"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we are of opinion that Naval ratings employed on plotting duties in Your Majesty's Ships should receive an allowance of 3d. a day:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"And whereas we consider it desirable that Royal Naval and Marine Pensioners who are, or may be, engaged on instructional duties in connection with Merchant Navy Officers' Defence Courses should be re-entered in Your Majesty's Navy under similar conditions of service and with the same rates of pay and allowances as Instructors to the Royal Naval

Volunteer Reserve:
"We beg leave humbly to recommend that
Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the re-entry and remuneration of such Instructors accordingly, with effect from 18th November, 1937.

The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their con-

currence in this proposal.'

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the principal Act and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to revoke and doth hereby revoke the said Order in Council, dated the 10th day of November, 1866.

Additional Rule for the Disposal of Documents which are not considered of sufficient public value to justify their preservation in the Public Record Office.

I, the Right Honourable Sir Wilfrid Greene, Master of the Rolls, in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1877, and the first section of the Public Record Office Act, 1898, do, with the approval of the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the further approval of the Government Actuary, hereby make the rule following:—

The Rules made by the Right Honourable William Baliol, Baron Esher of Esher, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 30th day of June, 1890, and the Rules made by the Right Honourable Robert Alderson, Baron Wright, Master of the Rolls, and approved by Order in Council of the 28th day of May, 1936, shall extend to documents of the Government Actuary's Department.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (61 & 62 Vict. c. 44) (hereinafter referred to as "the said Section"), it is amongst other things enacted as follows:—

- "5.—(I) On and after the commencement of this Act the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.
- (2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall take effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act but Her Majesty may by Order in Council alter either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom."

And whereas by the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1937, certain alterations were made in the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act:

And whereas it is expedient that such last recited Order should be revoked:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the said Scale and Rules should be further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the said Section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- I.—(a) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1938, and shall have effect from the first day of April, 1938, or from the date of its publication in the London Gazette, whichever date shall be the later.
- (b) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of 30 per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.
- 3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of 30 per cent.
- 4. The Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1937, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 7th day of April, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Orlestone and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Ruckinge, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Orlestone and Ruckinge duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said

Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Orlestone and Ruckinge are now full the Reverend Gordon Edward Parr being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Orlestone and the Reverend Horace Hammond being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ruckinge:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Orlestone and Ruckinge now belongs to one and the same Patron:

- "Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—
- "I. That the said Benefice of Orlestone and the said Benefice of Ruckinge shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Orlestone with Ruckinge' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.
- "2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Orlestone only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Arch-

bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Archbishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Ruckinge and the then Incumbent of Orlestone shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Ruckinge only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Orlestone and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Orlestone if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Ruckinge shall have been instituted Ruckinge subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Archbishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Ruckinge before that date and shall not so consent or if the Archbishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Ruckinge following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Orlestone and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Orlestone shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Ruckinge shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Orlestone and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Parishes of Rickinghall Inferior and Rickinghall Superior, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and therein recommended such union and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Parishes based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said United Benefice of Rickinghall Inferior with Rickinghall Superior is now full the Reverend George Vincent Cotton being the present Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Walter Godfrey, Bishop of Saint

Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and of the said George Vincent Cotton (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

- "r. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Parish of Rickinghall Inferior and the said Parish of Rickinghall Superior shall be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.
- "2. That the Church of the Parish of Rickinghall Inferior shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Rickinghall Inferior shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.
- "3. That upon the union taking effect the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Rickinghall Superior shall be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

- "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Drury Lane, Saint John the Evangelist, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Middlesex and in the Diocese of London:
- "Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures, to inquire into and report (inter alia) upon the union of the said two Benefices of Drury Lane, Saint John the Evangelist, and Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of London and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of London signified in writing his approval of the said Report:
- "And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of London embodies certain modifications thereof:
- "And whereas the said Benefice of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, is now full the Reverend William Stuart Macgowan being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Drury Lane, Saint John the Evangelist, is at present vacant:
- "And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Drury Lane, Saint John the Evangelist now belongs to the Right Honourable Walter Ernest Christopher, Baron Northbourne, and the said Walter Ernest Christopher, Baron Northbourne, is consenting (as testified by his signing this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned) to surrender such Patronage in favour of the Patron of the said Benefice of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity:
- "Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, of the said Walter Ernest Christopher, Baron Northbourne, and of the said William Stuart Macgowan (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—
- say:—
 ''I. That the said Benefice of Drury Lane,
 Saint John the Evangelist, and the said
 Benefice of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity,
 shall be permanently united together and form

