FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1938 (No. 29).

SUBJECT.

Extends the Somerset Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area so as to include the area described in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Area added to the Infected Area described in the Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Order of 1938 (No. 8) as extended by the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas) Orders of 1938 (Nos. 13 and 18).

An Area comprising:

In the county of Somerset.

The borough of Taunton.

The petty sessional divisions of Bishops Lydeard and Wellington (except the parishes of Ashbrittle and Stawley).

The parishes of Nether Stowey, Over Stowey, Broomfield, Stringston, Holford, Crowcombe, Fitzhead, Kingston, Cheddon Fitzpaine, West Staplegrove, Norton Fitzwarren, Monkton. Bishops Hull Without, Trull, Pitminster, Corfe, Otterford, Churchstanton, Whitestaunton and Wambrook; so much of the parishes of Enmore and Spaxton as lies to the south-west of and including the road running from Nether Stowey via Halseycross Farm, Radlet Farm, Spaxton Lodge and Pightley to Heathcombe House; so much of the parish of Stoke St. Mary as lies to the west of and including the road running from Corfe via Fullands and Mountlands to Taunton; so much of the parishes of Buckland St. Mary and Coombe St. Nicholas as lies to the south and south-west of and including the road running from Otterford via Lanes Farm, Buckland St. Mary Church, Coombe Beacon, Coombe St. Nicholas Church and Chardleigh Green to Chard; so much of the parish of Chard as lies to the west of and including the Southern Railway line running from Ilminster via Chard Junction to Axminster; so much of the parish of Stogumber as lies to the east and south east of the road running from Stogumber Station via Houndhill and Willett House to Willett; so much of the parish of Milverton as lies to the east of the road running from Wiveliscombe via Manworthy and Spring Grove to Wellington, and so much of the parish of Creech St. Michael as lies to the north of and including the road running from Bathpool via Walford House and Walford Cross Roads to Durston.

In the county of Devon.

The parishes of Chardstock, Yarcombe, Upottery, Clayhidon and Hemyock; and so much of the parishes of Stockland and Membury as lies to the north of the road running from Honiton via Cotleigh Bridge, Stockland Church, Chasehayes, Membury Court, Heath Common and Undercleave Farm to Smallridge.

In the county of Dorset.

Order No. 5640.

(Dated 1st February, 1938.)
FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1938 (No. 30).

SUBJECT.

I. Contracts the Somerset Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, as from the 5th February, 1938, so as to comprise only the area described in the First Schedule.

II. Contracts the Dorset, Wilts, etc., Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Area, as from the 5th February, 1938, so as to comprise only the area described in the Second Schedule.

III. Modifies Article 2 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Areas Restrictions) Order of 1925 so as to provide for the movement on certain conditions of animals out of the Area described in the First Schedule direct to a slaughterhouse in any contiguous Infected Area.

IV. Revokes the Orders described in the Third Schedule.
