1. Aerated Water Manufacture (Overtime) Regulations, modifying the provisions of Section 73 of the Act as to overtime, to meet special pressure of work.

2. Laundries (Overtime) Regulations, modifying the provisions of Section 73 of the Act as to overtime, to meet seasonal or other special pressure of work.

3. Laundries, Manufacture of Bread, etc. (Hours and intervals) Modification Regulations, modifying the provisions of Section 70 of the Act in their application to a factory the occupier of which avails himself of the special exceptions in Section 92 or Section 93 of the Act.

4. Fruit and Vegetable Preserving (Hours of Women and Young Persons) Regulations, prescribing conditions subject to which the occupier of a factory may avail himself of the special exception in Section 94 of the Act.
