"And whereas by Section VI to Schedule V of Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, provision is made *inter alia* for the payment of Specialist Allowance to Lieutenants and Captains, Royal Marines, qualified in certain subjects, the allowance to be paid only when holding definite appointments for specialist duties ashore or afloat, and of non-specialist allowance to such officers when performing the duties of a specialist officer where one is allowed by the complement but not borne:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that specialist and non-specialist allowance should also be payable to Lieutenants and Captains, Royal Marines in respects of searchlight duties under similar conditions:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the payment with effect from the 17th day of February, 1938, of Specialist Allowance at 2s. 6d. a day and Non-Specialist Allowance at 1s. a day to Lieutenants and Captains, Royal Marines in respect of searchlight duties, under the general conditions laid down in the aforesaid Order in Council.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 16th day of March, 1938 (N. 1302/38), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas under the Naval Forces Act, 1903, authority is given for men and boys to be entered for combined service in Your Majesty's Navy and in the Royal Fleet Reserve, known as the Special Service system:

"And whereas by Orders in Council of 3rd November, 1927, 8th August, 1932, and 24th July, 1933, rates of pay were laid down for Seamen, Telegraphist and Signal ratings respectively who enter the Royal Navy in a man's

rating under Special Service conditions and Order in Council of 3rd July, 1936, prescribed the rates payable to boys similarly entered:

"And whereas the rates of pay established for Special Service entries above the rating of Ordinary Seaman and its equivalent are 6d. a day less than the rates payable to corresponding ratings entered for Continuous Service and we consider it desirable that this difference should be removed:

"We beg humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the application to such Special Service ratings of the subjoined Continuous Service rates of pay with effect from the 1st of May, 1938:—

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 17th day of March, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Sandgate, and the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Folkestone, both in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:
