TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 27th May, 1938, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1899, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 30th May, 1938, to Saturday, the 4th June, 1938, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that, at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the City of London, on the 3rd day of March and concluded on the 4th day of May, 1938, the following Verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the King's Remembrancer, viz.:—

TRIAL OF THE PYX OF THE LONDON MINT.

VERDICT.

We, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn on the third day of March one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, before the King's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London, have made the assays and trials of His Majesty's silver coins in the Pyx of the Royal Mint in London, which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven to the 31st day of December one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, both days inclusive. We found that there were no gold coins in the said Pyx. We ascertained the number of coins in each packet produced to us, and that such number corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took one coin from each of such packets of silver coins, with four additional coins from one of such packets, making altogether eleven crowns, fifty-one half-crowns, fifty-six florins, forty-five shillings, fifty-nine sixpences, one fourpence, thirty threepences, two twopences and one penny. We then weighed each one pound troy weight (at its standard weight) of the coins so taken out and ascertained that the said coins so bulked were within the remedy as to weight prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We then took for assay one pound troy (at its standard weight) of the coins so weighed comprising two crowns, nine half-crowns, ten florins, seven shillings, nine sixpences, one fourpence, five threepences, two

twopences and one penny, and we ascertained that the amount of variation from the standard weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920 was, for such pound so taken for assay nil on the whole, and that, therefore, such pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was on the whole within the variation from standard weight so allowed. We then assayed separately the coins in the pound troy so taken for assay, comparing them with the standard Trial Plate made of pure silver (as prescribed by the Coinage Act 1920) produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal of the said coins was on the whole within the remedy as to fineness prescribed by the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, and we found that the amount of variation from the standard fineness so prescribed was minus one thousandth (- .001) on the whole of the coins in such pound, and that, therefore, the said pound troy of silver coins weighed and assayed as aforesaid was, on the whole, within the variation from fineness allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920. We weighed in bulk the residue of the coins remaining in the said packets of silver coins and we ascertained that they were on the whole within the remedy as to weight allowed under the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1920, being four hundred and thirty-one thousandths of an ounce (+ .431) above the standard weight prescribed by the said Acts.

TRADE BOARDS.

BAKING TRADE.

THE TRADE BOARDS (BAKING) ORDER, 1938.

SPECIAL ORDER DATED 17TH MAY, 1938, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER SECTIONS 1 AND 2 OF THE TRADE BOARDS ACT, 1918, APPLYING THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 (9 EDW. 7. C. 22) AND 1918 (8 AND 9 GEO. 5. C. 32) TO THE BAKING TRADE.

Whereas the Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister") is empowered under and by virtue of sub-section (2) of Section 1 of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, to make a Special Order applying the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, to any specified trade to which they do not at the time apply if of opinion that no adequate machinery exists for the effective regulation of wages throughout the trade, and that accordingly, having regard to the rates of wages prevailing in the trade or in any part of the trade, it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to that trade:

And whereas the Minister is of opinion that it is expedient that the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, should apply to the trade specified in the Appendix hereto:

Now, therefore, the Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred as aforesaid and of all other powers in that behalf, hereby makes the following Special Order:—

1. The Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, shall apply to the trade specified in the Appendix hereto.

2.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Trade Boards (Baking) Order 1938.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(3) This Order shall come into force on the twentieth day of May, 1938.

APPENDIX.

DEFINITION OF THE BAKING TRADE.

1. Subject to the provisions of this Appendix the Baking Trade consists of the following operations:—

(1) the making of bread, pastry, and flour confectionery and work incidental thereto;

(2) the making of other articles of food and work incidental thereto in an undertaking, or branch or department thereof, mainly engaged on one or more of the operations specified in paragraph 1 (1);

(3) the sale and distribution of any of the articles of food referred to in the preceding sub-paragraphs by a worker who in the same week is also engaged in any of the work specified in those sub-paragraphs.

2. Notwithstanding anything in this Appendix the following operations are not operations in the Baking Trade:—

(1) the making of biscuits in an undertaking, or a branch or department of an undertaking, mainly engaged in the making of biscuits, and the making of any other article of food therein by workers mainly engaged in the making of biscuits;

(2) the making of any of the articles of food referred to in paragraph 1 hereof:—

(a) in an hotel, boarding house, restaurant, café or similar establishment:—

(i) for consumption on the premises; or

(ii) for consumption off the premises at meals served by persons ordinarily employed on the premises;

(b) by a railway undertaking for consumption on its trains, restaurant cars, ships or premises.

(3) the making of:—

(a) meat pies, sausage rolls or similar articles of pastry (including bread for use therein); or

(b) bread for use in sausages or similar articles of food

in an undertaking where no bread, pastry or flour confectionery is made other than that specified in this sub-paragraph;

(4) operations included in:—

(a) the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order 1928;

(b) the Trade Boards (Sugar Confectionery and Food Preserving) Order 1913;

(c) the Trade Boards (Grocery and Provisions) Order 1920;

or any amendments or variations of the aforesaid Orders.

