“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Saint John, Shidfield, and Swanmore is vested in the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the Parish of Droxford in the said County of Southampton and in the said Diocese of Portsmouth:

“ And whereas the Reverend Canon Leonard Sumner Etheridge, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Droxford, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Saint John, Shidfield, and Swanmore, now vested in him as aforesaid, as such Rector or Incumbent should be transferred to and be vested in the Portsmouth Diocesan Board of Patronage:

“ And whereas the said Portsmouth Diocesan Board of Patronage are willing to accept such transfer and in token of such their willingness have executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary:

“ And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefices of Saint John, Shidfield, and Swanmore, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parishes or Districts in or in respect of which the rights of Patronage or Advowsons so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arise or exist, that is to say, in the New Parishes of Saint John, Shidfield, and Swanmore:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Leonard Sumner Etheridge, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Droxford, acting as such Rector or Incumbent (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Portsmouth Diocesan Board of Patronage (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Saint John, Shidfield, and Swanmore now vested in him, the said Leonard Sumner Etheridge, as such Rector or Incumbent as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him, the said Leonard Sumner Etheridge, and from his successors, Rectors or Incumbents of the Rectory of the said Parish of Droxford, to the said Portsmouth Diocesan Board of Patronage and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Portsmouth Diocesan Board of Patronage.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (Powers) Measure, 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the re-endowment of the Bishopric of Chelmsford:

" Whereas the investments and property which are particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written are now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as the Endowment Fund of the said Bishopric of Chelmsford:

" And whereas no part of the said investments and property is specifically allotted to the provision or maintenance of an episcopal residence for the Diocese of Chelmsford:

" And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that the said investments and property should be transferred to us and that in exchange for such transfer we should pay out of the Common Fund created by the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, a fixed annual income for the said Bishopric as a re-endowment thereof:

" And whereas the Right Honourable Neville Chamberlain, First Lord of Your Majesty's Treasury, acting on behalf of Your Majesty, and the Right Reverend Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, have respectively signified their consents to the exercise in relation to the said Bishopric of Chelmsford of the power conferred upon us by Section 2 of the said Measure:

" And whereas the Chelmsford Diocesan Board of Finance, the Cathedral Commissioners for England and the Cathedral Council of the Cathedral Church of Chelmsford have respectively signified their approval of the submission of the said Scheme to Your Majesty in Council:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the investments and property described in the said Schedule shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, freed and discharged from all or any trusts previously affecting the same to

be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund and that in exchange for such transfer we be authorised to pay out of the said Common Fund a fixed annual sum of £2,978 to the said Henry, Bishop of Chelmsford, and to his successors in the same Bishopric, as a re-endowment of the said Bishopric, such annual sum to be paid by equal quarterly payments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in every year the first of such quarterly payments to be made on such of the said quarterly days as shall happen next after the day of such publication as aforesaid and to be a proportionate part of the said quarterly payment calculated from the date of such publication to the said quarterly day of payment.

" Provided always that, as from the date of such publication as aforesaid none of the trusts and provisions from which the said investments and property are hereby freed and discharged shall attach to the said annual sum of £2,978 save and except the primary trust for the endowment or benefit of the said Bishopric.

" And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure or of any Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England.

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Buxhall and Shelland duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Buxhall is now full the Reverend Henry Copinger-Hill being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Shelland is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the share of the patronage of the United Benefice when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect which upon a fair and just apportionment would be assignable in respect of the interest of the Patron of the said Benefice of Shelland would in our opinion be negligible:

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for the sale of the site of the Church (hereinafter called the old Church) which was formerly the Parish Church of the New Parish of Saint John, Barrow in Furness; in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Carlisle, and of the ground annexed or belonging thereto and for other matters incidental to such sale:

"Whereas by an Instrument dated the 12th day of December, 1935, prepared under the provisions of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70 and of the 19th and 20 years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, a new Church which had lately been built in the said New Parish of Saint John, Barrow in Furness, and which had been consecrated by the name of Saint John the Evangelist was formally substituted for the old Church and thereupon became and is now the Parish Church of the said New Parish of Saint John, Barrow in Furness:

"And whereas the old Church has been demolished under the authority of a Faculty of the Consistory Court of the said Diocese of Carlisle, and it now appears to be desirable that the site of the old Church together with the ground annexed or belonging thereto should be sold:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the Right Reverend Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, and of the Reverend Norman Alfred Lesser, now Incumbent of the Benefice of Saint John, Barrow in Furness (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the site of the old Church and the ground annexed or belonging thereto (not being ground forming part of a Churchyard which has been used for burials) shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects and subject to such conditions as we shall deem expedient: Provided always that such sale or disposal shall be subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said Majesty Chapter 37, of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and of the Act of the 35th and 36th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 14, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council; the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of West Wickham, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury, and partly out of the Parish of Hayes, the Parish of Bromley, and the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Barnabas, Beckenham, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester:—

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of West Wickham, the said Parish of Hayes, the said Parish of Bromley, and the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Beckenham, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of West Wickham, of the said Parish of Hayes, of the said Parish of Bromley, and of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Beckenham, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £200 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £200 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and with the consent of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of West Wickham, of the said Parish of Hayes, of the said Parish of Bromley, and of the said New Parish of Saint Barnabas, Beckenham, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Mary of Nazareth, West Wickham,' and that such District shall become and be and form part of the said Diocese of Canterbury, and shall be included within and form part of the Rural Deanery of Croydon and of the Archdeaconry of Croydon, within such last named Diocese.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE APPOINTMENT OF THIRD CLASS VALUERS IN THE VALUATION OFFICE OF THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT.

