PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Osborne Estate Act, 1914, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council, add to the persons for whose benefit the part of Osborne House mentioned in paragraph (b) of sub-section (4) of section one of the Osborne Estate Act, 1902, is to be used, such other classes of persons as, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be imposed by the Order, He may determine to be qualified on account of their public services to participate in such benefit, and may from time to time by Order in Council revoke or vary any such Order:

And whereas His Majesty, in pursuance of the said Act, was pleased on the twenty-eighth day of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-three, by Order in Council (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") to order that certain classes of persons specified in the principal Order should, subject to the conditions and restrictions therein specified, be eligible to participate in such benefit:

And whereas it is expedient to extend further the classes of persons eligible to participate in such benefit:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

In addition to the persons heretofore eligible to participate in such benefit the following persons shall be eligible, subject to the conditions and restrictions in the principal Order specified, that is to say:---

(a) All male persons serving in an established capacity in the Civil Service of Great Britain.

(b) All male persons serving in an established capacity in the Civil Service of Northern Ireland.

Requires the isolation of horses, asses and mules affected, or suspected of being affected with parasitic mange (defined in the Order as sarcoptic mange and psoroptic mange of horses, asses and mules) and the notification of all cases or suspected cases of disease, prescribes the manner in which such notice shall be given and the precautions to be taken on premises where disease exists or is suspected to exist and provides for the treatment of diseased or suspected animals and of other animals on the place of detention and for the detention and treatment of animals exposed to infection. Specifies the manner in which premises on which there has been a diseased or suspected animal shall be cleansed and disinfected. Prohibits the movement and the exposure in markets, etc., of diseased or suspected animals.

This Order comes into operation on the 1st April, 1938, and revokes the Parasitic Mange Order of 1911 and the Parasitic Mange (Amendment) Order of 1918 as from that date.

(Dated 10th March, 1938.) GLANDERS OR FARCY ORDER OF 1938.

SUBJECT.

Requires the notification of all cases or suspected cases of glanders or farcy and specifies the manner in which such notice shall be given. Prescribes the precautions to be taken on premises at which disease exists or is suspected to exist. Empowers Local Authorities to give public warning of the existence of disease. Provides for the slaughter of diseased animals; for the payment of compensation in respect of animals slaughtered; for the application of the Mallein test to suspected animals and animals exposed to infection; and for the post-mortem examination of the carcases of suspected and slaughtered animals. Prescribes the manner in which Infected Places and articles thereon shall

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be cleansed and disinfected. Prohibits the movement, and the exposure in markets, etc., of diseased or suspected animals and carcases and specifies the manner of disposal of carcases of diseased or suspected animals.

The Order comes into operation on the 1st April, 1938, and revokes the Glanders or Farcy Order of 1929 as from that date.

Order No. 5683.

(Dated 10th March, 1938.) SHEEP POX ORDER OF 1938.

SUBJECT.

Requires the notification of all cases and suspected cases of sheep pox and prescribes the manner in which such notice shall be given. Provides for the imposition of infected area restrictions on certification of a suspected case of sheep pox. Specifies the precautions to be taken on premises at which disease exists or is suspected to exist and the Rules to be observed on an Infected Place. Provides for the slaughter of diseased or suspected sheep and for the payment of compensation in respect of animals slaughtered. Prohibits the movement of animals exposed to infection; and the movement and exposure in markets, etc., of diseased or suspected sheep. Provides for the disinfection of premises and articles used for affected or suspected animals; and for the housing and removal of any sheep if considered necessary to prevent the spread of infection. Prescribes the action to be taken in respect of cases or suspected cases of sheep pox found in markets, railway stations, etc. Contains general provisions as to the movement of sheep and specifies the powers of the Minister to prevent the spread of sheep pox.

This Order comes into operation on the 1st April, 1938, and revokes the Sheep Pox Order of 1895 as from that date.

And whereas the boundaries of the County Boroughs of Eastbourne and Hastings will on the 1st day of April, 1938, by virtue of the provisions of the Eastbourne Extension Act, 1937, and of the Hastings Extension Act, 1937, be altered in such a way that the County Borough of Eastbourne will extend into the Superintendent Registrar's district of Hailsham and the County Borough of Hastings will extend into the Superintendent Registrar's district of Battle;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid Superintendent Registrars' districts of Eastbourne and Hastings should respectively continue to be co-extensive with the County Boroughs of Eastbourne and Hastings;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Eastbourne and Hastings Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1938, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1938.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a Superintendent Registrar's district, and the terms "existing district" and "existing subdistrict" mean respectively a district and a sub-district which existed immediately before the 1st day of April, 1938.

2.—(1) That portion of the existing Hailsham district consisting of parts of the parishes of Eastdean, Friston, Jevington, Westham and Willingdon which will, by virtue of the Eastbourne Extension Act, 1937, be included in the County Borough of Eastbourne shall become a separate district and shall thereupon be united with the existing Eastbourne district.

(2) That portion of the existing Battle district consisting of parts of the parishes of Hollington Rural, Ore, Guestling and Fairlight which will, by virtue of the Hastings Extension Act, 1937, be included in the County Borough of Hastings shall become a separate district and shall thereupon be united with the existing Hastings district.

3.—(1) The area added to the Eastbourne district by Article 2 (1) of this Order shall be added to and form part of the Eastbourne subdistrict and shall cease to be included in the Hailsham South sub-district.

(2) The area added to the Hastings district by Article 2 (2) of this Order shall be added to and form part of the Hastings sub-district and shall cease to be included in the Bexhill and Rye sub-districts.

4. The Superintendent Registrars of the existing Eastbourne and Hastings districts shall respectively be the Superintendent Registrars of those districts as extended by this Order.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a Superintendent Registrar's district, and the terms "existing district" and "existing subdistrict" mean a district or sub-district which existed immediately before the 1st day of April, 1938.

2. (2) That part of the County Borough of Huddersfield now included in the Brighouse sub-district which immediately prior to the operation of the County of York, West Riding Review Order, 1937, formed parts of the parishes of Brighouse and Fixby and is not included in the Lindley Ward of the County Borough of Huddersfield shall be added to and form part of the Huddersfield sub-district.

form part of the Huddersfield sub-district. (3) The parish of Queensbury and Shelf now included in the Halifax North sub-district shall be added to and form part of the Brighouse sub-district.

4. The Superintendent Registrar of the existing Huddersfield district shall be the Superintendent Registrar of that district as extended by Article 2 of this Order.

5. The registrars of the existing Brighouse, Huddersfield and Lockwood sub-districts shall respectively be the registrars of those sub-districts as altered or extended by this Order.

6. The functions under the Registration Acts in relation to that part of the existing Halifax district which is united with the existing Huddersfield district by Article 2 of this Order are hereby transferred to the Council of the County Borough of Huddersfield.

7. The functions under the Registration Acts in relation to that part of the existing Halifax district which is named the Calder district by Article 2 of this Order are hereby transferred to the Council of the Administrative County of York, West Riding.
