hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Halstead; and (fourthly) all that portion of the said Parish of Farnborough which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Orpington.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"THE FIRST SCHEDULE.

"The territory to be annexed to the Parish of Chelsfield, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, comprising:—

"I. All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Orpington, of the Parish of Farnborough, and of the Parish of Cudham, all in the said County and Diocese, which taken together are bounded upon the east by the said Parish of Chelsfield and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east, upon the north-west, upon the west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Chelsfield from the said Parish of Orpington crosses the middle of the Main Line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence northwestward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across Sevenoaks Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Sevenoaks Road (thereby following the boundary which divides the said Parish of Orpington from the said Parish of Farnborough) for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading past the northern side of The Green, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Farnborough By Pass Road and Shire Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Shire Lane for a distance of 43 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Farnborough from the Parish of Downe, in the said County and Diocese, and extending thence south-eastward along the last mentioned boundary for a distance of 40 chains or thereabouts to the point on the western side of Cudham Lane where the boundaries of the said Parish of Farnborough, of the said Parish of Downe, and of the said Parish of Cudham, all meet and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of Cudham Lane for a distance of 27 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the

fence which divides the close numbered 50 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Cudham published in the year 1932 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 49 upon the said maps, and extending thence south-eastward to and along such fence for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of Snag Lane, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then northeastward along the middle of Snag Lane for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the fence which divides the close numbered 53 upon the above mentioned maps from the close numbered 48 upon the same maps, and extending thence first south-eastward to such fence and then first eastward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 53 and the closes numbered 54 and 10 upon the said maps from the said close numbered 48 and the closes numbered 47, 16, 15 and 11 upon the same maps for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to the north-eastern corner of the said close numbered 10, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of the bridle road which leads through Little Molloms Wood for a distance of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the fence which divides Little Molloms Wood from the close numbered 14 upon the above mentioned maps, and extending thence eastward along such fence for a distance of 7\frac{3}{4} chains or thereabouts to the point where it diverges northward, and extending thence eastward in a straight line across the said close numbered 14 for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the north-western corner of the close numbered 9 upon the said maps, and extending thence eastward along the fences which divide the said close numbered 9 and the close numbered 14a upon the said maps from the said close numbered 14 for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 14a from the said close numbered 14 reaches the western side of the road leading from Sevenoaks Road to Northstead, and extending thence eastward for a distance of 4 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the said road upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Cudham from the said Parish of Chelsfield.

"II. And also all that portion of the Parish of Shoreham, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the Parish of Lullingstone in the said County and Diocese, upon the west by the said Parish of Chelsfield, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point at the southern side of Wheatsheaf Farmhouse where the boundaries of the said Parish of Shoreham, of the said Parish of Chelsfield, and of the Parish of Halstead, in the said County and Diocese, all meet, and extending thence eastward in a straight line for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Orpington By Pass Road opposite to the south-western end of the footpath which leads north-eastward through Goss Bushes, and extending thence in a straight line due northeast across Goss Bushes for a distance of 15½ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of Chelsfield Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of
