WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 17th day of March, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Earham with Bowthorpe and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Colney,

both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Earham with Bowthorpe and Colney duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Norwich embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Earham with Bowthorpe and Colney are at present vacant:

"And whereas a considerable population has grown up in a part of the Parish of Earham remote from the Parish Church and it is in contemplation that steps shall be taken without delay for the constitution of a proposed new District to consist wholly or partly of such part of the said Parish of Earham:

"And whereas there is a Curate Grant of £60 per annum payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, towards the stipend of a Curate to assist the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Earham with Bowthorpe:

" And whereas the Church of Saint Michael, Bowthorpe has for many years been in ruins :

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say :—

" 1. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Earlham with Bowthorpe and the said Benefice of Colney shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Colney with Earlham ' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Humbleyard and that the Parishes of Earlham and Bowthorpe shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided but the Parish of Colney shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That the Church of the Parish of Earlham shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish of Earlham with Bowthorpe and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Earlham shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the same United Parish.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Colney shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Earlham with Bowthorpe shall if the Bishop of Norwich shall then so determine become and be the house of residence for the Minister or Incumbent of the said proposed new District, but if the Bishop of Norwich shall not so determine then such Parsonage House and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held by us for the benefit of the said proposed new District and particularly for and towards the cost of the provision of a house of residence for the Minister or Incumbent of such proposed new District.

" 4. That upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, that is to say, (a) certain capital sums and certain sums of stock now held by the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty for the benefit of the said Benefice of Earlham with Bowthorpe and being or representing the produce of the redemption of certain Tithe Rent Charges formerly belonging to that Benefice, namely, a capital sum of £178 15s., a further capital sum of £425 10s. 8d., a sum of £432 0s. 8d. London Midland and Scottish Railway £5 per cent. per annum Redeemable Preference Stock, and a sum of £349 16s. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock and (b) a part now producing £170 per annum of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by the said

Governors to the said Benefices of Earlham with Bowthorpe and Colney pursuant to the provisions of Part II paragraph 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and paragraph 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said Benefices of Earlham with Bowthorpe and Colney and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by the said Governors for the endowment of the said proposed new District provided always that pending the formation of such new District and if the Bishop of Norwich shall so direct the income in respect of the endowments including any accumulations thereof so held by the said Governors in favour of such new District shall be paid subject to such conditions as they the said Governors shall deem expedient towards the stipend of a Curate serving the area or a part of the area intended to be comprised within such new District.

" 5. That upon the union taking effect the Grant of £60 per annum at present payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Earlham with Bowthorpe towards the stipend of a Curate, shall be transferred to the proposed new District and shall become and be payable to the Minister or Incumbent thereof towards the stipend of an assistant Curate for the proposed new District, subject to the regulations and conditions from time to time in force in relation to such grants by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners.

" 6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Colney having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Earlham with Bowthorpe having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures :

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners :

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council, dated the 21st day of March, 1929, and published in the London Gazette on the 26th day of the same month, provision was made for the union of the Benefices of Ely, Holy Trinity and Ely, Saint Mary, in the said County and Diocese, but it was directed that the Parishes of the said Benefices should continue distinct in all respects:

"And whereas the union of the said Benefices of Ely, Holy Trinity, and Ely, Saint Mary, has since taken effect:

"And whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bernard, Bishop of Ely, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the Parishes of the said United Benefice of Ely, Holy Trinity with Saint Mary, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Ely and therein recommended such union and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Ely signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said United Benefice of Ely, Holy Trinity with Saint Mary is now full, the Reverend Maurice Hinton Knowles being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas by an Indenture made the 12th day of September, in the eighth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of the Holy and Undivided Trinity at Ely granted to the Parishioners of the Parish of Ely, Holy Trinity, the use of the Chapel called the Lady Chapel of the said Cathedral Church, for the purposes of the Parish Church of the said Parish of Ely, Holy Trinity:

"And whereas upon the taking effect of the union of Parishes which is hereinafter recommended and proposed the said Lady Chapel will no longer be a Parish Church and the purpose for which such user was granted as aforesaid will cease and determine:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Bernard, Bishop of Ely, and of the said Maurice Hinton Knowles (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council, affirming this Scheme, the said Parish of Ely, Holy Trinity, and the said Parish of Ely, Saint Mary, shall be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Ely, Saint Mary, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Ely, Saint Mary, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Ely, Holy Trinity, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Ely, Holy Trinity, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Parishes therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ely.

