PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 3rd day of March, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Parishes of Canterbury, Saint Alphege; Canterbury, Saint Mary, Northgate; and Canterbury, All Saints, being some of the Parishes of the United Benefice of Canterbury, Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

“ Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, pursuant to the provisions of the said Measures to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Parishes of Canterbury, Saint Alphege; Canterbury, Saint Mary, Northgate; and Canterbury, All Saints, duly made their Report to the said Archbishop of Canterbury and therein recommended the union of the said three Parishes and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Archbishop of Canterbury signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said three Parishes based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said United Benefice of Canterbury, Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret is now full the Reverend William Herbert Hodges being the present Incumbent thereof:

“ And whereas there is no Parish Church within the area of the said Parish of Canterbury, Saint Mary, Northgate:

“ And whereas the Church of the said Parish of Canterbury, All Saints, has ceased to be used for the purposes of Divine Service:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury, and of the said William Herbert Hodges (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Parish of Canterbury, Saint Alphege, the said Parish of Canterbury, Saint Mary, Northgate, and the said Parish of Canterbury, All Saints, shall be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

“ 2. That the Church of the Parish of Canterbury, Saint Alphege, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the table of fees for the said Parish of Canterbury, Saint Alphege, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the table of fees for the United Parish.

" 3. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of All Saints, Canterbury, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of All Saints, Canterbury, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar-General to be closed officially.

" 4.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of All Saints, Canterbury, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Union of Benefices Measures.

" (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the payment of the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say, towards the cost of the erection of a Church Hall in connection with the said United Benefice of Canterbury, Saint Alphege with Saint Margaret, and any residue of such net proceeds shall be appropriated as a Fund for the maintenance and upkeep of such Church Hall, and such Fund may be held by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, or be transferred by us to such Diocesan or other body of trustees as the Archbishop of Canterbury shall select as trustees to hold and apply the said Fund.

" (c) That the font, communion table and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of All Saints, Canterbury (if not previously disposed of), shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Archbishop of Canterbury may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Alphege, Canterbury, or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Canterbury and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of All Saints, Canterbury, or such of them as the Archbishop of Canterbury shall select, shall be removed to the said Church of Saint Alphege, Canterbury, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Archbishop of Canterbury for use in any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Canterbury which the Archbishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of All Saints, Canterbury, as aforesaid.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of All Saints, Canterbury, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of All Saints,

Canterbury, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Archbishop of Canterbury has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Parishes therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of May, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Rennington and the Benefice

(being a Vicarage) of Rock, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Northumberland and in the Diocese of Newcastle:

"Whereas the said two Benefices of Rennington and Rock, now vacant, were held in plurality by the last Incumbent thereof and had been so held continuously, save during periods of avoidance, under three successive Incumbencies:

"And whereas the Patronage of each of the said Benefices of Rennington and Rock now belongs to one and the same Patron:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Harold, Bishop of Newcastle (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Diocesan Committee of the Diocese of Newcastle appointed pursuant to the first Section of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923 (signified by a Resolution of the said Diocesan Committee dated the 16th day of March, 1938, and duly communicated to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Rennington and the said Benefice of Rock shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Rennington with Rock' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect.

"3. That so soon as conveniently may be after the said union has taken effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Rennington and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, if not previously sold under other authority, shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the cost of the provision of a house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Newcastle has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Newcastle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 5th day of May, 1938, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for assigning the right of Patronage of the District of Saint Peter, Southwick, in the County of Sussex and in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council bearing date the 29th day of June, 1934, and published in the London Gazette on the 6th day of the following month, the said District of Saint Peter, Southwick, was, under the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act, constituted partly out of the Parish of Southwick, partly out of the Parish of Lancing, and partly out of the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Portslade-by-Sea, all in the said County and Diocese:

"And whereas no assignment of the Patronage of the said District of Saint Peter, Southwick, was made by the said Order and no such assignment has since been made:

"And whereas a capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church for the said District of Saint Peter, Southwick:

"And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been so contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Peter, Southwick, and when such District shall have

become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 have nominated to us the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chichester as the person to whom they desire that the Patronage and right of nomination and presentation of and to the said District or New Parish of Saint Peter, Southwick, should be assigned, and we are satisfied that the said assignment may properly be effected:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District of Saint Peter, Southwick, and when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto, shall without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Chichester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in conformity with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Act or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Chichester.

