WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Wythburn, in the County of Cumberland, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the Civil Parish of St. John's Castlerigg and Wythburn Township, in the said County of Cumberland, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that, except as hereinafter provided, burials should be discontinued therein as follows, viz. :—

ST. JOHN'S CASTLERIGG AND WYTHBURN TOWNSHIP.—Forthwith and entirely in the Wythburn Churchyard, in the said Parish.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 20th day of June next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 20th day of June.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

2. Operations at unfenced machinery regulations, specifying conditions under which certain operations may be carried out at unfenced machinery under Sections 15 and 16 of the Act.

3. Protection of eyes regulations, applying to certain processes the requirements of Section 49 of the Act as to the provision of goggles or screens.

4. Factory overtime (separation of different parts or sets) regulations, prescribing under Section 73 (8) of the Act, conditions subject to which employment in different parts of a

factory, or the employment of different sets in different processes, may be treated, for the purpose of reckoning overtime, as if it were employment in different factories.

5. Shifts of male young persons (modified conditions) regulations, modifying, in the case of four-shift systems and in the case of certain glass works, the conditions in Section 81 of the Act subject to which male young persons over 16 may be employed in shifts at night in certain continuous processes.

6. Night work of male young persons (medical examinations) regulations, relating to examinations by the Examining Surgeon of male young persons over 16 as to their fitness for employment in shifts at night under Section 81 of the Act.

7. Factories (intervals for women and young persons) regulations, prescribing, under Section 84 of the Act, conditions subject to which the women and young persons employed in a factory need not all be allowed the same intervals for meals or rest.

8. Factories Act (Docks, Building and Engineering Construction, etc.) modification regulations, modifying or adapting (a) the provisions of the Act as to general registers, in their application to docks, wharves, quays and warehouses (Section 105) and to building operations and works of engineering construction (Sections 107 and 108) and (b) the provisions of the Act as to steam boilers and air receivers in their application to building operations and works of engineering construction.

The Mersey Docks and Harbour Board hereby give notice of a proposal by them to carry out an extension, northwardly, of the works in connection with the construction of the new River Entrance Lock into the West Waterloo Dock which they are carrying out under their powers contained in the Mersey Dock Acts Consolidation Act, 1858, with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty as provided for in that Act, and which are referred to in the Notices given to the Acting Conservator on the 25th of February and 7th of October, 1937.

The extension consists of a facing on the riverside of a portion of the existing river wall. The total length of the extension work is approximately five hundred and thirty-five lineal feet, and the projection into the river, measured at right angles to the existing river wall, varies from 15-feet minimum at the North end to 23-feet maximum at the South end. The work is to be of solid construction in concrete or masonry. The objects of the work are to ensure the stability and watertightness of the existing river wall.

It is proposed to commence the work after the expiration of one month from this date.