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Nettleton is vested for an estate

in fee simple without incumbrances in Emily Geraldine Woodman, of Number 30, Sloane Gardens, Sloane Square, London, Spinster:

"And whereas the said Emily Geraldine Woodman is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Nettleton now vested in her as aforesaid, should be transferred to and be vested in the Archdeacon of Swindon for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Ronald Erskine Ramsay, Bishop Suffragan of Malmesbury, is now Archdeacon of Swindon, and as such Archdeacon he is willing to accept such transfer, and in token thereof has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, has to the same transfer given that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary and in token of the same consent has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Nettleton which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Nettleton:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Emily Geraldine Woodman and Ronald Erskine Ramsay (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Nettleton now vested in her, the said Emily Geraldine Woodman as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Ronald Erskine Ramsay as Archdeacon of Swindon and to his successors in the same Archdeaconry, and shall thereupon any thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Ronald Erskine Ramsay, as Archdeacon of Swindon, and by his successors in the same Archdeaconry for ever:

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, and of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 26, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising certain improvements at the Episcopal House of Residence belonging to the See of Exeter which is known as The Palace, Exeter:

"Whereas the Right Reverend Charles, now Bishop of Exeter, is desirous that certain improvements should be made at the said Episcopal House of Residence and has submitted to us the particulars of such improvements and we have specified our general approval of the same:

"And whereas the said Bishop is also desirous and it appears to us to be expedient that towards the cost of effecting the aforesaid improvements a sum of £400 (being a sum which together with the outstanding balance of the sum already borrowed upon the same security under the authority of the statutes hereinbefore mentioned, does not exceed two years' income of the See) should be provided by his borrowing the same by way of mortgage upon the security of all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to the Bishopric of Exeter:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Charles, Bishop of Exeter (testified by his having affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal to this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the said Bishop be authorised to borrow from us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of the above mentioned Acts any sum not exceeding £400 and that as a security for the same and interest thereon the said Bishop do mortgage all and every part of the lands tenements and hereditaments and endowments or emoluments which now belong or may hereafter belong to

his said See to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners by deed for a term of 12 years or until the said sum of £400 with interest for the same as hereinafter mentioned, and all costs and charges which may attend the recovery thereof, shall be fully paid and satisfied and that such principal sum shall be repaid with interest at the rate of £4 per centum per annum in twenty equal half-yearly instalments to include principal and interest in the manner following, that is to say, the said Bishop or his successors shall at the end of the first period of 6 months of the said term computed from the 24th day of June 1938 and at the end of every such like period of 6 months thereafter, pay to us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, our successors or assigns one such instalment to include principal and interest until the whole thereof shall be repaid and that such mortgage deed shall be in the form and to the effect to be approved by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and shall bind as well the said Charles, now Bishop of Exeter, as every succeeding Bishop of the same Diocese, until the principal money and interest costs and charges shall have been paid off and discharged.

