## FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED AREAS) ORDER OF 1938 (No. 85).

## SUBJECT.

I. Contracts the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Garsington, Oxford, as from the 17th June, 1938, so as to comprise only the area described in the Schedule.

II. Releases the Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area around Garsington, Oxford, and revokes Order No. 5737 as from the 24th June, 1938.

## LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

*River Ancholme and Winterton Beck Catchment Board.*

*Winterton Beck Internal Drainage District.*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the River Ancholme and Winterton Beck Catchment Board under Section 4 (1) (b) of that Act, making provision for the abrogation of the powers of the Lincolnshire Commissioners of Sewers (Brigg Court) within the Catchment Area; the constitution of the Winterton Beck Internal Drainage District and of a drainage board therefor, and for certain matters supplemental thereto, and that the Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless within thirty-one days from the date of this Notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial, praying that the Order shall not become law without confirmation by Parliament.

A copy of the sealed Order has been deposited, together with a copy of the Scheme, as amended, and of the map referred to in the Order, at the Office of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, 11, Bigby Street, Brigg, Lincolnshire, for public inspection for a period of thirty-one days from the date of this Notice, and may be inspected during the ordinary hours of business.
