ROAD TRAFFIC ACT, 1930.

ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933.

NOTICE is hereby given that on the 7th April, 1938, the Minister of Transport confirmed the Council of the City of Leicester Roads (Restriction) Order, 1937, made by the Council of the City of Leicester under Section 46 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930, and Section 29 of the Road and Rail Traffic Act, 1933. The Order as confirmed provides that, subject to certain exceptions, no person shall drive any heavy locomotive, light locomotive, motor tractor or heavy motor car (as respectively defined in Section 2 of the Road Traffic Act, 1930 or in any Regulations made or to be made thereunder), any motor-car (as defined as aforesaid) with seats for more than seven persons exclusive of the driver, or any horse-drawn vehicle on that portion of Castle View approximately 21 feet 6 inches in length and 9 feet 4 inches in width and bounded on the south-west and north-east sides respectively by the Turret Gateway and being 170 yards or thereabouts south of the junction of Castle View with Castle Street and 50 yards or thereabouts north-west of the junction of Castle View with the Newarke in the city of Leicester.