"And whereas the investments of the net proceeds of the said transactions made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts include (*inter alia*) a sum of £4,660 4s. 3d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock a sum of £4,327 2s. 0d. London County £3 per centum per annum Stock and a sum of £8,214 12s. 6d. £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock which sums of Stock are now held by us in trust to pay to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice the annual interest or dividends from time to time arising or accruing therefrom or thereupon, but subject nevertheless to the provisions contained in the said Acts and Measure with respect to making a certain portion of the improved value arising to the said Benefice from the said transactions payable to us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said transactions exceeds the annual sum of £600, and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Darfield is now full, the Reverend Harold Drown being the Rector or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Darfield shall from whatsoever cause be next voided the aforesaid sums of £4,660 4s. 3d. India £3 per centum per annum Stock and £4,327 2s. 0d. London County £3 per centum per annum Stock, and a sum of £6,582 6s. 0d. £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock (being a portion of the aforesaid sum of £8,214 12s. 6d. £3½ per centum per annum Conversion Stock) or any securities or

investments then representing such sums of Stock together with all the rents and royalties payable to us under the said leases which shall thereafter become due and be received by us under and by virtue of the said leases or of any renewal or renewals thereof or of any lease or leases which may hereafter be granted of the minerals included in the said leases or any part or parts thereof shall cease to be held or received by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Darfield and shall be held or received by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

And whereas the Notice of the foregoing Scheme, which is required by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, has been given by the said Commissioners to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Darfield, and the said Patrons have not made any objection to the said Scheme:

"And whereas the investments of the net proceeds of the said transactions made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts include (inter alia) a sum of £17,986 17s. 7d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock:

"And whereas the improvement in the annual value of the said Benefice arising from or by means of the said transactions exceeds the annual sum of £800 and after the appropriation hereinafter recommended to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for the benefit of our Common Fund, the average annual income of the said Benefice will still be considerably in excess of £600:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Brodsworth is now full the Reverend Canon Fearnley Algernon Cyril Youens being the Vicar or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose, first, that as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Brodsworth shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, all the rents and royalties payable to us under the said leases which shall thereafter become due and be received by us under and by virtue of the said leases or of any renewal or renewals thereof or of any lease or leases which may hereafter be granted of the minerals included in the said leases or any part or parts thereof shall cease to be held or received by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brodsworth and shall be held and received by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned, and secondly, that as from the same date or from the date, if later, of the cessation of the yearly payment of £409 which became charged upon the revenues of the said Benefice in favour of the Church of England Pensions Board in trust for the Reverend George Frederick Tamplin upon his resignation from the said Benefice, a sum of £11,428 11s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock (forming part of the aforesaid sum of £17,986 17s. 7d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock) or any securities or investments then representing the said sum of £11,428 11s. 5d. £3 10s. per centum per annum Conversion Stock shall likewise cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Vicar or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Brodsworth and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendation and

proposal relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or Measure or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England."

"Whereas it has been represented to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and it appears to us to be desirable that the boundaries of the said Parish of Horton Kirby and of the said Parish of Longfield should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"All that portion of the said Parish of Horton Kirby which is bounded upon the north-west and upon part of the north by the Parish of Darenth, upon the remaining part of the north by the Parish of Southfleet, both in the said County and Diocese, upon the east by the said Parish of Longfield, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Longfield from the said Parish of Horton Kirby crosses the middle of the main (London to Chatham) line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 55 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Horton Kirby from the said Parish of Darenth."

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Rochester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Rochester.
