UNIVERSITY OF LONDON ACT, 1926.

Notice is hereby given that Statutes amending the Statutes of the University of London have been submitted to His Majesty in Council.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1933.

Notice is hereby given that a draft Scheme making provision for the transfer or adjustment of the whole or part of the functions, franchises, property, income, debts, liabilities and expenses of the Urban District Council of Tipton, in the Administrative County of Stafford, and for other purposes, has been submitted to a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

Notice is hereby further given that a copy of the said draft Scheme may be inspected at the Municipal Buildings, Tipton, and that representations with respect thereto may be made to the Committee of Council within one month after the publication of this notice.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

I. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 11th February, 1938, at I o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £30,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of $f_{5,000}$ or $f_{10,000}$. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 14th February, 1938, to Saturday, the 19th February, 1938, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
