REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE
EXAMINATIONS FOR THE ADMISSION OF BOYS
AND GIRLS TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES
(GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL
SERVICE.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration
from time to time.*

1. AGE.—The limits of age are 16 and 17.
For any examination the governing date on
which candidates must be of the prescribed age
is the 1st March of the year in which the
examination is held. A candidate who attained
the age of 16 on the governing date would be
admitted, but a candidate who attained 17 on
that date would not be admitted.

In reckoning age for competition the follow-
ing allowances will be made, viz.:—

(i) Persons who have served in any estab-
lished civil situation to which they were
admitted with the certificate of the Civil Ser-
vice Commissioners may deduct from their
actual age any time not exceeding two years
which they may have spent in such service.

(ii) Persons employed on the first day of
the examination as Established Clerical
Assistants in the Civil Service may be ad-
mitted to the examination, provided they had
not attained or will not attain the age of 19
by the 1st March of the year in which the
examination is held.

(iii) Persons appointed as Established
Typists or Established Clerk-Typists in the
Civil Service on the result of an Open Com-
petition who were under 17 years of age on
the governing date for age for such Com-
petition may be admitted to the examination,
provided that they have continued to be em-
ployed in the Civil Service up to the first day
of the examination as Established Typists,
Established Clerk-Typists, Established Short-
hand Typists or Established Clerk-Shorthand
Typists, and that they had not attained or
will not attain the age of 19 by the 1st March
of the year in which the examination is held.

2. NATIONALITY.—Every candidate must be
a natural-born British subject, the child of a
person who is or was at the time of death a
British subject.

Provided that if the Civil Service Commis-
sioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate
who is a British subject but does not fulfil all
the requirements of the rule as to nationality
and descent, that the candidate is so closely
connected by ancestry and upbringing with His
Majesty's dominions that an exception may
properly be made to that rule, they may accept
such candidate as eligible provided that this
discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the
father or the paternal grandfather of the candi-
date was a natural-born British subject, and
(b) neither the father nor the paternal grand-
father had acquired any other nationality by
naturalisation or by any other voluntary and
formal act.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character. Female candidates must be unmarried and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.

4. The subjects of examination and the marks they will carry are as follows:—

(1) English	200
(2) Arithmetic	100
(3) Mathematics	200
(4) Science	200
(5) One of the following languages:—French, German, Spanish, Latin, Greek, Welsh, Scottish Gaelic	200
(6) A second language chosen from the list given under head (5)	200
(7) <i>Either</i> History <i>or</i> Geography	200

5. All candidates take subjects 1 and 2; they may also offer any three of the subjects 3 to 7.

Candidates must obtain such an aggregate of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

6. The examination may be held undivided or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those whose performance on the first part is best a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination. If the examination is held in two parts, the second part may be held in fewer centres than the first.

7. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service. Subject to this condition, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

8. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the examination.

9. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 10s. will be required from every applicant for permission to attend an Examination; this fee is not returnable in any circumstances. A further fee of £1 10s., being the balance of the prescribed fee of £2, will be required from every candidate attending such Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations commencing on the 6th September, 1938. The following is a provisional list of the centres at which the examination may be held:—Aberdeen, Belfast, Birmingham, Blackburn, Bristol, Cardiff, Chester, Darlington, Dundee, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Hull, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Londonderry, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Newport (Mon.), Norwich, Nottingham, Plymouth, Portsmouth, Preston, Sheffield, Stoke-on-Trent, Swansea, and Workington.
