

Right Honourable Gerald Michael Orlando Bridgeman, commonly called Viscount Newport, of Weston Park, in the County of Salop, the Right Honourable Robert Clive Bridgeman, commonly called Viscount Bridgeman, of Leigh Manor, in the said County of Salop, and Roger Orlando Bridgeman, of Governor's House, Dorchester, in the County of Dorset, civil servant (hereinafter called 'the Trustees') are the present trustees of the said deed and the Trustees are therefore the Patrons or persons entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the Trustees are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Manchester for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Guy, now Bishop of Manchester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint James, New Bury, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the parish or district in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint James, New Bury:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Trustees being the persons whose consents as Patrons are required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106 (in testimony of which consent they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint James, New Bury, shall be transferred to the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 27th day of January, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 16th and 17th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 50, and of the Act of the 23rd and 24th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 124, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting an exchange of the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Burton Leonard, situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon, for the Patronage of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Bilton in Ainsty, situate in the said County of York and in the Diocese of York:

Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Burton Leonard is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral and Metropolitan Church of Saint Peter of York (hereinafter referred to as 'the said Dean and Chapter of York'):

"And whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Bilton in Ainsty is vested in the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Ripon (hereinafter referred to as 'the said Dean and Chapter of Ripon'):

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter of York and the said Dean and Chapter of Ripon have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Burton Leonard and Bilton in Ainsty may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of