3. For the purpose of this Appendix "pastry" and "articles of pastry" include articles of food made wholly or partly of pastry; "meat" includes game, poultry, egg or fish; "flour confectionery" includes cakes, oatcakes, shortbread and biscuits; "biscuits" do not include oatcakes or shortbread; and "making" includes the packing, wrapping and other handling of the articles of food when made before their first despatch for sale or distribution.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of Section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Board of Trade hereby give notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, they have granted to the D'Arcy Exploration Company Limited, of Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London, E.C.2, three Prospecting Licences in respect of the areas referred to in the Schedule hereto, the boundaries of which are described by reference to the one-inch Ordnance Survey Map, supplemented where necessary by reference to the six-inch Ordnance Survey Map.

SCHEDULE.

An Area of approximately 180 square miles situated in the County of York.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the road junction about 600 feet south-west of the London and North Eastern Railway Station at Wakefield. Thence in a south-westerly direction along the road to Horbury and in a north-westerly direction past Ossett to the cross-roads north-west of the Church at Ossett Street Side. Thence in a general westerly direction along the road through Dewsbury, and in a west-south-westerly direction past Ravensthorpe to Mirfield. Thence in a north-westerly direction along the road skirting the River Calder to the fork-roads at Clifton Wood, thence along the right fork-road to Clifton. Thence in a westerly direction through Brighouse to Brook Foot and in a south-westerly direction to the road junction about 1,000 feet south-west of Elland Railway Station. Thence in a south-south-easterly direction for about 600 feet across the River Calder to the cross-roads. Thence following the main road running in a westerly and northerly direction to Exley and in a general westerly direction past Copley to the road junction about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile west of the Sowerby Bridge Railway Station.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the road in a south-westerly and southerly direction to the point where it is joined by the main road from Greetland in the town of Ripponden. Thence in a south-easterly and north-easterly direction along the said main road to the fork-roads about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of Barkisland. Thence in an easterly direction to the cross-roads west of the Church at Barkisland. Thence in a southerly direction along the main road past Ringstone Edge Reservoir to the cross-roads about 1,500 feet north of the road junction at Moselden Height. Thence in a general easterly direction along the road to Yews and in a south-easterly direction past Camp Hill to the cross-roads about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile south-west of the Inn at Pole Moor. Thence along the road in a general southerly direction past Wilber Lee to the road junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of Heys. Thence in an easterly direction along the road passing south of the reservoir and over the River Colne, to the point where it crosses the main road from Huddersfield in Slaithwaite. Thence along the road in a southerly and south-easterly direction through Meltham to the road junction about 600 feet south-west of Thick Hollins. Thence in a north-easterly direction to the cross-roads

at Thick Hollins, and in a south-easterly direction along the road over Thick Hollins Moor to the cross-roads by the Inn on the main road from Mossley to Holmfirth. Thence in an easterly direction to Holmfirth and in a southerly direction to the fork-roads by the Inn about 1,200 feet south of Longley. Thence in a general south-easterly direction along the main Penistone road to the School at the cross-roads about 1,600 feet south-west of Sledbrook Hill. Thence in a southerly and south-easterly direction to the cross-roads at Langsett. Thence in a south-easterly direction past Upper Midhope to the road junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of Ewden Height.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road past Midhopstones to the cross-roads north of Sheepphouse Wood. Thence in an easterly and north-easterly direction along the road to Oxspring, and in a south-easterly direction to the cross-roads about 2,000 feet north-west of the Inn at Thurgoland. Thence in a general north-easterly direction along the road past the Hall, Hood Green and Gilroyd to the road junction by the Cemetery at Barnsley.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along the main road running in a north-westerly and north-easterly direction through Barnsley to the cross-roads about $\frac{3}{4}$ mile west of Monk Bretton. Thence along the road in a northerly direction past New Lodge, Hill Top and Sandal Magna to the point where it crosses the River Calder. Thence in a westerly direction to the road junction about 600 feet south-west of the London and North Eastern Railway Station at Wakefield, the point of departure.

An Area of approximately 160 square miles situated in the Counties of Chester and Stafford.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the point where the London, Midland and Scottish Railway (Manchester, Stockport and Crewe) crosses the road from Mayfield Grove to Cheadle Hulme by Mayfield Grove Railway Station, situated in the County of Chester, about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-south-west of Stockport, thence in a general easterly direction along the road past Bramhall Green, Wallbank, and Norbury Moor to the point where it is crossed by the London, Midland and Scottish Railway (Stockport and Buxton) about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile east-north-east of Norbury Hall. Thence following the railway in a south-easterly direction past Middlewood Station to the point where it is crossed by the Macclesfield Canal.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence following the canal southwards to the point where it crosses a road at Mitchelfold. Thence in a general southerly direction along the road past Needygate, Unwinpool and Normans Hall to Pott Shrigley. Thence in a south-westerly direction along the road to Bollington, passing through the town by way of High Street and Chancery Lane to the cross-roads by Hollin Hall. Thence in a southerly direction along the road past Endon Hall, Kerridge-end and Rulowknob to the road junction by the silk works at Langley. Thence

