LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT, 1933.

Notice is hereby given that a draft Scheme making provision for the transfer or adjustment of the whole or part of the functions, franchises, property, income, debts, liabilities and expenses of the Urban District Council of Slough, in the Administrative County of Buckingham, and for other purposes, has been submitted to a Committee of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 29th April, 1938, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from

Monday, the 2nd May, 1938, to Saturday, the 7th May, 1938, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Theodore George Barker, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:—

On the 20th October, 1937, a roof in a part of the Kustore Colliery, Bihar, from which a pillar of coal was being extracted, began to "weight" and the miners were withdrawn. It was decided to remove the props which supported the roof in order to allow it to "cave" in. There were thirty-four props and at about 10 p.m. when eight had been removed, a mass of roof stone suddenly collapsed, burying two men engaged in the work. The Assistant Manager, Mr. Barker, was informed of the accident, went to the scene, and organised rescue operations. While these operations were in progress a second fall occurred and two men, Bhima and Akal Tanti were trapped. Bhima, who was completely covered by fairly small debris but was nearer the edge of the fall was rescued within half-an-hour by Mr. Barker, working at such risk that the Agent who was also present had to pull him out twice because stone was falling where he was working. Akal Tanti was buried from the hips downwards and was firmly held by a large block of stone, whilst above him was a large mass of stone insecurely supported. Small pieces of stone were falling. Mr. Barker with the co-operation of the Agent and others put in additional props to support the roof and erected a timber cage around Tanti. Barker then, using wedges and a heavy hammer, broke up the large stone which was holding Tanti's feet and continued the work until he was released at about 4 a.m. The actual rescue of the two men took about two and three-quarter hours and Mr. Barker bore the brunt of the work. During the whole of the rescue operations, lasting about four hours, he was exposed to imminent risk of a further collapse of the roof and this actually took place after the two men had been rescued.

It proved impossible to recover the bodies of the men buried in the first fall.

Both the men who were rescued have fully recovered and have no permanent injuries.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE ESTABLISHED SITUATION OF EX-SOLDIER CLERK, GRADE B, IN THE WAR OFFICE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The upper limit of age for these situations is 49, and candidates must be under that age on the first day of the month in which the competition is held.

2. At each Examination the number of candidates to be selected will be such as may from time to time be fixed.

3. In order to be eligible a candidate must on the first day of the month in which the examination is held—

(a) have been discharged from the Regular Army on termination of engagement after not less than 12 years' service with the Colours, or have been invalided out;

(b) have left the Colours not more than two years;

(c) be in possession of at least a 1st Class Certificate of Education and an Army Certificate of Character marked "Exemplary" or "Very Good." Candidates otherwise eligible, in whose cases exemption from obtaining a First Class Certificate of Education was granted with due War Office authority, will be regarded as eligible under this Clause.

4. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

5. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

(b) In the case of natural-born British subjects who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces in the Great War between 4th August, 1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

The consent of the authorities of the War Office is required before a candidate either of whose parents was of other than British nationality at birth can be appointed to that Department.

6. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

7. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

English.

Arithmetic.

Geography.

General Knowledge.

Candidates will be required to obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. Of the vacancies to be filled from any examination a number may be reserved for competition among candidates with Army service in particular Corps, the remainder being open to candidates from all units of the Army. Any additional vacancies which may occur and which it is decided to fill on the result of the examination may be offered to candidates next in order of merit either on the list for the reserved vacancies referred to above or on the general list, as may be required.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of £1 will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that a Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations on the 19th July, 1938.
