MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926. REFERENCE TO THE STANDING COMMITTEE.

In accordance with the provisions of Sub-Section (4) of Section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order-in-Council to require imported goods of certain classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following descriptions of imported goods:—

Solid-headed pins of brass, iron or steel.

Attention is called to the fact that while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time or sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.