- one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Kingsway, Holy Trinity with Saint John, Drury Lane,' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Finsbury and Holborn and of the Archdeaconry of London and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.
- "2. That the Church of the Parish of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.
- "3. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said William Stuart Macgowan, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.
- "4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Drury Lane, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Drury Lane, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.
- "5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice
- "6. That if under the provisions of Clause 3 of this Scheme the said William Stuart Macgowan shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice then so long as he shall continue to be Incumbent of the United Benefice and thereafter until the Bishop of the Diocese shall in writing certify to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as hereinafter provided the said William Stuart Macgowan and his successor or successors as the case may be shall employ such clerical or lay assistance in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice as the Bishop may require and towards the remuneration of clergy or lay workers so required to be employed the said William Stuart Macgowan and his successor or successors as the case may be shall so long as this requirement shall continue in force be liable to provide out of the income of the United Benefice such sum as may be necessary not exceeding the sum of £135 in any one year. Provided always that if at any time after the vacation of the United Benefice by the said William Stuart Macgowan the Bishop of the Diocese shall in writing certify to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the employment of clerical or lay assistance as hereinbefore required is no longer necessary, then the requirement contained in this Clause shall cease to have effect.
- '' 7.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church

- of Saint John the Evangelist, Drury Lane, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.
- " (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) a sum equal to onefifth of such net proceeds shall first be appropriated to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923; (2) a sufficient sum shall be appropriated for the payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or for the repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations; (3) a sum, to be determined by the Bishop of London in consultation with us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, shall be appropriated for and towards the cost of the provision of a Church or Church Hall (as may be determined by the Bishop of London) for a new District to be constituted within the Archdeaconry of Middlesex or elsew**here** within the Diocese of London, and to be in the patronage of the Bishop of London; and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection of such Church or Church Hall shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of London.
- " (c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Drury Lane, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of the Holy Trinity, Lincoln's Inn Fields, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of London and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Drury Lane, or such of them as the Bishop of London shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of London for use in such other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of London as the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Drury Lane, as aforesaid.
- "(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint John the Evangelist, Drury Lane, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard

to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of London equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us, if we shall see fit so to do, in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part thereof out of the said Expenses Fund.

"8. That with the consents (testified as of the said Walter Christopher, Baron Northbourne, as Patron of the said Benefice of Drury Lane, Saint John the Evangelist, and of the said Arthur Foley, Bishop of London, as Patron of the said Benefice of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, upon the union taking effect a part of the endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice namely (a) a sum of £4,385 18s. 9d. £4 per cent. per annum Funding Stock (1960-1990) at present held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, on behalf of the said Benefice of Drury Lane, Saint John the Evangelist, and (b) an annual sum of £181 being part of a larger annual stipend at present paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, shall, subject as hereinafter mentioned, be severed or diverted from the said Benefices of Drury Lane, Saint John the Evangelist, and Lincoln's Inn Fields, Holy Trinity, respectively, and shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the augmentation of the new District referred to in Clause 7 of this Scheme. REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS AMONG MEMBERS OF THE MINOR AND MANIPULATIVE GRADES OF THE CIVIL SERVICE FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE CLERICAL CLASSES (GENERAL AND DEPARTMENTAL) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

Competitions under these Regulations are open both to male and female candidates. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

I. Candidates must at the time of the examination be established members of the Minor and Manipulative Grades of the Civil Service within the scope of the National Whitley Council, or members of an unestablished grade corresponding to an established grade the members of which are eligible for admission to the examination; provided that Writing Assistants and Clerical Assistants and members of the typing grades will not be eligible to compete.

2. Candidates must by the first day of the examination either (a) have had not less than three years' full-time service on duties proper to an adult class, or (b) have attained the age of 22 and have had not less than one year's full-time service on duties proper to an adult class. The service in each case must have been

continuous.

3. Candidates must not have attained the age of 30 on the 1st March or the 1st September of the year in which they are examined, according as the examination is held in the first or second half of the year.

4. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

- 5. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.
- 6. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character; female candidates must be unmarried or widows and will be required to resign their appointments on marriage.
- 7. The examination will be in the following subjects:—
 - 1. English.
 - 2. Arithmetic.
 - 3. General Knowledge.
 - 4. One of the following: --

Mathematics; French; German; History; Geography; Economics.

Candidates must obtain such an agregate number of marks in the examination as a whole as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

- 8. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will have regard, so far as vacancies permit, to the previous Departmental experience of the candidates and the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.
- 9. Successful candidates will be subject to a strict probation extending over a period of not less than one year; and failure to pass this probation will involve reversion.
- ro. Application for permission to attend an examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners; the application must be accompanied by a certificate from the authorities of the Department in which the candidate is serving, in the space provided on the application form, that he (or she) satisfies the conditions laid down in clauses I and 2 of these regulations and that his (or her) service has been approved.
