In pursuance of an Act for better preserving the Navigation of the River Mersey (5 and 6 Vict., cap. 110).

We, The Rimrose Brook Drainage and Sewerage Scheme Joint Committee, Town Hall, Bootle, Lancashire, hereby give you notice that we propose to construct at Seaforth in accordance with Plans and Sections deposited at the Ministry of Transport, an outfall sewer of 10 feet internal diameter, having an overall width of 14 feet 6 inches, the top of which will vary from foreshore level at the shoreward end to 13 feet above foreshore level at the seaward end. The line of the outfall will be sited roughly parallel to and about 500 feet north of the centre-line of the Gladstone Graving Dock produced, and will terminate about 475 lineal feet west of the Windscreen to the Gladstone Docks. The outfall will be constructed in mass concrete confined between two lines of steel sheet piling driven through the sand and 4 feet into the underlying clay. At the seaward end, a dished apron 40 feet long by 30 feet wide will be constructed with concrete, and contained within a periphery of steel sheet piling driven as for the sewer.

The work will be carried out after the approval of the Minister of Health to the Scheme and sanction to the raising of a loan for the monies necessary to enable the work to be carried out, have been received, and it is anticipated that the construction will be commenced during the Spring of 1939.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS,
1882 TO 1936.

TICKNALL AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY.

NOTICE is hereby given that application has been made by the Derbyshire and Nottinghamshire Electric Power Company (hereinafter called "the Company") whose principal office is at No. 66 Queen Street in the City of London to the Electricity Commissioners for a Special Order under the Electricity (Supply) Acts 1882 to 1936 for the following amongst other purposes:—

1. To authorise the Company to supply and distribute electricity for all public and private purposes as defined by the above Acts within the parishes of Ticknall Ingleby Calke and Smisby in the Rural District of Repton and the parishes of Derby Hills and Stanton-by-Bridge in the Rural District of Shardlow all in the County of Derby (hereinafter called "the area of supply").

2. To authorise the Company to exercise within the area of supply all the powers usually conferred on distributors of electricity.

3. To prescribe and limit the price to be charged for the supply of electricity and to make provision as to the supply of electricity within the area of supply.
