And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Superintendent Registrar's district of Caerleon should continue to be entirely situate in the Administrative County of Monmouth and the aforesaid Superintendent Registrar's district of Cardiff should continue to be co-extensive with the County Borough of Cardiff;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Monmouth and County Borough of Cardiff Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1938, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1938.

5. The Registrar of Births and Deaths of the existing Cardiff East sub-district shall be the Registrar of Births and Deaths of that sub-district as extended by this Order.