N.B.—*Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken by the Department, by public advertisement in the Press or otherwise, to make known the existence of vacancies have been such as to secure all desirable publicity. The advertisement will fix the last day on which applications can be received and the date by which the age limits will be reckoned.

2. Applications will be addressed to the Department on the appropriate form. After the last day for application has been reached, the authorities of the Department will scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to them to be best qualified for the Duties. They will at the same time forward to the Civil Service Commissioners the application forms of the candidates recommended, together with the forms of any candidates not recommended who are employed in a Government Department; and the list of candidates to be interviewed by the Selection Board will then be settled by agreement between the Department and the Civil Service Commissioners, who may, if dissatisfied with the candidates recommended, take such steps in consultation with the Department as they think fit to obtain other candidates.

3. Candidates recommended by the Department and accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will select for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the qualifications most suited to the posts to be filled. The Selection Board will usually comprise representatives of the Civil Service Commission, the Department and a nominee of the Surveyors' Institution.

4. Candidates must have attained the age of 25 and must not have attained the age of 30 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part. Candidates who have served or are serving in the Navy, Army, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

5. Candidates must have passed the Final Examination of the Chartered Surveyors' Institution, or the corresponding examination of the Auctioneers' and Estate Agents' Institute or of the Land Agents' Society or of the Faculty of Surveyors of Scotland, or hold a University Degree (e.g., B.A. (Estate Management) Cambridge, or B.Sc. (Estate Management) London) which gives exemption from the examinations of any one of these bodies. They must have had at least four years' professional experience which may have been obtained in:—

(a) The Office of a F.S.I., F.A.I., F.L.A.S., or member of the Faculty of Surveyors of Scotland in professional practice, or in Government or Municipal Service; or

(b) The Office of any other Surveyor, Estate Agent or Land Agent which in the opinion of the Civil Service Commissioners and the Department gives an adequate experience.

Time which has been spent in study of Agricultural subjects at a University or approved Agricultural College if followed by the obtaining of a Degree or Diploma will be allowed to count up to two years out of the four years.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special

qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

6. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

7. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Department. Appointment will be subject to the condition that the person appointed may be required to serve in any town in Great Britain. Inland Revenue Valuers are not allowed to engage for profit in commercial dealings in land or houses whether directly or through an agent, or to participate in the control of any business dealing with real and leasehold property, or to accept any fee or reward whatsoever for professional or official services.

8. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force will be eligible for consideration unless he produces when called upon to do so the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate Education Authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Any attempt on the part of candidates to enlist support for their applications through Members of Parliament or other influential persons will disqualify them for appointment. The Selection Board will disregard spontaneous recommendations from persons who are not personally acquainted with the candidate's work.

10. Candidates selected for appointment will be required to pay a fee of £5.

Prescribes method of disposal of carcasses of diseased animals and the method of disinfection of kennels, etc., used by such animals.

This Order comes into operation on the 1st April, 1938, and revokes the Rabies Order of 1919 and the Rabies (Amendment) Order of 1919 as from that date.

SHEEP SCAB ORDER OF 1938.

SUBJECT.

I. Requires the notification of cases or suspected cases of sheep scab and prescribes the manner in which notice shall be given. Prescribes the precautions to be taken on premises at which disease exists or is suspected to exist and the treatment of diseased sheep. Provides for the detention, isolation and dipping of sheep suspected of having been exposed to infection and for the cleansing and disinfection of premises on which there has been an affected animal. Prohibits the movement, and the exposure in markets, etc., of diseased or suspected sheep, and prescribes the procedure to be adopted in cases of illegal movement or exposure. Empowers Local Authorities to slaughter ownerless sheep affected, or suspected of being affected, with sheep scab. Provides

for the restriction of movement and the double dipping of sheep on any premises if necessary for preventing the spread of disease.

II. Restricts the movement of sheep out of, and provides for the movement of sheep through, an Area scheduled by the Minister as a Movement Area.

III. Details the Provisions applicable to Areas scheduled as Double Dipping Areas.

IV. Details the General Provisions applicable to Movement Areas and Double Dipping Areas.

V. Empowers Local Authorities to make, subject to confirmation by the Minister, Regulations, as to (I) sheep brought into, or moved within, their districts and (II) the compulsory dipping of sheep within the district.

VI. Empowers Local Authorities to enter premises and examine sheep thereon. Provides for Notice to be given as to Time and Place of dipping of sheep required to be dipped in pursuance of this Order or of Regulations made under the Order and for exemption of dipped sheep from further dipping in certain cases. Empowers Local Authorities to require further dipping of sheep which have not been effectively dipped. Requires the labelling, in a form approved by the Minister, of approved sheep dips and makes provision for the sampling of such dips. Contains general provisions as to the movements of sheep under the Order.

Provides for the cleansing and disinfection of premises at which disease exists or is suspected to exist; of lairs, Pig-Dealers' premises, etc.; and of vehicles, crates, etc., used for the conveyance of swine from markets, etc. Prohibits the movement or exposure in markets, etc., of diseased or suspected swine:

Requires the keeping of Registers by Pig-Dealers, Castrators and Owners of Boars and empowers Local Authorities to make Regulations as to the mode and time of entry of pigs into markets, etc.