in a westerly direction through Sutton to the cross-roads at Hockley and in a southerly direction past The Oak to the cross-roads by the Inn at Oakgrove. Thence southward along the road past White-moor, Marshhead and Bosley to the cross-roads by Old Mill. Thence following the road in a westerly direction to Bosley Railway Station, thence along the railway northwards for about 1,400 feet. Thence in a south-south-westerly direction along the road past Lymford, in the County of Stafford, Toftgreen Farm, Timbersbrook, in the County of Chester, and Rainow Farm to the road junction at Dane in Shaw. Thence in a southerly direction along the road past Biddulph, in the County of Stafford, and Bradley Green to the road junction at Brindley Ford.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in a westerly direction along the road past Lane Ends to the road junction by the Inn about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north-west of Pack Moor. Thence along the road in a southerly direction to the point where it crosses the London, Midland and Scottish Railway. Thence along the railway in a west-north-westerly direction to Kidsgrove Railway Station. Thence along the road running in a north-westerly direction to the cross-roads at Church Lawton, in the County of Chester, and thence along the road in a southerly direction to the point where it crosses the London, Midland and Scottish Railway. Thence along the railway in a westerly direction past Alsager and Radway Green Railway Stations to Crewe Railway Station.

Western Boundary.

Thence following the London, Midland and Scottish Railway (Manchester, Stockport and Crewe) in a north-north-easterly direction past Sandbach, Chelford, Wilmslow and Handforth Railway Stations to the point where it crosses the road from Mayfield Grove to Cheadle Hulme by Mayfield Grove Railway Station, the point of departure.

**An Area of approximately 43 square miles situated in the County of Fife.*

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the point where the main road from Leven to Cupar crosses Glassy How Burn at Kame Bridge situated about 4 miles south of Cupar. Thence along the road running in a general westerly direction past Muirhead, Paradise, Coaltown of Burnturk and Kettlehill to the road junction $\frac{1}{4}$ mile west of Annfield House.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the main road running in a south-westerly direction past Kettlebridge, Welltree and Milltail and in a southerly direction past Gateside, Balbirnie Burns, Woodside, Bankhead, Thornton and Redhouse to the cross-roads at Gallatown. Thence along the road in a south-south-easterly direction past the Golf Course to the point where it approaches the London and North Eastern Railway by Dysart Railway Station. Thence along the road passing under the railway in a south-easterly direction for about 500 feet to the road junction, thence in a north-easterly direction for about 100 feet to the road junction.

tion, thence along the road in a south-easterly direction to a point on the coast at high water mark about 200 feet north of Lady Blanche Coal Pit at Dysart.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in a north-easterly direction along the coast at high water mark past West Wemyss, East Wemyss and Buckhaven to Leven Bridge at the mouth of the River Leven.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence following the main road running in a north-north-easterly direction through Leven and in a northerly direction past Scoonie, Letham, Pratis and Kame to Kame Bridge, the point of departure.

**An Area of approximately 12 square miles situated in the Counties of Clackmannan, Kinross and Perth.*

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the road junction at Gartwhinzean Feus about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south-west of Powmill, in the County of Kinross. Thence in a straight line running in a west-north-westerly direction to Law Hill, in the County of Perth. Thence in a straight line westwards to Bank Hill, in the County of Clackmannan, and thence in a straight line running in a west-south-westerly direction to Wester Kirk Craig.

Western Boundary.

Thence in a straight line running in a south-south-westerly direction to the road junction about 900 feet north of the main cross-roads at Tillicoultry. Thence along the road in an easterly direction for about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile and in a southerly direction passing over the Dollar-Alloa Railway Line to Coalsnaughton.

Southern Boundary.

Thence along the road running in a general easterly direction past Balhearty and Aberdona House, and in a southerly direction to the road junction at Forest Mill. Thence along the road running in a general north-easterly direction to the cross-roads about 1,000 feet east of Sols-girth House, in the County of Kinross, and in a south-easterly direction to the road junction about 1,250 feet north-east of Wester Muirhead.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along the road running in a general north-easterly direction past Lambhill and Craigend to the road junction at Gartwhinzean Feus, the point of departure.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF PROBATIONARY INSPECTOR (MALE) IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT OF THE POST OFFICE.

These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

I. AGE.—The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 23. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or the 1st

September of the year in which they are examined, according as the examination is held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for this purpose candidates who have served, or are serving, in the Army, Navy or Air Force, may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

2. NATIONALITY.—Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. HEALTH AND CHARACTER.—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

The candidate must attain in each subject he offers such a standard as to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners.

The examination may be held in one part or in two parts, at the discretion of the Civil Service Commissioners. In the latter case the first part of the examination will be used to

reduce the number of competitors to be admitted to the second part. Of those who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the first part a certain number, to be determined by the Civil Service Commissioners, will be admitted to the second part of the examination. The successful list will consist of those candidates who pass and obtain the highest aggregate marks on the whole examination.

6. Any attempt, direct or indirect, on the part of a candidate to enlist support for his application through influential persons will disqualify him for appointment.

7. APPLICATIONS for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint.

8. FEE.—A fee of £2 will be required from every candidate attending an Examination.
