) any design consisting of a white or silver cross on a red ground, none of the limbs of which extends to the margin of the ground, being the cross comprised in the Arms of the Swiss Confederation; or

(b) any design being a colourable imitation of the design mentioned in the last foregoing paragraph; or

(c) any design being a colourable imitation of the heraldic emblem of the red cross on a white ground mentioned in sub-section (1) of section 3 of the British Protectorates (Geneva Convention) Order in Council, 1917, or any words so nearly resembling the words "Red Cross" or "Geneva Cross" as to be capable of being understood as referring to the said emblem.

(2) If any person contravenes the provisions of sub-section (1) of this section, he shall, subject as hereafter provided, be guilty of an offence under this Order and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding ten pounds and to forfeit any goods upon or in connection with which the design or words was or were used.

(3) Nothing in this section shall apply to a trade mark registered before the twenty-third day of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-one, and consisting of or containing any such design as is mentioned in paragraph (a) or paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of this section; and where a person is charged with using such a design for any purpose and it is proved that he used it otherwise than as or as part of a trade mark registered as aforesaid, it shall be a defence for him to prove—

(a) that he lawfully used that design for that purpose before the said twenty-third day of December; or

(b) in a case where he is charged with using the design upon goods, that the design had been applied to the goods before he acquired them by some other person who had manufactured or dealt with the goods in the course of trade, and that that other person lawfully used the design upon similar goods before the said twenty-third day of December.

(4) Where an offence under this Order committed by a body corporate is proved to have been committed with the consent or connivance

of any director, manager, secretary or other officer of the body corporate, he, as well as the body corporate, shall be deemed to be guilty of the offence and shall be liable to be proceeded against and punished accordingly.

(5) Proceedings under this section shall not be instituted in the Protectorate without the consent of the Attorney-General.

4. This Order shall be published in the Gazette or, if there shall be no Gazette in or for the Protectorate, then in such manner as the Governor shall direct, and shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Governor.

WHEREAS by the Geneva Convention Act, 1937, provision has been made to enable effect to be given to Article twenty-eight of the International Convention for the amelioration of the condition of the wounded and sick in armies in the field done at Geneva on the twenty-seventh day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, and for purposes connected therewith:

And whereas by Section 3 of the said Act it is provided that His Majesty may by Order in Council provide that Section 1 of the said Act shall extend, subject to such modifications (if any) as may be specified in the Order, *inter alia* to any Colony:

And whereas it is expedient that Section 1 of the said Act should be extended to the Colonies named in the Schedule to this Order, and that certain modifications should be made with regard to the application of the said Section 1 to such Colonies:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the said Act or otherwise vested in His Majesty, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Geneva Convention Act, 1937 (Colonies) Order in Council, 1937".

2. Subject to the following modifications Section 1 of the Geneva Convention Act, 1937, shall extend to the Colonies named in the Schedule to this Order:—

(1) The powers by the said Section 1 vested in the Board of Trade shall be vested in the Governor in Council, or, if there shall be no Executive Council in the Colony, in the Governor.

(2) Proceedings under the said Section 1 shall not be instituted without the consent of the Principal Law Officer of the Colony, of, if there shall be no such Law Officer, of the Colonial or Chief Secretary.

3. This Order shall come into operation in each Colony on a day to be fixed by the Governor.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Saint John Baptist College, in the University of Oxford, on the 20th day of December, 1937, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

EX PARTE THE PRESIDENT AND FELLOWS OF SAINT JOHN BAPTIST COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

A STATUTE made to amend a Statute framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923

(13 and 14 Geo. 5 Ch. 33) in relation to Saint John Baptist College in the University of Oxford duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose on the first day of December one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven under Section 7 (2) of the said Act by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of the persons present and voting and approved by Congregation of the University on the eleventh day of December one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven in accordance with Section 7 (2) of the said Act and submitted to His Majesty The King in Council.

Whereas by a Statute made by the University on the twenty-fifth day of May one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council the provisions of the University Statute concerning College Contributions for University purposes were amended by altering the basis of contribution in respect of income derived from Trust Funds held for the benefit of a College whether vested in the College or otherwise and in other particulars.

And whereas it is expedient to amend the provisions of the Statute of the College concerning Disposal of Revenue by enabling the College to apply income derived from certain of such Trust Funds in or towards payment of contributions for University purposes imposed on the College in respect of such income.

And whereas the College as trustee or governing body of the trust specified in the First Part of the Schedule to this Statute has consented under its corporate seal and the trustees or governing body of the trust specified in the Second Part of such Schedule have consented in writing to the alteration of such trusts by amendment of the Statute of the College concerning disposal of Revenue in manner herein-after provided.

Now the College in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 and of all other powers enabling it by this Statute passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for the purpose by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting hereby enacts subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council as follows:—

Clause 3 of Statute XX (Disposal of Revenue) of the Statutes of the College shall be deleted and there shall be substituted therefor the following clause:—

“ 3.—(1) Income to which this clause applies may be applied in or towards the payment of any charges for University purposes imposed on the College by any Statute or Statutes made for the University from time to time under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1877 and the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 to the extent to which any such charges are so imposed in respect of such income.

(2) This clause applies to income arising from any endowment, benefaction, or trust, and applicable to the maintenance of any fellowship, scholarship, or exhibition within the College, or to any other purpose for the benefit of the College or of the Head or any other member of the College, including any fund for

the purchase of advowsons, in every case where the endowment, benefaction, or trust

(a) was created by an instrument which came into operation not less than sixty years before the first day of December one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, or

(b) is included among the endowments, benefactions, or trusts specified in the Schedule appended to this clause, the trustees or governing bodies whereof have consented to the provisions of this clause.
