The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Wadham College, in the University of Oxford, on the 2nd day of March, 1938, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

WADHAM COLLEGE, OXFORD.

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, 13 & 14 George V. cap. 33, and approved by The King in Council in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-six, in relation to Wadham College in the University of Oxford in the matter of the emolument of the Warden of the College, such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the second day of March, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of those present and voting.

As from the retirement from his office of the present Warden Clause 7 of Statute II shall be deleted and there shall be substituted therefor the following clause:—

"7. The Warden shall be entitled to receive as his yearly stipend out of the corporate revenue of the College such a sum (being in no case, however, less than £1,000) as will together with the income received by him from the benefactions of Lord Wyndham and Dr. Wills amount in the aggregate to £1,350, which shall begin to accrue from the time of the avoidance of the office of his predecessor. In addition to the allowance prescribed in Statute III 1.5. (3), he shall have the use, rent free, of the Warden's present lodgings with the coach-house, stables and the Warden's Garden situate within the ancient precinct of "The Augustine Fryers", and the appurtenances thereto belonging, all rates, taxes and necessary repairs thereto being defrayed by the College. He shall also be entitled to receive as an allowance to meet the expenses of entertainment and all other expenses of whatever nature incurred by him by reason of his tenure of his office, such yearly sum not exceeding £250, as the Warden shall certify in writing to have been required for these purposes."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, Oxford, on the 4th day of March, 1938, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

Ex parte the Master and Fellows of the College of the Great Hall of the University, commonly called University College, in the University of Oxford.

A STATUTE to amend the Statutes made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923 (13 & 14 Geo. 5, ch. 33), for the aforesaid College as thereafter amended in accordance with the said Act, duly enacted at an Extraordinary General Meeting specially summoned for the purpose and holden on the fourth day of March, 1938, and passed by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and ordered for sealing, and now submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council.

Whereas it is expedient to amend the said Statutes in relation to the following matters: in respect of the appointment and duties of a

temporary Vice-Master; in respect of the Fellows, in order to give a proper place in the Statutes to the Radcliffe Medical Fellowship, which it is proposed to establish with the surplus from the Linton Fund, and to regulate the position of the Lady Wallis Budge Fellow in Egyptology; in respect of Officers to remove an obsolete clause concerning the residence of Officers for disciplinary purposes, which are now provided for in other ways; in respect of the Tuition Fund and Scholarships in order to make possible increased grants from the Linton Fund and the Heron Fund to the Scholarship Fund and enable the College to use the surplus of the Linton Fund to the best advantage, and to empower the College to establish Open Exhibitions to be awarded on the same terms as open scholarships and to raise the statutory limit on the total expenditure of the Scholarship Fund; in respect of Pensions, in order to give authority to the Master and Fellows to admit any Research Fellow or other Stipendiary Fellow to the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Universities.

And whereas the Hebdomadal Council of the University on the twenty-first day of February, 1938, resolved that the said Statute in respect of certain parts of it was not an alteration of a Statute affecting the University within the meaning of Section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and that no action should be taken on the part of the University in respect thereof (*Oxford University Gazette*, Vol. LXVIII., No. 2205, page 430).

And whereas the Congregation of the University on the first day of March, 1938, resolved in respect of the remaining parts of the said Statute that the consent of the University be given thereunto in so far as such consent is required by the said section of the said Act (*Oxford University Gazette*, Vol. LXVIII., No. 2206, page 466).

Now, therefore, we, the Master and Fellows of the said College, in virtue of all and every powers enabling us contained in Statute XIII. 1. of our Statutes and Section 7 (2) of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do alter and amend the said Statutes by the following omissions, alterations and additions:—

Statute I. 6, p. 9.

At the end we add "If an election of the Master is being made under this section the person qualified under Statute II. 11 to act as temporary Vice-Master shall act so far as necessary for the purpose of the election as Vice-Master".

Statute II. 11, p. 14, lines 1-3.

We omit the words "the Dean of the College being a Fellow, or in case the Dean be absent or not a Fellow".

Statute III., p. 29.