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole or any part or parts of the said sum of £400 so to be borrowed as aforesaid shall be applied by us at such time or times and in such manner as shall appear to us to be expedient towards effecting the said proposed improvements at the Episcopal Residence aforesaid.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the herein named Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures, to inquire and report (*inter alia*) as to the desirability of some re-arrangement by way of union or alteration of boundaries of the said Benefices of Layston with Buntingford; Wyddial; and Aspenden; duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Albans and therein recommended certain alterations of the boundaries of the Parishes of those Benefices and the said Bishop of Saint Albans signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the Bishop of Saint Albans contains certain modifications thereof, including provision for altering the boundaries of the said Parish of Great Hormead:

"And whereas all of the said Benefices are now full the Reverend John William Macartney being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Layston with Buntingford, the Reverend William McClelland Kerr being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Wyddial, the Reverend Arthur James Culwick being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Aspenden, and the Reverend William James Crofton Griffiths being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Great Hormead with Little Hormead:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Michael, Bishop of Saint Albans, John William Macartney, William McClelland Kerr, Arthur James Culwick and William James Crofton Griffiths (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) and with the consent also of The Master, Fellows and Scholars of the College of Saint John the Evangelist in the University of Cambridge, being the Patrons of the said United Benefice of Great Hormead with Little Hormead (which consent is testified by their having caused their Common or Corporate Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme:—

"(a) All that detached part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Layston with Buntingford which lies between the Parish of the said Benefice of Aspenden and the Parish of the Benefice of Westmill, in the said County and Diocese, shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Aspenden.

REGULATIONS FOR THE COMPETITIVE SELECTION OF MALE NAUTICAL SURVEYORS IN THE BOARD OF TRADE.

N.B.—Competitions under these Regulations do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held as occasion arises. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 28 and must not have attained the age of 42 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject, but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for appointment.

No person actually serving in the Navy, Army or Air Force, will be eligible for consideration unless he produces, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to apply for appointment, dated before his appearance before the Selection Board, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

The Board of Trade will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which they desire to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Application on the appropriate form shall be addressed in the first instance to the Assistant Secretary, Mercantile Marine Department, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1. The Board of Trade will examine the candidates' credentials and submit to the Civil Service Commissioners the names of those candidates who appear to have the requisite qualifications and to be best fitted for appointment. The Civil Service Commissioners, if dissatisfied with the number or quality of candidates for any vacancy, may require further search to be made for qualified candidates. The Civil Service Commissioners may, if they think fit, assist in the scrutiny of the application forms of the candidates.

7. Candidates who are recommended by the Board of Trade and are accepted by the Civil Service Commissioners as possessing the requisite qualifications will be summoned to an interview before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, and their decision will be final. The Selection Board will be constituted by the Board of Trade in consultation with the Civil Service Commissioners. It will consist of representatives of the Board of Trade and the Civil Service Commissioners and will include two of the senior Nautical Advisers of the Board of Trade. The Selection Board will take into consideration the candidates' professional qualifications, record of experience, recommendations that they may receive from persons named by candidates as having direct knowledge of their work in the past, and the personal qualities of the candidates as shown at the interview. On their estimation of all the above evidence the Selection Board will frame their decisions.

8. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and

until they have passed a prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Board of Trade.

(2) The map defining the area to which the resolution applies has been deposited at the Municipal Buildings, Falmouth, and will be open for inspection by all persons interested without charge between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and between 2.30 and 4.30 p.m. on each week day except Saturday, and on Saturdays between 10 a.m. and 12 noon. (3) Any person who is, or claims to be, an owner of any property in the area and any association representing owners of property within the Borough of Falmouth and any local association representing business or industry may by notice in writing, specifying in the case of an owner the property of which he claims to be the owner, require the Council of the Borough of Falmouth to register without charge his or their name and address for the service of subsequent notices relating to the Scheme.

Under the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1933,* the development of land in the area during the preparation of the Scheme is permitted to the extent specified in the Order, and in addition the Council of the Borough of Falmouth are empowered to permit other development in the area during this period with a view in either case to protecting the development from the risk of removal or alteration without compensation under the scheme when approved and in operation.

A print of the Order has been deposited together with the aforesaid map.

The Council of the Borough of Falmouth intend to proceed as soon as may be with the preparation of a Draft Scheme and any suggestions as to the proposals to be included in the Draft Scheme should be sent in writing to the Town Clerk.
