

" Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Gooderstone is vested for an estate in fee simple in Alexander McNeill, of The Lodge, Gooderstone, in the said County of Norfolk:

" And whereas the said Alexander McNeill is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Gooderstone now vested in him as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Norwich for the time being:

" And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

" And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Gooderstone which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Gooderstone:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Alexander McNeill (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Gooderstone now vested in him, the said Alexander McNeill as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 13th day of January, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' and of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Handsworth, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

" Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Handsworth has been improved under and by virtue of certain leases of coal in and under parts of the glebe lands of the said Benefice which leases are dated respectively the 13th day of September, 1907, the 12th day of November, 1914, the 31st day of December, 1923, the 7th day of May, 1935, and the 1st day of September, 1937, and have been granted under the authority of the said Acts with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners by former Incumbents and by the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Handsworth:

" And whereas the rents royalties and other reservations by the said leases reserved and made payable to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have from time to time as the same have been received by us been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts, and the investments so made include (inter alia) sums of £6,271 8s. 8d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock, £997 10s. 2d. London County £3 per centum per annum Stock, £2,000 Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock and £1,429 4s. 1d. £3 per centum per annum Funding Stock (1959-1969) which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts and Measure with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the