After Section 28 we add a new clause:

"29. The holder for the time being of the Radcliffe Medical Fellowship established under Statute VIII. 12 from the Linton Fund shall have a place and vote at any College Meeting. He shall receive in respect of his Fellowship such annual stipend of not less than £200 nor more than £500 as the Master and Fellows may allocate to the said Fellow, and unless and until the Master and

Fellows by Resolution at a Stated General Meeting shall decide that the Fellowship shall be held otherwise than as an Official Fellowship, shall enjoy such prescribed allowances as may be assigned to an Official Fellow under clause 32 (a) and (b) of this Statute."

Statute IV. 2, p. 31.

We omit the second paragraph, that is to say, the words:—

"There shall be paid out of the Tuition Fund hereinafter mentioned to every Tutor or Praelector residing in the College and taking part in the work of discipline, a sum not exceeding £50 per annum".

Statute III. 2.A. (Stipendiary Fellowship), p. 15.

We add a new paragraph:

"v. A person holding the Lady Wallis Budge Fellowship in Egyptology, who shall be either a Senior or Junior Research Fellow and shall have duties and rights as defined in Statutes III. 29 (new clause), III. 11 (b) or (c), III. 15, III. 16 (e) or (f), III. 17; except that the Master and Fellows shall after each election or re-election or at any other time determine whether the Fellows shall or shall not be entitled to a place and vote at College Meetings".

Statute III. 12., p. 22.

At the end we add a new paragraph after the words "actual Fellow":

"The Lady Wallis Budge Fellow, if elected as a Junior Research Fellow, shall be admitted without probation and make the Statutory Declaration" (Statt. III. 13.).

Statute III. 22., p. 27.

We add a new paragraph (e) after "prescribed allowances":

"(e) to the Lady Wallis Budge Fellow such annual stipend as the Master and Fellows may allocate to him under the provisions of Statt. III. 29 (new), together with any further allowance and prescribed allowances".

Statute III. 29., p. 29.

We add a new clause after Mynors Fellowship, and re-number clauses 29 and 30 as 31 and 32.

"30. The holder for the time being of the Lady Wallis Budge Fellowship of the foundation of Sir Ernest Alfred Thompson Wallis Budge shall devote himself, under the direction of the College to the study of Egyptology. He shall receive from the income arising out of the Wallis Budge Trust Fund an annual stipend of not more than £350 p.a., but a further allowance at the rate of not more than £150 p.a. may be made to him, if the income of the Fund permits, for travel or for any other purpose approved by the College and directly connected with his course of study. He shall on election be required to fulfil the requirements of Statt. III. 15. in respect of Pensions benefits as determined in Statt. VII. He may be granted leave of absence for such periods as are necessary for the prosecution of his studies in accordance with a resolution made from time to time by the Master and Fellows at any of their College Meetings".

Statute IV. 6., p. 32, line 8.

We omit the words "the sum of £200 per annum" and insert:—"Such sum not exceeding £200 per annum as the Master and Fellows by resolution at a Stated General Meeting may determine".

Statute V. 1., p. 33.

At the end we add:—"Provided that either in addition to or in substitution for such Scholarships the Master and Fellows may by resolution at a Stated General Meeting establish not more than 12 Minor Scholarships or Open Exhibitions of a maximum value not exceeding £70 a year, to be awarded and held under the conditions applicable under pars. 3 to 7 and par. 9 of this Statute to Open Scholarships, and to be provided out of the Scholarship Fund established under par. 8 hereof".

Statute V. 8., p. 37, line 10.

In line 10, after "Linton Fund" we add:—"And such further sum, not exceeding £400 a year, from the Linton Fund as the Master and Fellows may determine".

In line 19 for "£100" we substitute "£150".

Statute V. 8., p. 38, line 24.

For "£2,800" we substitute "£3,500".

Statute VII. 2., p. 54, line 6.

After "Universities" we add: "and may at any time effect such a policy upon the life of any other Stipendiary Fellow".

MINISTRY OF HEALTH.

PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1937.

The Minister of Health hereby gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he will recognise from the date of operation of the Regulations each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat to which it relates or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister; and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat or meat product.

Where the Certificate is in the form of a label, the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or to the package containing the meat or meat product and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat or the container, as the case may be.

The Public Health (Imported Food) Regulations, 1925, and the Public Health (Imported Food) Amendment Regulations, 1933, are revoked from the date of operation of the Public Health (Imported Food) Regulations, 1937, and all notices published in the London Gazette relating to the recognition of Official Certificates for the purposes of the revoked Regulations will cease to have effect on that date.
