

RULES PUBLICATION ACT, 1893.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT,
1924.

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that he proposes after the expiration of at least 40 days from this date in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 10 of the London Traffic Act, 1924, to make the London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (No.) (Rickmansworth) Regulations, 1938, in regard to a scheme of "one-way" traffic working in Bury Lane between High Street (A.404) and Ebury Road, Rickmansworth.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED
AREAS) ORDER OF 1938 (No. 39).

SUBJECT.

Contracts the Somerset Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area, as from the 19th February, 1938, so as to comprise only the area described in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE.

Contracted Infected Area.

An Area comprising:—

In the county of Somerset.

The boroughs of Bridgwater, Glastonbury, Wells, Yeovil and Weston-super-Mare.

The petty sessional divisions of Weston-super-Mare (*except its detached part*), Axbridge, Wells, Somerton, Bridgwater (*except the parish of Over Stowey*), Yeovil (*except the parishes of Queen Camel, Marston Magna, Rimpton, Closworth, East Coker, Hardington Maudeville, East Chinmock, West Coker and Chiselborough*) and Temple Cloud (*except the parishes of Farmborough, Timsbury, and Paulton; and so much of the parish of High Littleton as lies to the east of the railway line running from Radstock to Clutton*).

In the petty sessional division of Long Ashton:—

The parishes of Kingston Seymour, Kenn, Yatton, Nailsea, Brockley, Backwell, Flax Bourton, Barrow Gurney, Dundry and Winford.

In the petty sessional division of Shepton Mallet:—

The parishes of Emborough, Binegar, Ashwick, Croscombe, Shepton Mallet, Pilton, Pylle, East Pennard and West Bradley, including its detached part.

In the petty sessional division of Wincanton:—

The parish of Lovington.

In the petty sessional division of Ilminster:—

The parishes of South Petherton, Shepton Beauchamp, Barrington, Stocklinch, White-lackington, Isle Brewers, Puckington, Ilton, Ilminster Without, including its detached part, Ilminster, Donyatt, Isle Abbots, Curry Mallet, Beer Crocombe, Ashill and Broadway; and so much of the parishes of Buckland St. Mary and Combe St. Nicholas as lies to the north and north-east of the road running from Otterford via Lane's Farm, Buckland St. Mary Church, Combe Beacon, Combe St. Nicholas Church and Chardleigh Green to Chard.
